He is widely published with one book and several research papers with reputed international journals and he has also guided 8 Ph.D scholars. He is in the Guest Faculty of LSE, DSE, NIFM JNU and Institute of Chartered Accountants. He has lectured across the world in REIMS Business School, ESC Pau, France and Vancouver Island University. He is on the editorial board of leading finance journals, on expert committees of AICTE, Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University and University Grants Commission and also member of SEBI committee on investor education and protection. He has been awarded the Indo-French Social Scientist Fellowship and Illustrious Alumnus Award by Shri Ram College of Commerce. Prof. Sehgal's enterprising attitude, progressive vision and brilliant time management are qualities that have been always inspiring.

We are indeed fortunate to have as the Chairperson of Gargi College Governing Body the illustrious Dr. V. Mohini Giri. A recipient of Padma Bhushan, she is the chairperson of Guild of Service. She is a living embodiment of the ideals cherished by this college, chief of them being women empowerment. She has worked tirelessly in providing succour for women in distress, ranging from children in prostitution, women affected by riots, war widows and widows at Vrindavan. She has arranged widow remarriages and facilitated economic independence through allotment of petrol pumps or cottage industry enterprises. She holds a number of public offices, such as Trustee of the Rajiv Gandhi Foundation, Member of the Board of Directors of World Association of NGOs and of the South Asian Initiatives for Human Rights. She has addressed international gatherings such as at the First Assembly of IIPC Global Peace Council at New York, world conference on racism at Beijing and at a conference of Women Defending Peace at Geneva. Ma'am with, your dynamism and liberal vision, we know you will provide us guidance and inspiration to take Gargi College to greater heights of glory.

Gargi College was established in 1967 by the then Delhi Administration, which is now the Government of NCT, Delhi. It began with 247 students offering two courses. Since then it has grown from strength to strength and is today a multi-stream, multi-disciplinary college offering about 20 courses to 2500 students. We can confidently affirm that it is now also one of the most sought after colleges of the University of Delhi. In 2004 it was one of two colleges of the university and one of 45 colleges of the entire country, on which the University Grants Commission conferred the title, *College with Potential for Excellence*. Last year a grant was conferred on the college for establishment of a Bio-informatics laboratory. In place this year, this facility has helped science education in Gargi College to keep pace with new and interdisciplinary applications and experiments. This year Gargi College was one of two colleges of University of Delhi to receive special recognition in being selected for the award of *Star College* grant by the Department of Biotechnology, Ministry of Science and Technology, Government of India.

To fulfil its mission to become an Institution of Excellence, the college presents a multi-tiered structure of opportunities to its students, which is constantly strengthened, reviewed and expanded. This report presents a brief survey of this mission translating in action in the current year, 2009-10.

ACADEMIC RESULTS

More than 1900 students appeared in University examinations of 2009. 949 students obtained first division, while pass percentage is 98 100% in different courses. 60 students were placed among top five positions in Delhi University or its South Campus.

BEYOND THE CURRICULUM

As knowledge is now breaking bounds of disciplines and converging in new interdisciplinary domains to revolutionize technology, mindsets and eco-political configurations, Gargi College takes extra initiatives to update its students with knowledge beyond the curriculum and offer incentives for research, innovation and presentation of original work. These initiatives take the form of faculty guiding research, organization of seminars and lectures by experts in their fields and inter-college paper presentation, posters or collage making and other competitions.

I. Research Presentations in Conferences:

I am proud to state that two students this year have had their research accepted for display in poster form in major conferences:

- ★ **Prachi Jain**, Botany Honours III year, jointly with Dr. Shashi Tyagi and Dr. Aparajita Mohanty presented her research finding on the **Importance of Chloroplast Genomes for Evaluation and Conservation of Plant Genetic Resources** at a National conference on *Recent Global Development in the Management of Plant Genetic Resources* organized by the National Bureau of Plant Genetic Resources & Indian Society for Plant Genetic Resources.
- ★ **Amanpreet Kaur**, Zoology Honours III year, jointly with Dr. Poonam Sharma presented her research on "***in silico* Analysis of Gene Expression profile in human breast cancer cells**" at a conference entitled *BIOEPOCH* organized by JNU.

II. The Gargi Pathfinder Award:

Initiated last year, one each for Humanities, Sciences and Commerce, it has instilled heart-warming enthusiasm in students to interrogate their environment and present new experiments and ideas. The winners for 2009-10 are:

III. Experiments under the CPE programme:

Already a recipient of a recognition by UGC as College with Potential for Excellence, this year an additional grant was received to upgrade science education under this scheme. Students were offered stipends to undertake research under faculty guidance and they engaged in experiments in *Bio-informatics, Bacteriology, Material Sciences and Green Chemistry*.

IV. Star College Scheme and Summer Workshops:

The science faculty of Gargi College dedicated part of their summer vacation to

demonstrate and conduct some advanced interdisciplinary experiments with the students in emerging new frontiers of science, utilizing the grant received from the Department of Biotechnology, Govt. of India. Topics included green chemistry focussing among other things on toxic free alternatives in laboratory experiments, fibre optics and molecular biology.

V. The Bioinformatics Laboratory:

Existing in only two colleges of the University of Delhi, this lab has been equipped with advanced software such as TREECON, GENERUNNER and CLUSTAL X. A workshop was conducted to train the faculty on the use of these softwares. Students now get practical experience for the theory component of Bioinformatics in their regular curriculum and are also encouraged to take up research work.

VI. Major National interdisciplinary Seminars:

- ★ A two-day UGC sponsored National Seminar was held on the topic *The Electronic Media: Impact on National and Cultural Identities*. The galaxy of eminent speakers included Shri Ravi Shankar Prasad, Shri Bhaskar Ghosh, Shri Rajdeep Sardesai and Shri Santosh Desai among others. Students had a rare inside view of the logistics of managing a channel and the various pressures that influence content. Both, the traditional culture of India with its manifold regional variations and, the changing mindsets of the new generations as reflected in and influenced by the media, came under critical scrutiny. The seminar was interspersed with a play and a choreography piece on the theme presented by Gargi students.
- ★ An Inter-sciences seminar was held on *New Frontiers of Biotechnology*. Speakers included Prof. V. S. Chauhan, Director, ICGB, Dr. Suman Govil, Advisor DBT, Prof. Vinay Gupta, Department of Physics, University of Delhi, Dr. Dwaipayan Bharadwaj, IGIB, and Dr. Srinivasan, IARI.

Both seminars were well attended by faculty and students of many colleges other than Gargi College.

VII. Departmental Meets:

The following is just a glimpse of the many activities organized by individual departments. More details appear later in the report.

- ★ **Botany:** Arranged a lecture by Dr. V. Siva Reddy Group Head, ICGB on **Genetic engineering for Crop Production**. It was followed by an inter-college paper reading competition by students on the theme *Application of Recent Nobel Prize Winning Discoveries*.
- ★ **Chemistry :** Prof. S.K. Tandon, the Pro Vice-Chancellor of Delhi University addressed our students on the urgent environmental issues of the day, which was followed by

students observing the international ozone day in slogan writing competition on the theme.

- + **Commerce:** organized seminars on *Careers in Finance* and *HRD in India-Vision 2020* and two workshops on *Group discussion* and *Team Dynamics*. Speakers included, Professor Shayam B. Menon, Vice Chancellor of D.R. Ambedkar University, Dr. Reena Ramachandran, Director General, J.K. Business School and Mr. Aquil Busrai, Executive Director, HR Department, IBM (India) Pvt. Ltd.
- + **Elementary Education:** Organized a discussion on need for reforms in student evaluation systems in primary and secondary school leading to the senior. Panellists included Prof. Shyam Menon, Vice Chancellor of B.R. Ambedkar University, Dr. Sameer Malhotra, the well known psychiatrist, Prof. Bharti Bhaweja, principals of schools and our own alumna Ms. Deepti Sharma working in Basic School, run by CIE. Some students visited rural schools in Rajasthan and were educated by the many differences in the urban schools for the needy and those in the interiors.
- + **English:** A panel discussion was organized on *Adaptations of Literary Texts for the Theatre and Cinema*. Panellists included Amitesh Grover, Sudhanwa Deshpande, Kewal Arora, all well known theatre personalities. Students were able to discuss various issues such as copyright, ownership, limits of transcreation and the dynamic relation between the source text and the adapted version. The department also offered a course in remedial English to foreign students and others from underprivileged sections.
- + **History:** In keeping with the new historical discourses, the history department this year focused on music traditions and the way they reflected people's history. While Prof T.K. V. Subramanian presented a critical overview on the evolution of some musical traditions and instruments, distinguished musicians Vidya Rao and Dr. Madan Gopal Singh regaled the audience with their presentations in lec-dem mode. A trip to Agra was organized to familiarize students with Mughal architecture.
- + **Microbiology:** A visit was organized to Tilda, a factory that manufactures several genres of rice. Ongoing research in varieties of rice and quality control proved very enlightening to the students.
- + **Philosophy:** A 2-day seminar was organized on the topic of *Moral Pragmatism*. The philosophy was examined in the light of several real life situations and it climaxed in the realization that the two concepts of moral and pragmatic, each define and discipline the operations of the other. It was a very crucial and stimulating meet and was addressed by Prof. Shashi Motilal, Dr. Devana, Dr. Ajay Verma and Mr. Parnav Mukherjee.
- + **Physics:** Prof. K. Kaneto from Kyushu Institute of Technology, Japan, gave an audio visual demonstration on the work being done to create artificial muscles based on conducting polymers. This is a trans-national and inter-disciplinary work in progress and five Nobel Laureates are part of the project. Dr. Shubandu Ghosh gave a lecture on

Generation of Electrical Signals in Brain.

- + **Political Science:** *Challenges before India's Foreign Policy* was the subject of a panel discussion comprising Mr. R.L.Narayan, former High Commissioner to Canada, Prof. C. Mahapatra from School of International Studies, JNU, Dr.A.D.Behera, coordinator, Pakistan studies programme at JMI. Prof. Neera Chandoke delivered a lecture on *global justice*.
- + **Psychology:** The Department of Psychology held several seminars on topics such as *Inclusive Education, Autism, Counselling Skills and Understanding Emotional-Mental Health*, all of which were addressed by eminent doctors. Students also attended a conference on *Adolescents in Indian Family: Issues and Interventions* organized by Indian Association of Family Therapy.
- + **Sanskrit:** Kudos to this department, who had hitherto felt handicapped due to low student strength, but this year launched their association, *Sampada* and held several events. These included a lec-dem on *Bhasha and Computers*, a course in *Vaastu Shastra* and inter-college *slokavritti* and *natyabhivvyakti* competitions.
- + **Zoology:** In a novel event entitled, *Blast from the Past*, tribute was paid to all scientists whose discoveries continue to enrich our lives. Dr. Bhudev Das, from Ambedkar Center for Biomedical Research, University of Delhi, addressed the students on "First Successful Vaccine against Women's Cancer".
- + **B.A. Programme Association** hosted a festival *Dream India*. Eminent speakers like Dr. Malti (Former principal, Kalindi college, D.U.), Mrs. Neeta Khatter (educationist and social worker) and Mr. Ashok Thakur (additional secretary, Department of Secondary and Higher Education, GOI) addressed our students.
- + **B.Sc. Programme Association** held its first inter-college festival on the theme "Environment". Prof. Brij Gopal, the Chief Guest on this occasion, spoke on **Environmental Degradation through Human Activities**.

FACULTY SHINING

Gargi College has a highly qualified and committed faculty. There are over 150 positions out of which 135 teachers are permanent and over 90 of them have doctorate degrees. They combine teaching with research and publications, show tremendous initiatives in organizing various extra-curricular events and have contributed greatly to building the college as one of the institutes of excellence in the University of Delhi. Tournaments are organized for faculty and the non-academic staff as well and all students are given a chance to engage in sporting events in the annual sports day. This year, the Chief Guest at Annual Sports Day was Mr. Baljeet Singh, the Indian Hockey Olympian.

In inter-college competitions the **Judo team** swept all Team Championships in all Judo Tournaments: D. U. 2. **Alumni:** A meet is held every year. A web directory is slowly evolving to expand networking. I am proud to announce that our alumna, Dr.Kamla Bharadwaj, has this last week been bestowed with the prestigious Ved Vyas Award, sponsored by UGC for life-time achievement
3. **Placement Cell** is very active and arranges workshops on corporate culture, interview skills and opportunities for Higher Education. Most students of the college pursue post-graduate studies. Among the few seeking jobs after graduation, ten have already been placed in jobs with companies such as Capital IQ, E Value Serve and Indus School. Some more are awaiting final interviews.

Centre for IGNOU

Gargi College is a centre for the Indira Gandhi National Open University for the contact programmes of its distant education. Classes are held on Sundays in MA (English), B.Sc. and diploma courses in Nutrition, Child Care, Creative Writing among others. Many classes are taught by our own faculty and the college render valuable service to IGNOU by conducting science practicals for its students.

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INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENT

The new seminar hall inaugurated last year with state of the art projection systems has been further upgraded with central air-conditioning and furniture of class. The structure of the new auditorium is complete. Interiors is expected to be completed in a few months. An electric sub-station recently installed will enhance the sanctioned load capacity by several times, to accommodate the tremendous expansion in building space, scientific instruments and gadgets and rise in number of computer and internet stations. Our tennis courts will be remodelled using latest techniques into synthetic courts with the help of a grant from the Ministry of Sports. Two toilets have been renovated to make them disabled friendly. A lift is being installed soon and this will make the entire college campus accessible to the differently challenged. A mobile computer laboratory has been commissioned in the college where basic computer course is being offered at subsidized fees to needy students.

Library

1903 books were added during the year under review. Thus the total number of volumes in the Library as it stood on 8-02-10 is 65376. 61866 in the main and gift collection, 1166 in the Text book collection and 2344 in the Book Bank collection.


Library has been fully computerised and computerised cards issued to students, academic and non-academic staff.

As many as 1,20,200 volumes were loaned out to borrowers. This excludes use of loose issues of periodicals, reference books, books kept in the reading room and open stack of the library. Some 50788 members visited the library.

VISION & MISSION

Gargi College has always kept pace with changing times. But we are also aware of the many contradictions that beset our nation.
