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Respected Chairman, University Grants Commission, Professor Arun Nigavekar; Distinguished President, Sahitya Akademi, Professor Gopi Chand Narang; Eminent Chairman of Gargi College Governing Council, Dr. Ratnakar Pandey; honourable guests, faculty members and dear students,

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On behalf of everyone in Gargi College, I extend my warm welcome to all of you who have graced our **38th Annual Day** celebrations today. I will begin on a personal note and take you down memory lane to 1992-93, the first year I presented the college annual report after taking over as Principal. The distinguished Chief Guest on that occasion was the then UGC Chairman, Professor Ram Reddy. 12 years later I have the honour to present our report card for the year 2003-04 to our present distinguished UGC Chairman, Professor Arun Nigavekar.

Professor Nigavekar is well known and highly respected among all those associated with higher education. But I would not like to deny myself the privilege of introducing this outstanding educationist with 40 years experience in teaching, research, planning and administration of higher educational institutions. A physicist by choice and inclination, Prof. Nigavekar graduated from Pune on the Dakshina Fellowship and did his post graduatecum-research from Sweden on a SIDA Fellowship. He was, to begin with, a Professor of Material Sciences in Pune University and then became Director of EMRC, Pune. He has also been a Visiting Professor in the universities of U.K. and Canada. Prof. Nigavekar was made the Vice-Chancellor of Pune University and under his stewardship, the university was recognised as a university with potential for excellence. He was appointed the Vice-Chairman of the UGC and is currently holding the highest academic position as Chairman of the UGC. He has authored many books and articles in international and national journals. His contributions to Science Education include his founding of the Physics Educational Journal, a journal of international repute. He is also a permanent member and currently Vice-Chairman 9 of Asian Physics Education Network, a UNESCO organisation.

Professor Gopi Chand Narang is also no stranger to anyone 6 in the world of books and literature. We are proud to have him as our Guest of Honour today. Professor Narang is a Padma Shri Awardee and this year will be receiving the most prestigious National Award of Padma Bhushan too. Among the other innumerable awards he has received, special mention is to be made of the Pakistan President's Gold Medal for his distinguished scholarly work on the poet Igbal. Other noteworthy awards include The Rajiv Gandhi Award for Excellence in Secularism, Sahitya Akademi Award, Ghalib Award, Amir Khusrau Award, Canadian Academy of Urdu Language and Literature Award, Mir Award, Maikash Award, and Sir Sved Aalami Award to name just a few. He has been the acting Vice-Chancellor of Jamia Millia Islamia and visiting professor in the universities of USA. Canada and Europe. He has written 12 books in English, 5 in Hindi and 36 in Urdu. In honouring him, we honour ourselves.

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Last, but not the least in honour of mention is our own Chairman, **Dr. Ratnakar Pandey.** It has been my good fortune to work under his guidance for the last four years. Suffice it to say that his astute administrative experience as former principal of Motilal Nehru College and his statesman-like qualities of nobility, integrity and fair-mindedness have been central to the progressive and smooth running of our college. A great Hindi scholar with a large number of publications to his credit, he has been at the helm of affairs at Gargi college to give it its academic direction. I take this opportunity to express our deep sense of gratitude to Dr. Ratnakar Pandey and all the other distinguished Members of the Governing Council of Gargi College for their total commitment, encouragement and support towards all-round development and progress of our institution.

I am proud of our spectacular rise in all spheres of college activities- academic, research, cultural, sports and extension activities. The index of our achievement is reflected in Delhi University's recommendation of our college to the UGC as one of the three colleges with a potential for excellence. This mercurial e e

rise to the coveted slot among three top colleges of Delhi university is due to the excellent team work done by our dedicated faculty, motivated students and committed nonacademic staff that the college can well and truly boast of.

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Let me list out all the *feel-good* factors that have contributed to *Gargi Shining* and then spell out our plans to keep Gargi on the move.

GARGI SHINING

- During the last 12 years our college students have been getting anywhere between 33-36 top ranking positions in the university. In the last university examinations that concluded in May 2003, we secured a record 57 positions in the university- an index of the quality education that we provide in the college. Three of our students are being awarded university medals at the coming convocation. The spectacular achievements of our students are given in the Roll of Honour list in this report. Our congratulations to each one of the achievers and our good wishes to all of them for still greater success in their academic, professional and personal careers.
- For the last five years our research laboratories in the departments of Physics and Botany have been doing splendid work. This year we have added a Psychology Research Laboratory, a B.El.Ed Workshop laboratory and a Chemistry Research Laboratory to provide research facilities to teachers who have received grants from different funding institutions. This is one institution where teaching is done alongside research in the true Humboltdian tradition. The English department has a rich library of its own-the Oswal-Sena library and we shall be adding a separate section consisting of International Journals for Contemporary Knowledge and Advance Research. This has been made possible by the International Punjabi Society who has graciously come forward to subscribe to these journals and make them available to the college. 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- The college faculty has distinguished itself with excellent research work. I would like to place on record our appreciation of all our faculty members whose academic work has been authenticated by the award of Grants, Fellowships, Research degrees and published works.
 - Dr. Bharati Bhattacharya and Dr. Gita Mathur (Botany) have been given the UGC grant for their project The Effect of Environmental Changes on Selected Herbaceous Plants of Delhi.
 - Dr. Vandna Luthra(Physics) got the Boyscast Fellowship given by DST to continue her research in University College, London on Electronic Materials and their Processing towards Development of Sensors for Toxic, Polluting and Inflammable Gases.
 - Dr. Veena Tucker (Psychology) has received the UGC grant for her research project on Developing an Integrated Intervention Programme for Street Children. She is also supervising the work of a Delhi University Ph.D student.
 - Kamlesh Malhotra and Dr.Sangeeta Dr. Bhatia(Psychology) have received a Major grant from the UGC for their project on Promoting Resilience in Families of Individuals with Disabilities.
 - Dr. Asha Goswami's (Sanskrit) book on Krsna Legend: a new Perspective has been recommended by Delhi University for the UGC Ved Vyasa award for the Best Sanskrit publication.

Dr. Meenakshi Jain's (History) book on Medieval India for class XI has been published by NCERT.

- > Gargi college has been a pioneer on add-on courses since 1993 for which the UGC has given its seal of approval. These courses are designed by our faculty cutting across disciplines so as to enhance the professional competency and skills of our students besides promoting social awareness and sensitizing them to become true members of a civilised society. This year we had introduced three new courses:
 - Cultural Encounters
 - Indian Art Through the Ages and
 - Vedanta and Applied Ethics.

We have been very fortunate to listen to brilliant expositions on these topics every week by Professors, Scholars and Intellectuals. These courses, global in their sweep and range, gave the students a wider perspective on social, cultural, ethical and artistic issues of the past and the contemporary times. Our efforts have been to remove the shadow lines within their minds that breed intolerance, hatred, anger and violence and make our young students responsible future citizens of the world. The list of all the guest speakers and the details of the courses are listed in this report.

> We have many firsts to our credit in Extra-curricular activites-in Drama, Street Plays, Music, Debates and Choreography. Our debators were selected as a part of the Commonwealth Debating Society to visit Mauritius . The Pride of Gargi at the beginning of this programme showcased the talented teams who have won laurels for the college. Mention @ has been made in the report of the many prizes our students

won not only within Delhi, but outside of Delhi in IIT Kanpur (and BITS Pilani. Our play **The Monologues of Mahabharata** was selected by the National School of Drama for a public performance. The Street Play **Jayen to Jayen Kahaan** is considered the best in the cultural arena of Delhi university.

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- The college has groomed young writers in various departments who have brought out quarterly issues of Newletters- the Oracle (English), Manthan(History), Eureka(Science) and Com Ascent (Commerce) giving information on both academic and college events. This is yet another pioneering effort of the college.
- The Gargi Extension Service, the NSS wing of the college has once again demonstrated its potential to reach out to the underprivileged and the physically and mentally challenged persons in our society. Their work with the Spastics Society, the Blind School, Cheshire Home and with NGOs like Pravah and Action Aid proves the spirit of service the students have imbibed from the college. A NGO Mela displaying products made by the less privileged people was held in the college. Blood donation camp, help for the homeless in collaboration with Action Aid India were among the major activities of GES.
- The Environmental group in collaboration with MIECOFT (a NGO run by our former student Dr. Malini Rajendran has continued with its work on Solid Waste Management in close association with the Department of Environment, Govt. of NCT of Delhi. The Chemistry department is engaged in the task of Lab-Waste Management in collaboration with the Centre for Environmental Education, Ahmedabad and this will be extended to other science departments in the coming year.
- The Women's Development Centre has once again demonstrated its commitment to popularise and sensitise our young women to gender issues. A two-day inter-college seminar on Women and Violence sponsored by the UGC and Women Studies and Development Centre was a very

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successful event A Crafts Mela in aid of self-employed women and a workshop on Alternative Therapies were also organised during the year. With the help of Delhi Police, selfdefence classes were held in the college. The WDC has also arranged for a Psychological Counselor in the college.

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- The health check-ups and medical guidance are provided by a registered medical practitioner for all students and staff members.
- The Students'Council deserves a special mention as they organised the college cultural festival Reverie '03 devoted to bringing in a Brave New World Order. Anyone who has closely worked with the students council will recognise their infectious enthusiasm and their extraordinary capability to translate their enthusiasm into action. The Council has worked throughout the year starting with admissions and later with the placement cell to facilitate students looking for jobs/ higher education/professional diploma courses. The recently concluded elections for the students council witnessed electronic voting for the first time.
- On the sports front, we are the Delhi University Chess Champions. We are also Delhi state Judo champions for junior girls. In the senior Judo tournament we are second in Delhi university. Anshu Sharma has represented DU in Table Tennis and is the winner of the North Zone. In All India Open Table Tennis tournament, she won the fourth position. Nivanthee Jayaraj(Chess), Archana Dahiya, Meetu Tanwar(Cricket) represented DU in various tournaments and Khushboo Saini(Roller Skating) represented India in South America and won the Bronze medal. Seema Singh is a Gold medal winner in Pole Vault in DU. Deepa Chaudhary represented Delhi State in National Inter-state Athletic meet and won the 2nd position. She also participated in the U-22 National Athletic meet and came 3rd.

All these achievements speak for themselves, irrespective of the selection to the prestigious status of a *College with a Potential*

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for Excellence. We have received the recognition from the C University of Delhi and are awaiting UGC's seal of approval.

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GARGI ON THE MOVE

I am conscious that we have many many miles to go and do not have (and should not have) the luxury to rest on these present laurels. We have plans to move further forward to make this a world class institution. The college offers first degree courses in Commerce, Sciences and Social Sciences and Humanities. Keeping that in mind we are currently engaged in taking out a blue-print different on courses that include SAP(Accounts), Finance and Costing, Psephology, Gender Studies, Pre-service and in-service teachers training, Green Sciences, Bio-Informatics, Theatre Studies, Heritage Studies, Indian Culture Through Sanskrit Sources etc.

Amidst all orchestration to make university courses designed to meet market demands, we at Gargi would urge a note of caution. The University and its colleges cannot and should not be regarded as shopping malls where knowledge is examined, sold and consumed. We wish to steer clear of the value-for-money ideology which goes against the founding principle of the university as a place which offers space for the mind to work freely in pursuit of ideas and which generates ideas through language. We are in an age of information explosion without the accompanying focus on knowledge and perception. The greatest hurdle we face today is the gradual retreat from language. With SMS texts, internet chatting and junk e-mails in abundance, the ability to articulate is declining. The advances in Science and Technology have altered the basic structures both of our private and social life. They have changed our way of thinking, our consciousness and our ethics. We cannot be ignorant of these scientific and technological phenomena nor remain indifferent to their effects on our mental and physical experience. Higher education cannot opt out of its responsibility to provide a new, vibrant and dynamic way of thinking that includes both Humanities and Sciences. It was George Steiner who said that one who does not know Shakespeare is ignorant, but not more OME TOM

than the one who does not know the Second Law of Thermodynamics. During the Renaissance times, there was no knowledge without cosmology, no mathematics without the theory of art and music. Similarly the 17th and the 18th century literature and philosophy reveal the unfolding genius of physics, astronomy and algebra.

Being a three-in-one college, we strongly feel the need to integrate Sciences, Humanities and Commerce into a collective plurality. Neither the Sciences nor the Humanities can be arrogant in their assertion to centrality. The two cultures have to be open to all students so that they become multi-dimensional and liberated to bring in a new civilisation, a New World Order. Our efforts are geared towards achieving this synergy between the humanist and the scientist. All our add-on courses are not commercially dictated, but intended to bring university education to its original identity evolved in the course of 2000 years. The hope for the future lies in these small exercises we have undertaken to bring responsible humanism to our studies.

Folly must the replaced by reason, passion must be put aside in favour of reflection, ideals must be installed where caprices govern, principles must prevail, not opportunism.
