

APPLICATION AND ADMISSION PROCEDURE

This year the entire admission process is online. Gargi College strictly adheres to the guidelines set forth by the University of Delhi. Please note that:

- All requisite information is on the Delhi University admission portal and the College website.
- At college the following members will remain available for assistance.
 - Nodal officer
 - Convenor Admissions Committee
 - Members Grievance Committee.

ADMISSION SCHEDULE & INFORMATION ABOUT COMMON SEAT ALLOCATION SYSTEM (CSAS-2023)

- Admission to all UG Programs of UoD for the Academic Session 2023-24 will be through CSAS-2023, based on the eligibility requirements stated in UG BOI-2023 and other rules as published by the University of Delhi on its website.
- An online platform at <u>www.admission.uod.ac.in</u> will be made available for seeking admission through CSAS-2023. Candidates seeking admission to UoD must fill out the CSAS-2023 Application Form online through this platform only. There will be no offline filling of the CSAS-2023 Application Form.
- Candidate must have passed Class XII or its equivalent from a single recognized board.
- A candidate applying to CSAS-2023 must have appeared in CUET(UG) 2023, conducted by NTA.
- Candidate must have appeared in CUET(UG) 2023 in only those subjects in which she has passed Class XII.
- The candidate is advised to check whether she satisfies all eligibility criteria for the Program(s) for which she is applying and has appeared in CUET(UG) - 2023 in the relevant subject/Test papers fulfilling the Program - Specific eligibility published in the UGBOI-2023. If a candidate has applied in CSAS-2023 but doesn't fulfil the eligibility criteria of any Program offered by UoD, his/her candidature will not be considered.
- Suppose a candidate did not appear or was absent in a Subject/Test Paper which is mandatorily required for meeting the eligibility criteria of a particular Program, in that case, she will not be eligible for admission to that particular Program.
- If all the documents are found to be in order, and the eligibility criteria are met by the
 candidate, the Allocated Seat will be provisionally approved by the College. In that
 case, the candidate will have to take the admission to the approved allocated seat by
 paying the admission fee within the stipulated time.

THE COMMON SEAT ALLOCATION SYSTEM 2023 IS DIVIDED IN THREE PHASES:

PHASE I: Applying to the University of Delhi

PHASEII: Filling The Preferences for Programs and Colleges

PHASE III: Allocation-cum-admission

The Program-Specific merit score shall be auto-calculated by the University as per the eligibility criteria, and the candidate will have to confirm his/her scores before making the preferences.

SEAT ALLOCATION AND ADMISSION

Step 1 - Acceptance of the Provisionally Allocated Seat

- It is the candidate's responsibility to log in to the dashboard and check if a seat is allocated in a given round of seat allocation; if allocated, she must complete all admission formalities.
- Once a seat has been allocated in a particular round, the candidate must 'Accept' the Allocated Seat before the last date/time specified for the given allocation round. The provision for acceptance of a particular Allocated Seat will be valid only for the round in which the seat was allocated to the candidate.
- In case a candidate is offered multiple seats in a particular round, she must "Accept"
 ONE Allocated seat ONLY. Inactivity/no-action will be taken as non-acceptance to
 the Allocated Seat. It will be treated as a decline to the provisionally Allocated Seat,
 and the candidate will no longer be able to participate in subsequent rounds of
 CSAS-2023.

Step 2(a) - Online Approval by the College

Once the candidate "Accept" the provisionally Allocated Seat, the concerned College will check the eligibility and documents uploaded by the candidate. The college will verify the following within the stipulated timeline:

- 1. Minimum Eligibility of the Candidate.
- 2. Program-Specific Eligibility of the Candidate.
- 3. Subject Mapping: UoD will consider only those CUET subjects in which she has passed Class XII.
- 4. Validity and authenticity of Documents/Certificates submitted by the Candidate.

During the online approval process, if a college seeks more clarity/information from the candidate, it may raise a query to the Candidate (refer to step 2b).

After verification, the College will either 'Approve' or 'Reject' the provisionally AllocatedSeat of the candidate.

No application will be left unattended by the Colleges.

In Case of Approval:

Once the College accords the approval, the candidate will have to pay the 'Admission Fee'.

In Case of Rejection:

At the time of online verification, if an application gets rejected, the College will state the reason for rejection.

For rejecting an application, the College will indicate any of the following reason/s:

- 1. Non-fulfillment of the Minimum Eligibility by the Candidate.
- 2. Non-fulfillment of Program-Specific Eligibility by the Candidate.
- 3. Non-fulfillment of the subject-mapping criteria.
- 4. Invalid documents/certificates submitted by the candidate.
- 5. Failure to respond to the query(ies) raised by the College within the stipulated time.

Step 2(b) - Respond to Queries (if any) duringCollege Approvals

During the online approval process, if a College raises a query(ies) then the candidate must respond online (through the candidate's dashboard) within the stipulated time. Failure to respond to the query(ies) will lead to rejection of the Allocated Seat and the candidate will be out of CSAS- 2023.

Step 3 - Admission to the Provisionally Allocated Seat

After the College approves, the candidate will have to pay the Admission Fee for the approved seat. The admission process will be treated as complete only after successful payment of the admission fee. If a candidate fails to pay the admission fee within the stipulated time, it will be considered as a cancellation of the provisionally Allocated Seat. The Allocated Seat shall be forfeited and the candidate will not be considered for any subsequent CSAS-2023 allocation rounds. The candidate will forfeit all the rights of the allocated seat and will not be considered for any subsequent CSAS-2023 allocation rounds.

Subsequent Rounds of Allocation

OPTION 1 - UPGRADE

All candidates who have applied for CSAS-2023 will be eligible for all allocation rounds, except those whose allocated seat/admission has been cancelled for whatever reason. All admitted candidates who opt for the "Upgrade" option in a particular round will be considered for respective CSAS-2023 allocation round, subject to the availability of seats.

Candidates who were allocated their first preference in any round will not be considered in subsequent rounds of allocation.

Before the announcement of a round, the University will open an "Upgrade" Window for all admitted candidates.

An admitted candidate can select the 'Upgrade' option, which will allow upgradation to a higher preference submitted by the candidate. Admitted candidates who opt for upgradation will automatically be upgraded based on the allocation policy.

Choosing the option 'Upgrade' will mean that the candidate consents to consideration of an offer of admission to a Program + College Combination of his/her higher preference in the subsequent round(if any). Her current admitted seat will be auto cancelled if new preference/s is/are allocated.

A candidate who opts for 'Upgrade' can also reorder the Program + College Combination that were higher in preference than the allocated one.

The Program + CollegeCombination in which she had taken an admission earlierwill never be offered to the candidate in any subsequent round. Similarly, the Program + College combinations which were below in the preference order at which the candidate had taken an admission earlier will never be offered again to the candidate in any subsequent round.

The upgrade option will not be available for the candidate who was allocated her first preference.

It will be the responsibility of the candidate to keep checking for 'Upgrade' options in all rounds of seat allocations. Failure/inability to participate in the upgradation process will not be considered a grievance in any circumstance.

A candidate who gets upgraded will have to 'Accept' the upgraded seat and complete the admission procedures on the upgraded Allocated Seat/s. If a candidate does not do any activity on the upgraded seat/s, it will, by default, be considered cancelled and the candidatewill be out of CSAS-2023.

In case, a candidate does notget upgraded, heradmission to the earlier seatwillbe retained.

OPTION 2 - FREEZE

A candidate who has taken admission on an Allocated Seat and desires to continue with it should submit a 'Freeze' request through her dashboard. On selecting 'Freeze', such a candidate will never be allowed to opt for "Upgradation." If an admitted candidate neither opts for upgradation nor opts for Freeze, and remains inactive for a round, the admission taken by her will be retained and she will not be considered for upgradation.

CANCELLATION OF PROVISIONALLY ALLOCATED SEAT/ADMISSION

- 1. Failure to 'Accept' the provisionally Allocated Seat within the stipulated timeline will lead to the cancellation of the Allocated Seat.
- 2. The provisionally Allocated Seat will be cancelled if a candidate fails to pay the Admission fees within the stipulated time.
- 3. The provisionally Allocated Seat/Admission will be cancelled if, at any time, any of the document(s)/certificate(s) is/are found to be invalid/fraudulent.
- 4. The provisionally Allocated Seat/Admission will be cancelled if, at any time, it is found that a candidate does not meet the minimum eligibility criteria as declared by UoD.

A candidate whose provisionally allocated seat/admission is cancelled due to the abovementioned reasons will forfeit the right to seek admission to UoD through CSAS-2023.

WITHDRAWAL OF ADMISSION

A candidate who has taken an admission but wishes to withdraw can do so through her dashboard by selecting the 'Withdraw' option and paying a withdrawal fee of Rs. 1000.00 (non-refundable).

A candidate who withdraws her admission will be out of CSAS-2023. She will forfeit her eligibility for admission to UG Programs of UoD. No further participation in any of the subsequent allocation rounds (if any) will be allowed.

There will be no option to withdraw the admission once the Spot Admission round is announced.

MID-ENTRY

Candidates who failed to apply for CSAS-2023 within the stipulated time and are desirous of participating in CSAS-2023 can participate through the Mid-Entry window (whenever University announces it), by paying a Mid-Entry fee of Rs. 1000.00 (non-refundable).

A candidate who makes a Mid-Entry may be considered for allocation only after all the candidates who had applied earlier and have the merit score/s higher than the lowest declared score have been given allocated.

It will be mandatory for the Mid-Entrant to take admission on the seat allocated to her, if offered. Failure to accept the allocated seat will forfeit the candidate's admission to UoD. There will be no option of 'Upgrade'.

Mid-Entry will not be allowed for ECA & Sports Supernumerary Quota.

SPOT ADMISSIONS

After the completion of regular CSAS-2023 rounds, if seats remain vacant, UoD may announce Spot round/s of admission.

Candidates who applied for CSAS-2023 but were not admitted to any College on the date of declaration of the Spot Admission round can participate in Spot Admissions.

On the announcement of Spot Admission, the admission of all already candidates will be locked, and they will not be considered for upgrades. Similarly, the admitted candidates will not be allowed to withdraw their admissions.

To be considered in a Spot Admission round, the candidate will have to opt for 'Spot Admission' through her dashboard. For every Spot Admission round the University will display the vacant seats of each Program. A desirous candidate will be able to select ONLY ONE Program.

It will be mandatory for the candidate to take admission to the seat allocated in a Spot round. Failureto accept the allocated seat in the Spot Admission round will forfeit the candidate's eligibility for admission to UoD and she will be out of CSAS.

There will be no option of 'Upgrade' and 'Withdraw' during the Spot Admission rounds. The seat allocated in a particular Spot Admission round will be final and will not be upgraded in any subsequent round of SpotAdmission rounds.

MANDATORY REQUIREMENT OF PHYSICAL VERIFICATION OF ORIGINAL DOCUMENTS

At the conclusion of CSAS-2023, all admitted candidates would have to report to the admitted College and complete all the admission formalities of the concerned College, including physical verification of the documents/certificates.

Admission of a candidateis purely provisional and is subject to verification of original documents by the respective College. The College will recheck all the documents/certificates.

During physical verification, if any document/certificate is found inadequate/insufficient/inappropriate, it will lead to cancellation of the admission, ipso facto. Further, such a candidate will forfeit the opportunity for admission to any UG Program of UoD for the Academic Session 2023-24.

ADMISSION GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL

Level 1 - College Grievance Redressal Committee

Every College will establish a Grievance Redressal Committee to redress grievances that may arise during admission. In addition, a Sub-Committee of Grievance Redressal for redressing the grievances of candidates belonging to SC/ST/OBC/EWS/Minority and PwBD categories will also be established.

The details of the College Grievance Redressal Committee and the Sub-Committee will be displayed on the website of the Collegeand on the admission websiteof UoD to facilitate and address the needs/queries of candidates within the stipulated time. Candidates having grievances about admission should first approach the Grievance Redressal Committee of the concerned College.

Level 2 - Central Grievance Redressal Committee

If grievance/s is/are not resolved within a reasonable time by the College, then candidates may approach the Central Grievance Redressal Committee of UoD. This Committee will resolve allocation and admission-related issues of candidates. The details of the Central Grievance Redressal Committee will be displayed on the admission website of UoD.

If a grievance is found relevant and genuine, and if seats in a specific Program + College combination have been filled, then such a candidate will be offered a supernumerary seat. The decision(s) by the concerned authorities with regard to grievances shall be final and binding.

Admission grievances related to NCWEB, ECA, Sports supernumerary quota, and CW will be redressed by the respective committees of UoD.

B.A. (Program) offers a wide range of subject combinations to attract students to graduate in the subjects of her likeness. Colleges offer a range of combinations from which a student may choose the subjects in which she may like to pursue his/her further studies. The University of Delhi offers more than 180 BA (Program) Combinations, thereby offering an amalgamation of different subjects.

Eligibility for Admission in B.A. (Program)

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

• Combination I: Any one Language from List A + Any two subjects from List B1 + Any one subject from either List B1 or List B2

OR

- Combination II: Any one language from List A + Any one subject from either List B1 or List B2 + SECTION III of CUET (General Test)
- Merit will be based on the best CUET score obtained from any of the abovementioned combinations of subjects

Note: As the weightage of the CUET Sections is not the same, appropriate proration will be done.

B.A. (HONS.) APPLIED PSYCHOLOGY

This program aims to help students develop an awareness and understanding of the contemporary trends and growth in Applied Psychology. This will be substantiated by enabling students to learn relevant academic and professional skills through training and self-reflections in the discipline of psychology. This program has been framed to maintain the teaching standards, assessment of students and keep the interface of psychology individual/community for the human welfare at the forefront. The course has been developed keeping in mind the current realities of the discipline, including the sociocultural context. The reach to different psychology fields has been made by incorporating different papers, viz. Social Psychology, Developmental Psychology, Systems in Psychological Psychology, Understanding Disorders, Counselling Psychology, Industrial/Organizational Behaviour, HealthPsychology and others.

Eligibility for Admission in B.A. (Hons.) Applied Psychology

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

- Any one Language from List A + Any two subjects from List B1 + Any one subject from either List B1 or List B2.
- Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtained from the above-mentioned combination of subjects.

B.A. (HONS.) ECONOMICS

The B.A. (Hons.) Economics curriculum offers a rigorous basis for much of the advanced thinking in the Economics discipline. It provides the student with a logical paradigm for conceptualising and interpreting the behaviour and interactions of households, firms, and government institutions. The curriculum allows students to choose elective courses from a set of courses with contemporary relevance, thereby offering students the flexibility to prepare for careers in academia, law, management, journalism, government, and many other fields. The programme is consistent with global standards in the Economics discipline. It offers training comparable to that of an undergraduate student at the world's best universities.

Eligibility for Admission in B.A. (Hons.) Economics

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

- Any one Language from List A + Mathematics/Applied Mathematics + Any two subjects out of which one should be from ListB1
- Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtained from the above-mentioned combination of subjects.

B.A. (HONS.) ENGLISH

This course is designed to help students define/critique the category of Literature; and understand the emergence of literary studies, textuality, and the canon. This course aims to contest and demystify pre- conceived notions of literature as mimetic representations, underline literature as part of cultural production, firmly embedded in historical specificity, develop language skills in an integrated way through an intense engagement with the prescribed texts and give the learners hands-on practice in the use of these skills.

Eligibility for Admission in B.A. (Hons.) English

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

- English from ListA + Any two subjects from List B1 + Any one subject from either List B1 or List B2
- Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtained from the above-mentioned combination of subjects

B.A. (HONS.) HINDI

This course familiarizes the students of Hindi with a wider understanding of the ability of the language, as well as develops the ability to connect them in the context of the challenges of society locally as well as globally. It is also developing a new understanding of Hindi literature and practicality of the language and professional competence.

Eligibility for Admission in B.A. (Hons.) Hindi

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

- Hindi from ListA + Any two subjects from List B1 + Any one subject from either List B1 or List B2
- Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtained from the above-mentioned combination of subjects

B.A. (HONS.) HISTORY

The course offers to inculcate the graduate with attributes such as well-being, emotional stability, critical thinking, social justice, and employability skills. B.A. History (Hons.) offers students access to recent historiography in the field organized in a pedagogical form that is accessible and interesting. It is structured for students in an interdisciplinary program, providing them with a concise and thorough introduction to the discipline of History and remaining sensitive to the cognate discipline that they are also studying. It seeks to provide multiple points of intersection with disciplines in the Humanities and the Social Sciences to open communication modes by which a historical sensibility can be an enriching experience.

Eligibility for Admission in B.A. (Hons.) History

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

- Any one Language from List A + Any two subjects from List B1 + Any one subject from either List B1 or List B2
- Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtained from the above-mentioned combination of subjects.

B.A. (HONS.) PHILOSOPHY

This program attempts to introduce and provide an in-depth look into one of the most challenging subjects one can study. It introduces the student to the great philosophers and their ideas and how one thinks about contemporary problems through the lens of their theories. It gives a comprehensive sweep of Indian and Western philosophy and makes students aware of the main currents of thought in Ethics. Students also explore the Philosophy of Science, Logic, Feminism and Bio-ethics, amongst many other core and optional papers. The core idea is to make the students aware of the foundational issues related to the world around us, whether in our life, or regarding mind and matter, or existence, or belief, or religion or science.

Eligibility for Admission in B.A. (Hons.) Philosophy

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

- Any one Language from List A + Any two subjects from List B1 + Any one subject from either List B1 or List B2.
- Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtained from the above-mentioned combination of subjects.

B.A. (HONS.) POLITICAL SCIENCE

This program aims to familiarize students with the way political questions are posed and how they impact more significant issues of thought and existence in society. The program also focuses on finding solutions to these questions. By introducing philosophers from different traditions, students can answer a few fundamental political questions: Why do we live in political communities? What is the 'best' form of government? How human nature influences political decision-making? How and in what circumstances do we need to resist bad rulers? By the end of the course, students are able to understand the idea of modernity and establish a connection between societal changes posed through modernity and its prescribed political suggestions.

Eligibility for Admission in B.A. (Hons.) Political Science

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

- Any one Language from List A + Any two subjects from List B1 + Any one subject from either List B1 or List B2.
- Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtained from the above-mentioned combination of subjects.

B.A. (HONS.) SANSKRIT

This program aims at getting the students acquainted with the general outlines of Classical Sanskrit Literature (Poetry) through classical texts, develop a fair idea of the works of great Sanskrit poets, appreciate the styles and thoughts of individual poets focussing on the poetical, artistic, cultural and historical aspectsof their works. This program will enhance competence in chaste classical Sanskrit and give them skills in translation and interpretation of poetic works.

Eligibility for Admission in B.A. (Hons.) Sanskrit

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

- Combination I: Any one Language from List A + Sanskrit from List B1 + Any two subjects out of which one should be from List B1. OR
- Combination II: Any one Language from List A + Sanskrit from List A + Any two subjects out of which one should be from List B1. OR
- Combination III: Sanskrit from List A + Any three subjects out of which at least two should be from List B1.

 OR
- Combination IV: Any one Language from List A + Any two subjects from List B1 + Any one subject from either List B1 or List B2

Merit will be based on the best CUET score obtained from any of the above-mentioned combinations of subjects. Candidates who opted for Combination IV for admission will be considered only if seats remain vacant after considering all the candidates who opted for Combination I/II/III

BACHELOR OF BUSINESS ECONOMICS (BBE)

The B.A. (Hons.) Business Economics program is a perfect blend of practical, analytical and theoretical tools to imbibe proficient capabilities in students to analyse data and information for sound policy formulation and decision making. Business Economics is essentially an application-based inter- disciplinary approach to tackling business problems. The academic orientation of the course has been designed to create a strong orientation toward the seamless applicability of economics and related tools in the various functions of a business enterprise. The course equips students with tools and principles relating to subjects such as Statistics, Finance, Marketing, Economics, Econometrics with relevant software to keep abreastwith the changing economic scenario and globalisation of business.

Eligibility for Admission in B.Com. (Hons.

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

- Any one Language from List A + Mathematics/Applied Mathematics + SECTION III of CUET (General Test)
- Merit will be based on the best CUET score obtained from any of the abovementioned combinations of subjects

B.COM. (HONS.)

B.Com. (Hons.) program of the University of Delhi is designed to enable and empower students to acquire knowledge, skills and abilities to analyse and synthesize the contemporary realities pertaining to the business. This course provides for maintaining and sustaining existing businesses in the face of the winds of change and competition and a desperately needed perspective of sustainable growth. This program aims to instil conceptual understanding to equip students to deal with today's business realities and prepare them to drive and face the challenge of tomorrow. It also exposes the students to the world of technology and digitization in the relevant field as envisaged by scholars and policymakers. As mandated by the Government of India, thiscourse is designed to help cultivate an entrepreneurial mindsetand skills.

Eligibility for Admission in B.Com. (Hons.)

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

• **Combination I**: Any one Language from List A + Mathematics/Applied Mathematics + Any two subjects out of which at least one should be from List B1

OR

- Combination II: •Any one Language from List A + Accountancy/Book Keeping + Any two subjects out of which atleast one should be from List B1
- Merit will be based on the best CUET score obtained from any of the abovementioned combinations of subjects

B.COM.

Commerce is visualised as a link between society and business. The nature and purpose of interaction between both have undergone tremendous change with time. Information technology has re-modelled the shape and design of the business, engendering the metamorphosis of its very nature and the matrix of societal functioning.

Recognising the implications of this change, the B.Com. Program aims at building in students an understanding of the functioning and premise of the business world. To achieve this, the program offers an opportunity for students to know different aspects of organizational functioning, financial systems, understanding of the economy, laws governing business, strategies adopted by businesses to reach society, etc. The program also provides the students an opportunity to explore, experiment and equip themselves to serve society not as employment seekers but as an entrepreneur and job creators.

Eligibility for Admission in B.Com.

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

- **Combination I**: Anyone Language from List A + Any two subjects from List B1 + Any one subject from either List B1 or List B2. **OR**
- Combination II: Anyone Language from List A + Any one subject from either List B1 or List B2 + SECTION III of CUET (General Test)
- Merit will be based on the best CUET score obtained from any of the abovementioned combinations of subjects

Note: As the weightage of the CUETSections is not the same, appropriate proration will be done.

B.SC. (HONS.) BOTANY

This course curriculum offers the essential knowledge and technical skills to study plants holistically. Students would be trained in all areas of plant biology using a unique combination of core and elective papers with significant interdisciplinary components. Students would be exposed to cutting-edge technologies currently used in the study of plant life forms, their evolution and interactions with other organisms within the ecosystem. Students would also become aware of the social and environmental significance of plantsand their relevance to the national economy.

Eligibility for Admission in B.Sc. (Hons.) Botany

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

- Physics + Chemistry + Biology/Biological Studies/ Biotechnology/ Biochemistry
- Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtainedfrom the above-mentioned combination of subjects.
- Candidates must have obtained a minimum of 30% score in any one language of List A in CUET.

B.SC. (HONS.) CHEMISTRY

This curriculum offers inorganic, organic, physical, materials and analytical courses. The courses will train students with sound theoretical and experimental knowledge that suits the need of academics and industry. The courses also offer ample skills to pursue research as a career in chemistry and allied areas. This program is offered by one of the largest and oldest Departments in the country to produce the best minds to meet the demands of society. The University of Delhi hopes that the programme BSc (Hons.) Chemistry will help students make an informed decision regarding the goals they wish to pursue in further education and life.

Eligibility for Admission in B.Sc. (Hons.) Chemistry

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

- Physics + Chemistry + Mathematics/Applied Mathematics
- Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtained from the above-mentioned combination of subjects.
- Candidates must have obtained a minimum of 30% score in any one language of List A in CUET.

B.SC. (HONS.) MATHEMATICS

The B.Sc. (Hons.) Mathematics program aims at developing the ability to think critically, logically, and analytically and hence use mathematical reasoning in everyday life. Pursuing a degree in mathematics will introduce the students to several interesting and valuable ideas in preparation for several mathematics careers in education, research, government sector, business sector and industry. The B.Sc. (Hons.) Mathematics program covers the full range of mathematics, from classical Calculus to Modern Cryptography, Information Theory, and Network Security. The course lays a structured foundation of Calculus, Real & Complex analysis, Abstract Algebra, Differential Equations (including Mathematical Modelling), Number Theory, Graph Theory, and C++ Programming exclusively for Mathematics.

Eligibility for Admission in B.Sc. (Hons.) Mathematics

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

- Any one language from List A + Mathematics/Applied Mathematics + Any two subjects out of which one should be from ListB1
- Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtained from the above-mentioned combination of subjects.

B.SC. (HONS.) MICROBIOLOGY

The B.Sc. (Hons.) Microbiology program covers a wide range of basic and applied microbiology courses and courses of interdisciplinary nature. The core courses that are a part of the program are designed to build a strong microbiology knowledge base in the student and acquaints them with the applied aspects of this fascinating discipline. The student is thus equipped to pursue higher studies in an institution of her/his choice and apply the skills learned in the program to solve practical societal problems.

Eligibility for Admission in B.Sc. (Hons.) Microbiology

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

- Physics + Chemistry + Biology/Biological Studies/ Biotechnology/ Biochemistry
- Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtained from the above-mentioned combination of subjects.
- Candidates must have obtained a minimum of 30% score in any one language of List A in CUET.

B.SC. (HONS.) PHYSICS

Physics is an experimental and theoretical science that systematically studiesthe laws of nature operating at length scales from the sub-atomic domains to the entire universe. The core areas of study within the disciplinary/subject area of the B.Sc. (Hons.) Physics program are: Classical and Quantum Mechanics, Electricity and Magnetism, Thermal and Statistical Physics, Wave theory and Optics, Physics of the Materials, DigitalElectronics, and specialized methods of Mathematical Physics and their applications in different branches of the subject. Along with the theoretical coursework, students also learn physics laboratory methods for different branches of physics, specialized measurement techniques, analysis of observational data, including error estimation, and scientific report writing. The latest addition to Physics pedagogy is computational physics, which involves adapting Physics problems for algorithmic solutions and modelling and simulation of physical phenomena.

Eligibility for Admission in B.Sc. (Hons.) Physics

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

- Physics + Chemistry + Maths/ Applied Mathematics
- Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtainedfrom the above-mentioned combination of subjects.
- Candidates must have obtained a minimum of 30% score in any one language of List A in CUET.

B.SC. (HONS.) ZOOLOGY

Through this course, the students will be more equipped to learn and know about different human systems, their coordination and control. The Zoology degree program provides a platform to comprehend classical genetics to understand the distribution of other traits among populations, their inheritance, ethnicity and correlate with contemporary and modern techniques like genomics, metagenomics, genome editing and molecular diagnostic tools. This course's practical and theoretical skills will help design different public health strategies for social welfare. The course has been designed to provide in-depth knowledge of applied subject sensuring the inculcation of employment skills so that students can make a career and become entrepreneurs in diverse fields of aquatic biology, sericulture, apiculture etc. After completing this course, students can contribute as policymakers in wildlife conservation, animal preservation and environment protection.

Eligibility for Admission in B.Sc. (Hons.) Zoology

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

- Physics + Chemistry + Biology/Biological Studies/ Biotechnology/ Biochemistry
- Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtained from the above-mentioned combination of subjects.
- Candidates must have obtained a minimum of 30% score in any one language of List A in CUET.

B.SC. (PROG.) PHYSICAL SCIENCE WITH CHEMISTRY

This course aims to make students aware of the SI Units, concentration terms, various analytical methods, types of errors in chemical analysis, statistical tests of data, and safe usage of chemicals and their waste.

Eligibility for Admission in B.Sc. (Prog.) Physical Science with Chemistry

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

- Physics + Mathematics/Applied Mathematics + Chemistry
- Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtainedfrom the above-mentioned combination of subjects.
- Candidates must have obtained a minimum of 30% score in any one language of List A in CUET.

B.SC. (PROG.) LIFE SCIENCE

This program will offer students to acquire comprehensive knowledge of disciplinary subjects along with allied subjects of biological sciences, which will help students to understand and appreciate the diversity of life processes existing in the world as well as their evolutionary aspects. In addition, the course will develop the skills to handle research equipment and computational tools like genomics, meta genetics and gain knowledge in designing holistic public health strategies for social welfare.

Eligibility for Admission inB.Sc. (Prog.) Life Science

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

- Chemistry + Physics+ Biology/Biological Studies/ Biotechnology
- Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtained from the above-mentioned combination of subjects.
- Candidates must have obtained a minimum of 30% score in any one language of List A in CUET

BACHELOR OF ELEMENTARY EDUCATION (B. EL. ED)

It aims to produce graduates of high caliber in elementary teacher education. Furthermore, it has upgraded the professional status of the elementary school teacher by providing a university degree for elementary education. The program is intensive and focused on preparing teachers by providing a supportive and stimulating environment.

Eligibility for Admission in B.EL.ED

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

- Any one Language from List A + Any two subjects from List B1 + Any one subject from either List B1 or List B2
- Merit will be based on the best CUET score obtained from any of the abovementioned combinations of subjects

The Candidates shall be required to upload copies of relevant certificates/documents at the time of applying (as applicable) and produce the same certificates/documents in original at the time of physical verification at the College.

The name of candidate claiming reservation under SC/ST/OBCNCL/EWS/Minority/CW/KM/PwBD must match the name that appear on her corresponding School Board qualifying certificate and in CUET(UG) 2023. Similarly, her parents' names must match in both sets of certificates.
- 4 OBC Non-Creamy Layer Certificate (in the name of the Candidate) issued by the competent issuing authority, and wherein the caste is in the OBC Central List issued by http://ncbc.nic.in. The name of the candidate claiming reservation under OBC Non-Creamy Layer must match with the name as it appears on her corresponding School Board qualifying certificate and in CUET(UG) 2023; similarly, the parents' names must match in both sets of certificates. Income certificate must be issued after March 31, 2023. The prescribed format of the OBC-NCL certificate is given on the UoD admission website and Annexure.
- 5 EWS Certificate (in the name of the candidate) from the competent issuing authority certifying the candidate can claim reservation under this category. The name of the candidate claiming reservation under this category must match with the name that appears on her corresponding School Board qualifying certificate; similarly, her parents' names must match in both sets of certificates. Income certificate must be issued after March 31, 2023. Refer to Annexure IV for the prescribed format of the certificate.

- PwBD disability certificate should be in the name of the candidate issued by a recognized Government Hospital, bearing a photograph of the candidate (Refer to Annexure IV for the prescribed format of the certificate). Disability Certificates issued after 01.06.2021 must be as per the Gazette Notification no. 1736 (E) dated 05.05.2021 issued by the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities and applied through UDID portal. However, Disability Certificates issued before 01.06.2021, will be considered as per other existing applicable rules and notifications of the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities and the University of Delhi.
- 8 Candidates applying for the CW category must upload the Educational Concession Certificate (ECC), (in the name of the candidate) in the prescribed format wherein the Priority is clearly mentioned. Refer to AnnexureIV for the prescribed format of the certificate.
- 9 Candidate applying for the Kashmiri Migrant category must upload the relevant certification in the correct format issued by Divisional Commissioner/Relief Commissioner.
- 10 Candidates who wish to seek admission under UoD Ward supernumerary quota must upload a valid employment certificate of her parent/s issued by the due officials. Only the employment certificate uploaded in CSAS Application form will be considered. Icards, Aadhar Card and/or any other document will not be accepted.

Candidates shall be responsible for the quality and authenticity of the certificate they upload. Candidates must take utmost care to ensure the uploaded documents/certificates are authentic and accurate

Candidates will be responsible to produce documents/certificates as sought. All certificates/ documents will be returned to the candidate by the College/Department upon completion of any physical verification that may be required at a later stage.

If the original certificates are not in English/Hindi, the English/Hindi version/translation of such certificates, duly certified the Principal/Director or other competent authority of the last Institute attended, will be required during the verification of documents.

- If selected, a medical certificate from a reputable hospital beside a medical check-up in the college would be mandatory. Any candidate failing the medical check-up would not be granted admission.
- It is mandatory to submit an undertaking on judicial stamp paper of Rs. 100/- by the selected sports person at the time of admission stating that they will play for the college and university during their undergraduate course of study.
- Admission will be done as per DU Information Bulletin 2023-24

ADMISSION ON OTHER SUPERNUMERARY QUOTA

Persons with Benchmark Disability (PwBD)

Five percent (5%) of the total sanctioned strength in each Program of all Colleges are reserved for PwBD candidates. The eligibility and details related to disabilities earmarked for PwBD category are stated in UG BOI 2023.

Separate Merit List/s will be declared for candidates seeking admission under PwBD quota. For the prescribed format of PwBD certificate, refer to CSAS 2023.

Children/Widows of Personnel of the Armed Forces (CW)

Five percent(5%) of seats are reserved for candidates for Children/Widows of Personnel of the Armed Forces (CW), Program-wise, in all colleges. Separate Merit List will be declared for candidates seeking admission under the CW quota.

CW candidates must also confirm their Priority and certificate. For details related to CW Priority, refer to UG-BOI 2023.

Kashmiri Migrants (KM)

Separate Merit List/s will be declared for candidates seeking admission under the Kashmiri Migrants quota.

Up to 5% of seats are reserved Program-wise in all colleges for the Wards of Kashmiri Migrants. All wards of Kashmiri Migrants will have to upload a Certificate of Registration as Kashmiri Migrants issued by Divisional Commissioner / Relief Commissioner.

Prime Minister's Special Scholarship Scheme for J&KStudents (PMSSS)

Candidates selected under the Prime Minister's Special Scholarship Scheme for J&K students will be admitted as per AICTE and UoD rules.

UoD Ward Quota

Admission to the wards of the University and its College employees, both teaching and non-teaching, will be done as per Academic Council resolution 9a & b dated 27.11.2020 and subsequent amendments/notifications thereof.

ORPHANS QUOTA

The University of Delhi will be admitting two candidates in each program of study. These two seats will be supernumerary. The expenditure incurred for admission and continuance of study of such students in the University or its Colleges shall be met from the University Welfare Fund or College Students' Welfare Fund, as the case may be, for admissions in the University or in the College.

Candidate who wishes to seek admission under the orphans quota will have to upload certificate from a Govt. recognized Orphanage/Charitable Home or Death certificate of both the parents.

DETAILS OF THE UNDERGRADUATE COURSE FRAMEWORK UNDER NEW EDUCATION POLICY, AS APPLICABLE IN UNIVERSITY OF DELHI

1. Academic Credit -

An academic credit is a unit by which the course work is measured. It determines the number of hours of instructions required per week. One credit is equivalent to one hour of teaching (lecture or tutorial) or two hours of practicalwork/field work per week.

2. Courses of study -

Courses of the study indicate pursuance of study in a particular discipline. Every discipline shall offer three categories of courses of study, viz. Discipline Specific Core courses (DSCs), Discipline Specific Electives(DSEs) and GenericElectives (GEs).

(a) Discipline Specific Core (DSC): Discipline Specific Core is a course of study which should be pursued by a student as a mandatory requirement of her programme of study. DSCs shall be the core credit courses of that particular discipline which will be appropriately graded and arranged across the semesters of study, being undertaken by the student, with multiple exit options as per NEP 2020. The DSCs specified in the framework would be identified by the concerned Department as core courses to be taught in a Programme. For example, for award of single discipline-specific Honours degree, such as B.A. (Honours) History, B.Com. (Honours), B.Sc. (Honours) Physics and similar such programmes, DSCs shall be the core courses of History, Commerce and Physics, respectively.

However, to pursue an Honours degree programme in a 'Field of Multidisciplinary courses of Study' (rather than a single discipline) such as B.Sc. (Hon.) Life Sciences, B.A. (Hon.) Social Sciences/Humanities, the DSCs shall comprise core credit courses of more than one discipline. For example, for B.Sc. (Honours) Life Sciences programme, a student shall study credit courses in three disciplines i.e., Botany, Zoology and Chemistry. DSC 1 may be of Discipline A1 (say, Botany), DSC 2 may be of Discipline B 1 (say, Zoology) and DSC 3 may be of Discipline C 1 (say, Chemistry).

(b) Discipline Specific Elective(DSE): The Discipline Specific Electives (DSEs)shall be a pool of credit courses of that particular discipline (single discipline programme of study) or those disciplines (a multidisciplinary programme of study), as the case may be, which a student chooses to study from her particular discipline(s). There shall be a pool of DSEs from which a student may choose a course of study. The DSEs specified in the framework would be identified by the concerned department as elective courses to be taught in a Programme. For example, to pursue B.Sc. (Honours) Physics, DSEs chosen should be from a pool of DSEs of Physics. Similarly, to pursue B.Sc.(Honours) Life Sciences programme, the DSEs chosen should be a pool of courses of DSEs of Botany, Zoology and Chemistry, the core subjects for this programme of study.

However, to pursue Honours degree programme in a 'Field of Multidisciplinary courses of Study' (rather than a single discipline) such as B.Sc. (Honours) Life Sciences, B.A. (Honours) Social Sciences/Humanities, in the fourth year of such honours degree programme in the VII and VIII semesters, the student shall be required to choose DSEs from any one of the Disciplines A/B/C and not a combination of these three disciplines. Please refer to the framework given as Illustration – I in Table- 3

- (c) Generic Elective (GE): Generic Electives shall be a pool of courses which is meant to provide multidisciplinary or interdisciplinary education to students. GEs shall consist of a pool of courses offered by various disciplines of study (excluding the GEs offered by the parent discipline), in groups of odd and even semesters, from which a student can choose. The GEs specified in the framework would be identified by the concerned Department as GEs to be taught in a Programme. In case a student opts for DSEs beyond her discipline-specific course(s) of study, such DSEs shall be treated as GEs for that student.
- (d) Ability Enhancement course (AEC), Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) & Value Addition Course (VAC): These three courses shall be a pool of courses offered by all the Departments in groups of odd and even semesters from which students can choose. A student who desires to make Academic Project/Entrepreneurship as a Minor has to pick the appropriate combination of courses of GE, SEC, VAC, & Internship/Apprenticeship/Project/ Community (IAPC), which shall be offered in the form of various modules as specified in the scheme of studies.
- (i) AEC courses are courses based upon the content that leads to knowledge enhancement through various areas of study. They are Language and Literature and Environmental Science and Sustainable Development which will be mandatory for all disciplines.
- (ii) SEC are skill-based courses in all disciplines and are aimed at providing hands-on training, competencies, proficiency and skills to students. SEC courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide skill-based instruction. Every discipline may provide skillbased courses, some of which may be offered to students of its discipline while the rest can be open to students of all other disciplines.

(iii) VAC courses are common pool of courses offered by different disciplines and aimed towards personality building; embedding ethical, cultural and constitutional values; promote critical thinking, Indian Knowledge Systems, scientific temperament, communication skills, creative writing, presentation skills, sports & physical education and teamwork which will help in all round development of students.

2. Major discipline

a) A student pursuing four-year undergraduate programme in a specific discipline (Core course) shall be awarded an appropriate Honours degree with Major in a Discipline on completion of VIII Semester, if she secures in that Discipline at least 50% of the total credits, i.e., at least 88 credits in that Discipline out of the total of 176 credits. She shall study 20 DSCs and at least 2 DSEs in eight semesters.

For instance, a student who pursues B.Com. (Honours) shall earn a minimum88 credits from 20 DSCs and at least two DSEs in order to get Major in Commerce.

b) A student pursuing four-year undergraduate programme in more than one discipline as Core Course (for example, B.A. Social Sciences/Humanities, B.Sc. Life Sciences, B.Sc. Physical Sciences, B.Sc. Mathematical Sciences, B.Com. and such other programmes) shall be awarded appropriate Honours degree with Major in a Discipline on completion of VIII Semester, if she secures in that Discipline 80 credits out of a total of 176 credits. She shall study 6 DSCs and at least 3 DSEs in that discipline in the first six semesters and 2 DSCs, 6 DSEs and write dissertation in that discipline in the VII and VIII semesters.

For instance, a student who pursues four-year B.A. (Honours) Social Sciences/Humanities shall be eligible for Major in History, on completion of VIII semester, if she earns minimum80 credits from 8 DSCs and at least 9 DSEs of History and writes dissertation on a topic related to History.

2. Minor discipline

- a) A student mentioned at 3 (a) above may be awarded a Minor in a discipline on completion of VIII Semester, if she earns minimum 28 credits from seven GE courses of that discipline. For example, if a student pursuing B.A. (Honours) History chooses seven GE courses of Political Science out of a total of ten GE courses and writes dissertation, she shall be awarded on successful completion of VIII Semester, Major in History and Minor in Political Science.
- b) A student mentioned at 3 (b) above may be awarded Minor in a discipline, on completion of VIII Semester, if she earns minimum 28 credits from six DSCs and one DSE of that discipline. For example, a student pursuing four-year B.A.(Honours) Social Sciences/Humanities with Major in History (after securing at least 80 credits in History), may be awarded Minor in Hindi if she earns 28 credits from six DSCs and one DSE of Hindi (up to VI semester), on successful completion of VIII Semester.

This definition of Minor is independent of GEs for which there is a requirement of 28 credits to be treated as Minor.

Further, in case a student opts for two disciplines, such as Physics and Chemistry, instead of three disciplines, such as Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics, major and minor shall be determined as per credits earned in the respective courses of study. The concept of Minoris relevant only whenthere is a Major discipline.

If the sum total of the DSCs and DSEs of Discipline A is less than 80 credits, then the credits earned in the dissertation written on a topic of Discipline A shall also be taken into consideration to complete the requisite 80 credits.

Gargi College offers financial assistance to eligible students based on their annual income, as reported in their Income Proof. The Students Welfare Fund committee and the Principal review the applications received and determine the amount of aid to be awarded. As funding is limited, their decisions are final.

Students whose Parent/s have an Annual Income of Rs. 2 Lakhs or less will be considered for aid. However, the availability of financial assistance is not guaranteed if there are many applicants.

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AUDITORIUM

The college has its own state-of-the-art auditorium with a seating capacity of 750 spread over the main floor and the mezzanine. The airy, spacious portico endowed with natural daylight and furnished with tables and chairs serves as a quiet place for conducting tutorial classes. The auditorium block is fully airconditioned and equipped with solar lighting installations.

SEMINAR HALL

Adjoining the auditorium is a splendiferous seminar hall with a seating capacity of 125. It is equipped with latest audio-visual equipment and is utilised for hosting various academic events

OPEN AIR THEATRE

A new open-air stage has been recently constructed behind the office block with sufficient seating provision for the audience in the form of adjoining steps and a lush green lawn at its centre. This would serve as an open-air platform for students for various events and especially for Street Plays and other such open-air events.

BIOINFORMATICS INFRASTRUCTURE FACILITY

Gargi College is the only Women's college in University of Delhi to have Bioinformatics Infrastructure Facility (funded by DBT with a yearly grant for maintenance and allied expenses). Undergraduate students from any scientific discipline can implement bioinformatics projects with guidance from faculty.

COMPUTER LABORATORIES

Computers have become an indispensable part of the undergraduate college curricula with the introduction of a variety of revised and restructured courses. The three computer laboratories in the college consisting of 110 computers with Wi-Fi connectivity provide students with an opportunity for hands-on training and enhancing their computing skills. The laboratories are also available for career-intensive education after regular class hours.

LABORATORIES - Science/Elementary Education/Psychology

The Botany, Chemistry, Elementary Education, Microbiology, Physics, Psychology and Zoology laboratories are not only spacious and well-ventilated but also very well-equipped with the latest equipment and other academic resources. Working in any of these laboratories is a pleasurable experience. There are separate research laboratories for Botany and Physics Departments where research is being conducted by the faculty members.

SCIENCE MUSEUMS

The Botany and Zoology Museums, maintained by the respective Departments, house a comprehensive collection of preserved specimens of flora and fauna, biological samples, slides and other resource materials. The collection has been built up painstakingly over several decades and is well maintained. The museum also preserves specimens collected by students and faculty members on field trips and excursions from diverse and exotic locations across the country. The exhibits and samples provide depth and range to learning in the laboratory.



ANANDA: THE GARGI CENTRE FOR WELLBEING

The Centre for Wellbeing was established in 2023 under the vision for holistic wellbeing for all the community members. At Gargi, we believe in holistic wellbeing of our community members through continued endeavours across disciplines, as well as empowering the community towards creating a positive environment that helps us all evolve in ways that maximises our wellbeing and equips us with tools to navigate through life in resilient ways that helps in the collective growth of our community. Our vision at the Gargi Centre for Wellbeing, is to utilize a multicultural and multidisciplinary perspective to accredit the community members with indigenous tools and skills to help them flourish in various spheres of life. The conception of this idea led to the incubation of our Centre for Wellbeing. The Centre has been conceptualized to integrate positive and affirmative actions that will impact the overall health of the Gargi community members and anyone who would want to grow with Gargi. We plan to adapt evidence-based practices from a multi-disciplinary perspective to enhance the wellbeing of the stake holders and be mindful of how structural and systemic changes impact the welfare of all.

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& FACILITIES NFRASTRUCTURE

GARGI CENTRAL LIBRARY

Gargi has a rich library with a total of 76946 accessioned books, a collection of 381 CDs; access to 42 periodicals and 10 newspapers. It has various facilities like a reading room for students, a separate reading room for teachers, facility of Web-OPAC, UGC-InflibNet and access to DULS eresources as well. In addition, we have a separate website for our library accessible through the URL http://gargicollege.saraswatilib.com/, which is designed to assist our users. The library has access to the Electronic Resource Management package for e-resources: User control provided by NLIST. The library subscribes to a large number of Electronics Resources through UGC-Infonet, which includes e-resources (6000 + e-journals and 199500+ e-Books under N-LIST & 600000 e-Books through NDLI) and University of Delhi connectivity which includes Delhi University Library Systems' Reference Sources, Bibliographic Sources, Statistical Sources and Full Text Sources. By March 31, 2023, students had consulted and borrowed a total of over 222,117 books from the library, excluding periodicals, while the library was visited by approximately 50,854 students, excluding faculty and non-teaching staff.



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CANTEEN AND CAFETERIA

The Canteen, our students' favourite hangout, is where all the gustatory desires are satiated. With lots of yummy food offered at reasonable prices, this is a place where students from all streams meet, interact and confabulate over steaming cups of tea/coffee. Cold drinks, fruit juice, spicy chaat, momos, crispy spring rolls, delicious idli, vada, dosa, mouth-watering pastries, cakes, burgers, patties, samosas and bread pakoras are among the various food items on offer. A water harvesting system has been installed in the canteen area. The canteen has been renovated and extended by constructing an additional food outlet: Happiness Corner!!! A Nescafé kiosk is also positioned in the precincts of the cafeteria.

INFIRMARY

The Medical facility is available to students during college hours. There is a medical room with a trained nurse for providing basic first aid to the students. Besides, students can also get their health check-up done. Regular medical and dental check-ups are conducted in the college by qualified medical professionals.

STUDENTS' COMMON ROOM: 'RETREAT'

Located near the cafeteria, the students' common room, 'Retreat' is a place where students can unwind, chitchat with friends and interact with seniors. It helps them learn about the college life and get familiar with their campus, which is their second home for three years. Students' very own space in college. Retreat always has its doors open for all students.

STUDENTS' UNION ROOM

The Students' Council of Gargi College is a step towards instilling the values of democracy among students. The General Body elects a new council each year which is of the students, for the students, by the students. The Department of Botany at Gargi College was established in 1967 and is dedicated to teaching and research in all fields of plant biology. The department comprises of faculty with diverse specializations, well-equipped technical staff and enthusiastic students. The department is well-equipped with laboratories for carrying out practical classes and research work, a Botany - Museum, which hosts plant specimens, and a Botanical Garden. The course structure also allows students to choose from a wide array of specialized areas like Environmental Biotechnology, Biofertilizers, Intellectual Property Rights, Industrial Microbiology, Medicinal Botany, etc. Field trips and excursions are organized to enable students to have a first-hand experience of the flora in their natural habitat. Industrial visits are also organized for the students as a part of their curricular activities. Department also organizes various workshops, add-on courses and student enrichment courses. Over the years, the department has maintained high academic standards and produced several dedicated teachers, scientists, and others who excelled in various fields. The department encourages students to work on minor research projects along with their undergraduate courses. The well-designed course facilitates students to pursue postgraduate studies in Botany, Biosciences, Biomedical Sciences, Genetics, Molecular Biology. Biotechnology. Chemistry

The Department of Chemistry is one of the oldest departments of the college and was established in 1967. Commerce

Commerce is a multidisciplinary stream that studies law, management, accounting, finance, and human behaviour. The Department of Commerce, established in 1973, offers two undergraduate degree courses - B.Com. (Hons.) and B.Com. and teaches one paper on Entrepreneurship and Small Business to the students of the BA Programme. As per the New Education Policy, value-added and skill enhancement courses like digital marketing, statistics with R, financial literacy, personal financial planning and the art of being happy have been introduced by the department, thereby adding value to the students' employability skills.

Currently encompassing a strength of over 1200 students, the department has a brilliant pool of dedicated and experienced faculty specialized in their respective fields who work towards providing quality education for the holistic development of students. Additionally, the college runs two Add-on Certificate courses in the field of commerce, namely Advertising & Mass Communication and Banking & Financial Services which are managed by the department faculty. Additionally, to maintain and nurture the connection of alumni with their Alma mater, the department has constituted the Alumni Association. Commerce students have maintained consistent results with 100% pass percentage in both courses over the last four years, with many securing university positions as well.

Economics

The college started teaching Economics as a B.A. (Pass) discipline since its inception in 1967. The department offers B.A. (Honours) in Economics and Economics as a discipline course in B.A. (Programme). The B.A. (Hons.) Economics curriculum offers a rigorous basis for much of the advanced thinking in the Economics discipline. It provides the students with a logical paradigm for conceptualizing and interpreting the behaviour and interactions of households, firms, government institutions and the rest of the world. It covers a wide range of subjects, including microeconomics, macroeconomics, mathematics, statistics, econometrics, international economics, development economics, and public finance. Students gain a deep understanding of these subjects through a combination of theoretical lectures, empirical analysis, and case studies.

The department also offers some of these subjects as Generic Elective for students of other disciplines. Our graduates are highly sought after by leading corporations, financial institutions, government agencies, research organizations, and international bodies. The analytical and problem-solving skills acquired during their studies enable them to excel in roles such as economic and research analysts, policy researchers, financial consultants, market analysts, and data scientists.

Many of our students have been placed in big 4s, MNCs, banks, government sector and academia. One of star alumni, Ms. Nikita Jain graduated in 2016 ranked fourth in the Indian Economic Service. She presently holds the post of Assistant Director (DMEO) at Niti Aayog, another alumni Ms. Ayushi Mongia was awarded the University Gold Medal for securing first position of merit in Master of Arts (Economics), IGNOU in 2019. Our dedicated departmental association, Ecomantra, organizes seminars, workshops, guest lectures, and panel discussions, providing students with opportunities to interact with eminent economists, policymakers, and industry experts. These activities enhance students' understanding of economics beyond the classroom and enable them

to develop a well-rounded perspective on economic issues. In addition to departmental society, our students actively various inter-college participate in competitions, research conferences, and community outreach programs. These initiatives help students develop critical thinking skills, teamwork abilities, and a sense of social responsibility, preparing them to make meaningful contributions to society. Established in the year 1997, the Department of Elementary Education conducts a four year professional degree programme Bachelor of Elementary Education (B.El.Ed). B.El.Ed is an integrated course of study for training teachers particularly for the elementary school level. After four years of rigorous education in many aspects of teacher preparation the students become a professionally qualified teacher. The idea behind this programme is to integrate the study of subject knowledge, human development, teaching skills and communication skills. Hence, B.El.Ed offers both compulsory as well as optional theory courses. It has a strong focus on practicum courses. It also entails a comprehensive school internship programme in its fourth year.

A special departmental library cum resource centre is available to the students. It is well stocked with various kinds of teaching-learning resources. The B.El.Ed is a bilingual programme. Classroom teaching-learning is in both English and Hindi medium. The course material is also available in both the languages. The two essential components of this programme are the theory and practicum courses. There are 19 theory courses which the student is expected to cover during the four-year programme of study.

This includes foundation courses, core courses, pedagogy courses, liberal courses and practicum courses. Core courses offer the prospective teacher the opportunity to reconstruct concepts learnt in school and to integrate them within a multi- disciplinary perspective.



Courses in pedagogy are designed to help develop core teaching skills specific to the teaching of young children. Liberal optional courses provide students with the opportunity to study a specific discipline with academic rigour. They are designed to enrich the knowledge base to allow further study in the discipline and in the pedagogies in which students specialise. The Practicum Courses are another very important component of this programme.

These courses are designed to allow a variety of work experience with children in and outside elementary schools and opportunities for self-reflection and development. The practicum input includes: Performing and Fine Arts, Craft and Participatory Work, School-Contact Programme, Observing Children, Self-Development Workshops, Physical Education, School Internship, Projects, Tutorials and Colloquia. As per the B. El. Ed. Ordinance each candidate shall be required to attend not less than 3/4th of the lectures delivered and practicum held separately during each part of the programme. Our students are absorbed in reputed schools all across India, post the completion of this course.

The Department of English is one of the founding departments of the College, beginning in 1967, and with B.A. English (Honours) introduced in 1978. The English curriculum is impactful and rigorous, taking students through the best in world literatures. The syllabus is well-structured and relevant in its coverage of important literary texts and landmarks, and thus stands students in good stead in all future professional as well as personal endeavours. Papers range from surveys of Indian and Western classical traditions to lively and immediate contemporary authors; students will read widely in different genres including poetry, plays, novels, and acquiring critical thinking skills that will enable and empower them academically and in everyday life.

From academic year 2022-23, students can take up "major" as well as "minor" programmes of study through the department, and receive degrees at exit points in the first, second, third year if they choose to exit earlier, or fourth/final year with a dissertation on a subject of their choice. The English Department faculty is resourceful and well-networked, and includes widely-published scholars and writers. Our distinguished faculty has subject interests that span a variety of literary traditions and forms, from creative writing, early modern literatures from India and abroad, translation, gender and sexuality studies, folk and popular cultures. The Department teaches English to students of all courses, including those majoring in the Sciences, Commerce, Arts and Education streams; besides tutoring MA English students.





Department resources include the 3,000+ volume Oswal-Sena Library (apart from the College Library), which offers students access to a world of books beyond the curriculum. Students, after a four-year graduation, can go on to further studies (MA for one year, and PhD thereafter), and students who exit earlier have the option to come back to finish their studies later if they so desire. Our alumni have built careers in literary studies as researchers and careers in teaching in media and mass communication, publishing (writing, editing, translating), public relations management and also to lateral fields like social work, law, and management via masters' study in these fields.

The sound thinking and writing skills students gain are also a good foundation for competitive examinations, including those for management studies and civil services.

The Department has an exciting co-curricular calendar of varied activities, including an annual national seminar and literary festival, frequently invited lectures and interactions with eminent academicians, creative writers and media personnel; besides these, there are multiple workshops and co-curricular skill-building sessions on different themes like creative writing, editing, translation, theatre and cinema. We also have Bitacora, our literary magazine, which provides a platform for creative expression and training in editing. Our activities, such as quizzes and literary competitions, foster student creativity and understanding of their discipline.

German

German is offered as a Discipline subject in the B.A Programme Course, which means a student opts for German, will study it for the next four years. No prior knowledge of German is required. History

The History Department was set up as one of the core departments of Gargi College when it was established in 1967. Initially, History was offered at the BA Pass level (later called the BA Programme). History teaching at the Honours level commenced from 1972. Over time, History has evolved into a highly specialised discipline. Honours courses, including Indian and non – Indian histories are offered at the undergraduate level.

The History Honours syllabus pertaining to the History of India, covers a long span of time, namely Ancient, Medieval and Modern India. Similarly, the World History papers, including Social Formations and Cultural Patterns of the Ancient World, Rise of the Modern West, and History of Modern Europe among others, offer an insight into significant eras of history.



Honours students have compulsory Discipline Specific Core papers. In addition, the students need to opt for GE papers offered by other disciplines from the first to fourth semesters. Similarly, GE papers are offered by our department to students from other courses. Our faculty members have developed expertise in particular areas of Indian and World History. History discipline and discipline specific Core and Elective papers are taught to students of the BA Multidisciplinary course. Here also papers are offered from Indian as well as non-Indian History.

Several of the SEC, VAC and GE courses have a fieldwork/project component, where the students visit monuments, museums or the archives, whichever is related to the paper. The History Association was initiated by the department in the year 2006. It aims to broaden the horizons of the discipline of History and familiarise students with the emerging trends in the field of the subject. The Association organises a series of lectures, book discussions, and film screenings on pertinent subjects. Eminent historians from various national and international universities, archaeologists from apex organizations such as The Archaeological Survey of India, independent scholars and heritage experts are invited to share their perspectives with the students of the Department. Students are also encouraged to visit museums, historical sites and exhibitions across the city. Besides these solitary events, the Association organises an annual festival titled 'Antaraal' revolving around a specific theme that is considered worth some pensive research. Over the years, varied themes like the History of Delhi, Environment, Food, Religion, Region, Art History, New Histories, and Historicizing Women's Roles and Agency etc. have been taken up. Besides this, the Department also conducted historical walks, talks and discussions around various themes of Regional, National and International History. After studying History at undergraduate level, at the History department of Gargi College, the students can look forward to a more comprehensive knowledge of the historical past. This equips them to step into the professional world with a better understanding and a deeper insight.

Mathematics

The Department of Mathematics, Gargi College offers a three-year degree course, B.Sc. (Honours) Mathematics. The department comprises of fifteen faculty members with the combination of experienced seniors and dynamic young members specialised in different areas of pure and applied mathematics. The Department is also involved in inter departmental teaching through Generic Elective ,Skill enhanced and Value addition Courses offered to students of B.Sc.(Hons.) Chemistry, B.Sc.(Hons.) Physics, B.Sc. Physical Sciences, B.A.(Hons.) Economics, B.A.(Hons.) Business Economics, B.A.(Prog.), B.El.Ed., etc. The curriculum for B.Sc.(Hons.) Mathematics has been prepared by the University of Delhi keeping in mind the needs and aspirations of students of mathematics as well as the evolving nature of mathematics as a subject.

The course has a balance between pure and applied mathematics. An exceptionally broad range of topics is covered: Linear Algebra, Metric Spaces, Statistics, Linear Programming, Numerical Analysis, Mathematical Finance, Coding Theory, Mechanics and Biomathematics in the course. Through this Programme we aim at developing critical and analytical thinking among students. Most of the papers in the course are based on computer programming and simulation techniques involving real-life problems.





For this purpose, the college has a well-equipped computer lab having latest facilities along with several mathematical softwares like Wolfram Mathematica, R, Scilab, LaTeX, etc. Faculty members are involved in various research activities and their research papers get published in various Journals at National and International levels. department emphasises on empowering the students in such a way that they can opt for teaching, research or join industry after graduation. Students are made aware of various career options which would be open after studying mathematics in Education, Research, Management, Civil Services, Industry, Finance and many more. Besides the academic and curricular engagement, the Department is also actively involved in organising and participating in interdisciplinary activities too. Our association "MATHEMA" organizes seminars, lectures and competitions to nurture our students with the knowledge and skills for a successful realisation of their goals.

Microbiology

The Department of Microbiology was established in 1989 to train students not only for research in Life Sciences and allied fields but also help them find a suitable vocation in quality control and R & D sectors of food, pharmaceutical, industrial and health arena. Intensive training in biological processes places the students at the take-off stage of cutting-edge research in allied fields. The core papers offered focus on structural and physiological aspects of diverse microbes, their roles in disease causation, agriculture and industry, and studying concepts of molecular biology, recombinant DNA technology, Biosafety and Bioinformatics. The practical sessions are structured for imparting hands-on training in microscopy, biochemistry, and diverse molecular biology techniques.





After graduation students can pursue a post-graduate programme in Microbiology/ Biotechnology/ Life Sciences/ Genetics/ Molecular Virology/ Human genomics/ Water Management/ Public Health as well as related fields. The department offers a good infrastructure for conducting theory and practical sessions.

A host of wide-ranging extracurricular activities and scientific talks are arranged as an integral component of the academic curriculum under the aegis of the student's society GERMS and MASIF. Our alumni occupy places of eminence globally at various national and international institutes all over the world namely IISER Pune; Regional Centre for Biotechnology Faridabad; MD Anderson Cancer Centre Texas; Los Alamos National Laboratory etc. Apart from research institutes, students are absorbed as interns, content developers and public health executives in allied fields of public health, pharmaceuticals and life sciences. Another viable option is an MBA in Health Sciences and Master's in Hospital Management.

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Physical Education & Sports Science

The Department of Physical Education and Sports Science was established in July 1967 and offers several courses spread across the NEP curriculum. The department provides a Fitness and Wellness and Stress Management course as a Generic Elective (GE) as part of the Honours and Programme courses. This course covers both theoretical and practical aspects and is available during Semesters I and II. In the first semester, students learn about Fit India and in the second semester, they study Sports for Life as a Value Added Course. B.El.Ed 2nd Year students are taught Physical Education Practicum.

Students pursuing Honours and Programme courses can take the GE course, which covers Aerobics Training in Semester III and Fitness and Exercise Management in Semester IV, including theoretical and practical aspects. In Semester VI, Gym Operations is a GE course for Programme courses that includes both theoretical and practical aspects. Olympic Education is a GE course for Honours and Programme courses that will be taught in Semester III. Fitness and Wellness is also a GE course for Programme courses, and it is taught in Semester V.

The above GE subjects are basic level courses which can make a student eligible to pursue further specialisation in physical education if there is sports participation too. The students can also become Physical Education teachers in school or college after obtaining the required educational certifications with sports participation. A minor degree in Physical Education can be obtained if they continuously opt for Physical Education GE for seven semesters. The students can also enrol in courses which create fitness trainers and take up a job in Gyms, health clubs and fitness industry. They can also become a yoga instructor after pursuing a professional degree in yoga.

Two of our teachers Prof. vandna Luthra and Dr. Alka Garg have received esteemed "Best Performing Lecturer' award by Govt. of NCT, Delhi.

Psychology

The Department of Psychology holds the distinction of being amongst the most prestigious and popular undergraduate departments of Psychology across India. It started by offering Psychology discipline to BA program students in 1972 and inaugurated the first Applied Psychology (Hons.) Program of the University of Delhi in 1987. 

Sanskrit

The Department of Sanskrit is one of the founding departments of the College, beginning in 1967. The department offers BA honors course in Sanskrit. Since its inception, it takes pride in the diverse expertise and rich experience of its faculty members in the varied disciplines of Sanskrit and Indian intellectual tradition. The relevance of studying Sanskrit has increased in recent times and can offer students many avenues of social, intellectual and professional growth.

Zoology

The Department of Zoology Department at Gargi was established in 1967. B.Sc Zoology course allows students to understand their own evolution along with other animals. They will be able to qualitatively and quantitatively analyse evolutionary parameters using various bioinformatics and computational tools used in modern sciences. The Zoology degree program will also provide a platform to comprehend classical genetics in order to understand distribution of different traits among populations, their inheritance, ethnicity and correlate with contemporary and modern techniques like genomics, metagenomics, genome editing and molecular diagnostic tools.

Practical and theoretical skills gained in this course will be helpful in designing different public health strategies for social welfare. The course has been designed to provide in-depth knowledge of applied subjects ensuring the inculcation of employment skills so that students can make a career and become an entrepreneur in diverse fields of aquatic biology, sericulture, apiculture etc. After completion of this course, students can contribute as policy makers in wild life conservation, animal preservation and environment protection.

There are various and diversified career opportunities for students post finishing the course: They can be Animal Behaviourists, Conservationists, Wildlife Biologists, Zoo Curators, Wildlife Educators, Acamedcians, Forensic Experts, Lab technicians, and Veterinarians. The Department of Zoology endeavours to create an environment to instill creativity, teamwork, responsibility, and other values in the students apart from academics.



The Zoological Society, known as "Albatross", strives to provide students with opportunities beyond the curricula. 

UNDERGRADUATE RESEARCH

Gargi College, faculty and students are committed to research and have exerted considerable effort to enhance the College's research output and to spread the research culture. We foster interdisciplinary research collaborations and aim to establish a dynamic teaching and learning environment. Our faculty mentor students in extramural research. These projects are beyond the regular curriculum and aimed at training the students about research methodology, academic and professional writing, paper presentation at national and international conferences, and reputed peer-reviewed publications. Further, innovative research ideas are also funded by the college. Our students have won "Best Paper/Poster Awards" at numerous prestigious conferences. This exposure inspires people to pursue research and academic goals.

Bioinformatics Infrastructure Facility (BIF)

Gargi College is one of the two colleges and the only Women's college in the University of Delhi to have BIF. It has been funded by the Department Biotechnology, Govt. of India since 2008, with an annual grant for maintenance, manpower, training and other allied This facility enables expenses. undergraduate students from all science courses to do bioinformatics projects beyond their curriculum. These projects often lead to the presentation of research work at national and international conferences, which is rewarding and very motivating for the students. Implementation of interdisciplinary as well as multidisciplinary projects is especially encouraged. Under the BIF programme, workshops are conducted for students as well as faculty members to keep them updated about the advances made in this field. Besides undergraduate students, the facility has postgraduate students, trainees and Research Associates who contribute to research publications. Based research publications, Gargi College BIF was adjudged amongst the top five BIFs of undergraduate colleges.

The Gargi Pathfinder Award

The Gargi Pathfinder Award, in the Science. Commerce streams: and Humanities, has been instituted to encourage research and innovation among our students. Contestants have to submit an original project guided and certified by a faculty supervisor and supplemented with an audio-visual presentation to a panel of external judges, followed by a viva-voce. This promotes originality encourages the innovative spirit of undergraduate students. The students of the three streams put forward their ideas and, after stringent selection, encouraged to research on their topics. The award comes with a cash-cumcertificate award, one each in Humanities. Commerce and Sciences. As individuals or in teams, contestants can present original research on significant issues, innovative business proposals or new scientific experiments. 

The Women's Development Centre (WDC), called Unmukti, aims to provide a safe space for young women to embrace their potential and grow up to be strong, fearless, and respected individuals. The WDC at our college is a vibrant forum for students to address gender and sexuality-based inequality and violence. All Gargi students can access services, and membership in the core team including participation in 60 hours of activities, which includes participating in 60 hours of activities such as workshops, seminars, talks, debates, discussions, and field trips. The activities aim to explore the various gender-related aspects of legal, economic, social, and cultural issues.

Our focus is to provide academic opportunities and skills development along a variety of planes. We empower students to learn how to tackle everyday physical harassment, for example, through the Self-Defence training we provide in collaboration with other organisations, including the Delhi Police. We conduct intensive skill-building workshops on subjects like child abuse, surviving gender-based violence and abuse, police procedure, and legal redress so that students become more resourceful when faced with these challenges.


Additionally, the Centre also publishes an annual newsletter, where students can express their thoughts and opinions on pressing issues of gender through their contributions. We also offer mental health counselling three times a week with a trained psychologist. We also provide a cost-to-cost sanitary napkin vending service and a day-care facility for college members.

Besides its annual festival, the Centre offers add-on courses, workshops, and internships for academic growth beyond coursework. Our Action-based research projects like the Safety Audit provide publishable writing opportunities and help students improve their world. We encourage summer and winter internships with NGOs to develop co-curricular skills for future personal and professional ventures, including higher education in gender-core programs. Unmukti invites students to join to make a positive change in an unequal gendered world.

Our students work with a diverse team of "Gender Champions" from each department. They organize activities to promote gender equality under teacher supervision. This is a prestigious position, and many of our alumni have gone on to leadership positions in law, science, and government.





STUDENT MENTORING PROGRAM

The primary purpose of this programme is to assist students with any issues they may have during their time in college and beyond. Students are encouraged to ask questions and receive help in highly personalized conversations. The college is dedicated to helping its students adjust to the real world, and that commitment extends to both first-year and senior students.



ON CAMPUS MENTAL HEALTH SUPPORT

The college has a dedicated counsellor to cater to the mental health needs of our students. The students can book the appointment through our website. Apart from this, every student is assigned to a teacher mentor to discuss day-to-day issues and challenges faced by them. We also have peer support available to our students in the form of Izhaar (Initiative of the Psychology Department) and Saarthi (Initiative of the Department of Physical Education and Sports). Additionally, we have a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) signed with IBHAS that helps us in organizing workshops, lectures etc., on mental health issues. The trained members of the Department of Psychology also extend support by providing pro-bono counselling to its students as and when required. At a preventive level the college has also initiated the Centre for Wellbeing, which has planned activities to help students maximize their potential and have a balanced approach to making healthier life choices.

ADMISSION GRIEVANCE COMMITTEE

PROCTORIAL COMMITTEE

- Using mobile phones in academic areas (such as lecture rooms, corridors, and the library)
- Misusing college ID cards
- Any other actions that are deemed as acts of indiscipline by the competent authority should also be avoided.

INTERNAL COMPLAINT COMMITTEE

An Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) constituted at Gargi College is responsible for the implementation of the policy against sexual harassment. The committee takes complaints of sexual harassment seriously and conducts investigations, provides support and solutions to victims, recommends penalties, and acts against offenders if necessary. If the ICC establishes a prima facie case of sexual harassment, it will set up an inquiry committee to prepare and submit a report. The committee is committed to maintaining confidentiality throughout the investigation. Once the report is finalized, the complainant's name and other identifying details will be withheld if requested. Based on the report's findings, appropriate disciplinary action will be taken against the offender. The Annexure at the end of this Prospectus contains the Act's sections detailing sexual harassment and the penalties for those found guilty. It is essential for all students to read and understand these sections.



GENERAL RULES @ GARGI

ATTENDANCE CRITERIA

Attendance at Gargi College is an absolute requirement to qualify for semester/annual exams as per the University of Delhi's regulations. Admission seekers and their guardians are strongly urged to take note of this policy. It is mandatory for students to attend a minimum of two-thirds of all lectures delivered at the College during each semester of the academic year. It is imperative to note that this requirement applies to all subjects, tutorials, and practicals.

Students with attendance issues will receive letters, and a committee will review their situation and decide whether or not to detain them. The Principal shall have power to strike off the name of a student who is grossly irregular in attendance in spite of warning, or when the absence of the student is for such a long period that she cannot put in requisite percentage of attendance.

Regular attendance in lectures and tutorials is important and will be rewarded with a 5% weightage.

The credit for regularity in each paper will be determined as follows:

- 1 mark for attendance between 67% and less than 70%
- 2 marks for attendance between 70% and less than 75%
- 3 marks for attendance between 75% and less than 80%
- 4 marks for attendance between 80% and less than 85%
- 5 marks for attendance of 85% or more.



IDENTITY CARD

An identity card detailing name, address and phone number is issued to each student immediately after admission. It is mandatory for students to carry their identity cards with them every day while attending college, as well as when using the library. Failure to produce the identity card may result in disciplinary action. If the identity card is lost, students must inform the college and provide a copy of the FIR (First Information Report) filed with the police. The identity card remains the property of the college and must be produced or submitted upon request by any college or security staff. In the event of a lost card, a duplicate will be issued after completing the necessary formalities.

NOTICE BOARDS & COLLEGE WEBSITE

Important information about class schedules, exams, attendance, holidays, activities, fellowships, scholarships, and more are regularly posted on the College notice boards and website (https://gargicollege.in/). Students are expected to check these sources frequently to stay informed about events happening at the College. Please note that failing to read a notice will not be considered a valid excuse for noncompliance or delays in any matter.

CONTACT INFORMATION

It is mandatory that any change in residential (Permanent/Local) address or/and phone number is communicated to the office immediately, in writing, duly signed by the parent/guardian. This is a regulation that must be followed to ensure that the College has the correct information. The College cannot be held responsible for any issues that may arise due to non-intimation, such as papers reaching the wrong address or the College not having the correct phone number.

RELEVANT UNIVERSITY ORDINANCES

MAINTENANCE OF DISCIPLINE AMONG STUDENTS

Ord. XV-B. Maintenance of Discipline among Students of the University

- 1. All powers relating to discipline and disciplinary action are vested in the Vice-Chancellor.
- 2. The Vice-Chancellor may delegate all or such powers as he/she deems proper to the Proctor and to such other persons as he/she may specify in this behalf.
- 3. Without prejudice to the generality of power to enforce discipline under the Ordinance, the following shall amount to acts of gross indiscipline: (a) physical assault, or threat to use physical force, against any member of the teaching and non-teaching staff of any Institution/Department and against any student within the University of Delhi; (b) carrying of, use of, or threat to use of any weapons; (c) any violation of the provisions of the Civil Rights Protection Act, 1976; (d) violation of the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to the scheduled castes and tribes; (e) any practice-whether verbal or otherwise-derogatory of women; (f) any attempt at bribing or corruption in any manner; (g) wilful destruction of institutional property; (h) creating ill-will or intolerance on religious or communal grounds; (i) causing disruption in any manner of the academic functioning of the University system; (j) ragging as per Ordinance XV-C.
- 4. Without prejudice to the generality of his/her powers relating to the maintenance of discipline and taking such action in the interest of maintaining discipline as may seem to him/her appropriate, the Vice-Chancellor, may in the exercise of his/her powers aforesaid order or direct that any student or students (a) a.be expelled; or (b) be, for a stated period rusticated; or (c) be not for a stated period, admitted to a course or courses of study in a College, Department or Institution of the University; or (d) be fined with a sum of rupees that may be specified; or (e) be debarred from taking a University or College or Departmental Examination or Examinations for one or more years; or (f) that the result of the student or students concerned in the Examination or Examinations in which he/she or they have appeared be cancelled.
- 5. The Principals of the Colleges, Heads of the Halls, Deans of Faculties, Heads of Teaching Departments in the University, the Principal, School of Open Learning and Librarians shall have the authority to exercise all such disciplinary powers over students in their respective Colleges, Institutions, Faculties and Teaching Departments in the University as may be necessary for the proper conduct of the Institutions, Halls and teaching in the concerned Departments. They may exercise their authority through, or delegate authority to such of the teachers in their Colleges, Institutions or Departments as they may specify for these purposes.
- 6. Without prejudice to the powers of the Vice-Chancellor and the Proctoras aforesaid, detailed rules of discipline and proper conductshall be framed. These rules may be supplemented, where necessary, by the Principals of Colleges, Heads of Halls, Deans of Faculties and Heads of Teaching Departments in this University. Each student shallbe expected providehimself/herself with a copy of these rules. At the time of admission, every student shall be required to sign a declaration that on admission he/she submits himself/herself to the disciplinary jurisdiction of the Vice-Chancellor and several authorities of the University who may be vested with the authority to exercise discipline under the Acts, the Statutes, the Ordinances and the rules that have been framed therein by the University.

Ord. XV - C. Prohibition of and Punishment for Ragging

- 1. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited, within the premises of College/Department or Institution and any part of Delhi University system as well as on public transport.
- 2. Any individual or collective act or practice of ragging constitutes gross indiscipline and shall be dealt with under this Ordinance.
- 3. Ragging for the purposes of this Ordinance, ordinarily meansany act, conductor practice by which dominant power or status of senior students is brought to bear on students freshly enrolled or students who are in any way considered junior or inferior by other students; and includes individual or collective acts or practices which -(a) involve physical assault or threat to use of physical force; (b) violate the status, dignity and honour of women students; (c)violate the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to the scheduled caste and tribe; (d) expose students to ridicule and contempt and affect their self-esteem; (e) entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures and obscene behavior.
- 4. The Principal of a College, the Head of the Department or an Institution, the authorities of College, or University Hostel or Halls of Residence shall take immediate action on any information of the occurrence of ragging.
- 5. Notwithstanding anything in Clause (4) above, the Proctor may also suo moto enquire into any incident of ragging and make a report to the Vice-Chancellor of the identity of those who have engaged in ragging and the nature of the incident.
- 6. The Proctor may also submit an initial report establishing the identity of the perpetrators of ragging and the nature of the ragging incident.
- 7. If the Principal of a College or Head of the Department or Institution or the Proctor is satisfied that for some reason, to be recorded in writing, it is not reasonably practical to hold such an enquiry, he/she may so advise the Vice-Chancellor accordingly.
- 8. When the Vice-Chancellor is satisfied that it is not expedient to hold such an enquiry, his/her decision shall be final.
- 9.On the receipt of a report under Clause (5) or (6) or a determination by the relevant authority under clause (7) disclosing the occurrence of ragging incidents described in Clause 3(a), (b) and (c), the Vice-Chancellor shall direct or order rustication of a studentor students for a specific number of years.
- 10. The Vice-chancellor may in other cases of ragging order or direct that any student or students be expelled or be not for a stated period, admitted to a course of study in a college, departmental examination for one or more years or that the results of the student or students concerned in the examination or examinations in which they appeared be cancelled.
- 11. In case any students who have obtained degrees or diplomas of Delhi University are found guilty; under this Ordinance, appropriate action will be taken under Statute15 for withdrawal of degrees or diploma conferred by the University.
- 12. For the purpose of this Ordinance, abetment to ragging whether by way of any act, practice or incitement of ragging will also amount to ragging.
- 13.All Institutions within the Delhi University system shall be obligated to carry out instructions/ directionsissued under this Ordinance, and to give aid assistance to the Vice-Chancellor to achieve the effective implementation of the Ordinance.

Where incident(s) of ragging are reported to the Vice-Chancellor by any authority under this Ordinance, the students(s) involved in ragging, shall be expelled for a specified term, designated in the order. Non-students involved in reports of ragging will be proceeded with under the criminal law of India; they will also be rendered ineligible for a period of five years from seeking enrolment in any of the institutions of the University of Delhi. Students against whom necessary action is taken under this note, will be given post decisional hearing, with strict adherence to the rules of natural justice.

ORDINANCE XV-D Sexual Harassment

Following the implementation of the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013 and its notification by the Government of India, the University of Delhi released a notification (No. Estab.II(1)/27/ACC/2006/) on January 9, 2014. declaring that the provisions of the Act supersede University Ordinance XV-D. Additionally, through its Notification No. Estab.II(i)/027/ACC/2006 dated January 16, 2014, the University of Delhi established its own Internal Complaints Committee, as required by the Act. The University directed all colleges and institutions under its jurisdiction to form their own Internal Complaints Committees.

As per the 2013 Act, the University of Delhi is dedicated to upholding a safe and respectful academic and work environment that is free from any form of sexual harassment for all its students, academic staff, and non-teaching staff.

Sexual Harassment shall include, but will not be confined to, the following:

- When submission to unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favours, and verbal or physical conduct of a sexual nature are made, either implicitly or explicitly, a ground for any decision relating to employment, academic performance, extracurricular activities, or entitlement to services or opportunities at University of Delhi.
- When unwelcome sexual advances, verbal and non-verbal and/or physical conduct such as loaded comments, remarks or jokes, letters, phone calls or e-mails, gestures, exhibition of pornography, lurid stares, physical contact, stalking, sounds or display of a derogatory nature that have the purpose and/or effect of interfering with an individual's performance or of creating an intimidating, hostile or offensive environment.
- When a person uses, with a sexual purpose, the body or any part of it or any object as an extension of the body in relation to another person without the latter's consent or against the person's will, such conduct will amount to sexual assault.
- When deprecatory comments, conduct, or any such behavior is based on the gender identity/sexual orientation of the person and/or when the classroom or other public forum of the University is used to denigrate/discriminate against a person or create a hostile environment on the basis of a person's gender identity/sexual orientation.
