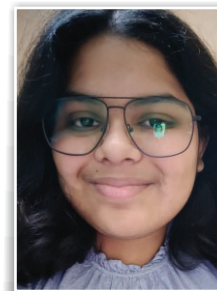

Admission Schedule & Information About Common Seat Allocation System (CSAS-2022)

- Admission to all UG Programs of UoD for the Academic Session 2022-23 will be through CSAS-2022, based on the eligibility requirements stated in UG BOI-2022 and other rules as published by the University of Delhi on its website.
- An online platform at www.admission.uod.ac.in will be made available for seeking admission through CSAS-2022. Candidates seeking admission to UoD must fill the CSAS-2022 Application Form online through this platform only. There will be no offline filling of the CSAS-2022 Application Form.
- Candidate must have passed Class XII or its equivalent from a single recognized board.
- A candidate applying to CSAS-2022 must have appeared in CUET(UG) - 2022, conducted by NTA.
- Candidate must have appeared in CUET(UG) - 2022 in only those subjects in which s(he) has passed Class XII.
- The candidate is advised to check whether he/she satisfies all eligibility criteria for the Program(s) for which he/she is applying and has appeared in CUET(UG) - 2022 in the relevant Subjects/Test papers fulfilling the Program-Specific eligibility published in the UG BOI-2022 (http://du.ac.in/uploads/newweb/21042022_BOI-UG.pdf). If a candidate has applied in CSAS-2022 but doesn't fulfill the eligibility criteria of any Program offered by UoD, his/her candidature will not be considered.
- Suppose a candidate did not appear or was absent in a Subject/Test Paper which is mandatorily required for meeting the eligibility criteria of a particular Program, in that case, he/she will not be eligible for admission to that particular Program.
- If all the documents are found to be in order and the eligibility criteria are met by the candidate, the Allocated Seat will be provisionally approved by the College. In that case, the candidate will have to take the admission on the approved allocated seat by paying the admission fee within the stipulated time.

The Common Seat Allocation System 2022 is divided in Three Phases:

PHASE I : Applying to University of Delhi (September 12, 2022)

PHASE II : Filling The Preferences for Programs and Colleges (September 26, 2022 to October 10, 2022)

PHASE III : Allocation-cum-admission

Phase I of Common Seat Allocation System 2022 commenced on September 12, 2022. Phase II of CSAS 2022, wherein the candidate will provide preferences for Programs and Colleges, will be from Monday September 26, 2022 to Monday October 10, 2022. Both Phase I and Phase II of CSAS (UG) 2022 shall remain open till Monday October 10, 2022.

The Program-Specific merit score shall be auto-calculated by the University as per the eligibility criteria, and the candidate will have to confirm his/ her scores before making the preferences.

After the closure of the Preference-Filling Phase, the University will release a Simulated List of tentative allocations based on the CSAS 2022 Allocation Policy. Henceforth, a two-day window will be provided to the candidates to reorder their Program + College preferences. The date of declaration of first list of admissions shall be notified by 10th October 2022.

Seat Allocation and Admission

Step 1 - Acceptance of the Provisionally Allocated Seat

- It is the responsibility of the candidate to login to the dashboard and check if a seat is allocated in a given round of seat allocation, and if allocated she must complete all admission formalities.
- Once a seat has been allocated in a particular round, the candidate must 'Accept' the Allocated Seat before the last date/time specified for the given allocation round. The provision for acceptance of a particular Allocated Seat will be valid only for the round in which the seat was allocated to the candidate.
- In case a candidate is offered multiple seats in a particular round, she must "Accept" ONE Allocated seat ONLY. Inactivity/no-action will be taken as non-acceptance to the Allocated Seat. It will be treated as a decline to the provisionally Allocated Seat and the candidate will no longer be able to participate in subsequent rounds of CSAS-2022.

Step 2(a) - Online Approval by the College

Once the candidate "Accept" the provisionally Allocated Seat, the concerned College will check the eligibility and documents uploaded by the candidate. The College will verify the following within the stipulated timeline:

1. Minimum Eligibility of the Candidate.
2. Program-Specific Eligibility of the Candidate.
3. Subject Mapping: UoD will consider only those CUET subjects in which she has passed Class XII.
4. Validity and authenticity of Documents/Certificates submitted by the Candidate.

During the online approval process, if a college seeks more clarity/information from the candidate, it may raise a query to the Candidate (refer to step 2b).

After verification, the College will either 'Approve' or 'Reject' the provisionally Allocated Seat of the candidate.

No application will be left unattended by the Colleges.

In Case of Approval:

Once the College accords the approval, the candidate will have to pay the 'Admission Fee'.

In Case of Rejection:

At the time of online verification, if an application gets rejected, the College will state the reason for rejection.

For rejecting an application, the College will indicate any of the following reason/s:

1. Non-fulfillment of the Minimum Eligibility by the Candidate.

2. Not-fulfillment of Program-Specific Eligibility by the Candidate.
3. Non-fulfillment of the subject-mapping criteria.
4. Invalid documents/certificates submitted by the candidate.
5. Failure to respond to the query(ies) raised by the College within the stipulated time.

Step 2(b) - Respond to Queries (if any) during College Approvals

During the online approval process, if a College raises a query(ies) then the candidate must respond online (through the candidate's dashboard) within the stipulated time. Failure to respond to the query(ies) will lead to rejection of the Allocated Seat and the candidate will be out of CSAS-2022.

Step 3 - Admission to the Provisionally Allocated Seat

After the College approves, the candidate will have to pay the Admission Fee for the approved seat. The admission process will be treated as complete only after successful payment of the admission fee. If a candidate fails to pay the admission fee within the stipulated time, it will be considered as a cancellation of the provisionally Allocated Seat. The Allocated Seat shall be forfeited and the candidate will not be considered for any subsequent CSAS-2022 allocation rounds. The candidate will forfeit all the rights of the allocated seat and will not be considered for any subsequent CSAS-2022 allocation rounds.

Subsequent Rounds of Allocation

Option 1 - Upgrade

All candidates who have applied for CSAS-2022 will be eligible for all allocation rounds, except those whose allocated seat/admission has been cancelled for whatever reason. All admitted candidates who opt for the "Upgrade" option in a particular round will be considered for respective CSAS-2022 allocation round, subject to the availability of seats.

Candidates who were allocated their first preference in any round will not be considered in subsequent rounds of allocation.

Before the announcement of a round, the University will open an "Upgrade" Window for all admitted candidates.

An admitted candidate can select the 'Upgrade' option, which will allow upgradation to a higher preference submitted by the candidate. Admitted candidates who opt for upgradation will automatically be upgraded based on the allocation policy.

Choosing the option 'Upgrade' will mean that the candidate consents to consideration of an offer of admission to a Program + College Combination of his/her higher preference in the subsequent round (if any). Her current admitted seat will be auto cancelled if new preference/s is/are allocated.

A candidate who opts for 'Upgrade' can also reorder the Program + College Combinations that were higher in preference than the allocated one.

The Program + College Combination in which she had taken an admission earlier will never be offered to the candidate in any subsequent round. Similarly, the Program + College combinations which were below in the preference order at which the candidate had taken an admission earlier will never be offered again to the candidate in any subsequent round.

The upgrade option will not be available for the candidate who was allocated her first preference.

It will be the responsibility of the candidate to keep checking for 'Upgrade' options in all rounds of seat allocations. Failure/inability to participate in the upgradation process will not be considered a grievance in any circumstance.

A candidate who gets upgraded will have to 'Accept' the upgraded seat and complete the admission procedures on the upgraded Allocated Seat/s. If a candidate does not do any activity on the upgraded seat/s, it will, by default, be considered cancelled and the candidate will be out of CSAS-2022.

In case, a candidate does not get upgraded, her admission to the earlier seat will be retained.

Option 2 - Freeze

A candidate who has taken admission on an Allocated Seat and desires to continue with it should submit a 'Freeze' request through her dashboard. On selecting 'Freeze', such a candidate will never be allowed to opt for "Upgradation."

If an admitted candidate neither opts for upgradation nor opts for Freeze, and remains inactive for a round, the admission taken by her will be retained and she will not be considered for upgradation.

Cancellation of Provisionally Allocated Seat/admission

1. Failure to 'Accept' the provisionally Allocated Seat within the stipulated timeline will lead to the cancellation of the Allocated Seat.
2. The provisionally Allocated Seat will be cancelled if a candidate fails to pay the Admission fees within the stipulated time.
3. The provisionally Allocated Seat/Admission will be cancelled if, at any time, any of the document(s)/certificate(s) is/are found to be invalid/fraudulent.
4. The provisionally Allocated Seat/Admission will be cancelled if, at any time, it is found that a candidate does not meet the Minimum Eligibility Criteria as declared by UoD.

A candidate whose provisionally allocated seat/admission is cancelled due to the above-mentioned reasons will forfeit the right to seek admission to UoD through CSAS-2022.

Withdrawal of Admission

A candidate who has taken an admission but wishes to withdraw can do so through her dashboard by selecting the 'Withdraw' option and paying a withdrawal fee of Rs. 1000.00 (non-refundable).

A candidate who withdraws her admission will be out of CSAS-2022. She will forfeit her eligibility for admission to UG Programs of UoD. No further participation in any of the subsequent allocation rounds (if any) will be allowed.

There will be no option to withdraw the admission once the Spot Admission round is announced.

Mid-Entry

Candidates who failed to apply for CSAS-2022 within the stipulated time and are desirous of participating in CSAS-2022 can participate through the Mid-Entry window (whenever University announces it), by paying a Mid-Entry fee of Rs. 1000.00 (non-refundable).

A candidate who makes a Mid-Entry may be considered for allocation only after all the candidates who had applied earlier and have the merit score/s higher than the lowest declared score have been given allocated.

It will be mandatory for the Mid-Entrant to take admission on the seat allocated to her, if offered. Failure to accept the allocated seat will forfeit the candidate's admission to UoD. There will be no option of 'Upgrade'.

Mid-Entry will not be allowed for ECA & Sports Supernumerary Quota.

Spot Admissions

After the completion of regular CSAS-2022 rounds, if seats remain vacant, UoD may announce Spot round/s of admission.

Candidates who applied for CSAS-2022 but were not admitted to any College on the date of declaration of the Spot Admission round can participate in Spot Admissions.

On the announcement of Spot Admission, the admission of all already candidates will be locked and they will not be considered for upgrades. Similarly, the admitted candidates will not be allowed to withdraw their admissions.

To be considered in a Spot Admission round, the candidate will have to opt for 'Spot Admission' through her dashboard.

For every Spot Admission round the University will display the vacant seats of each Program. A desirous candidate will be able to select ONLY ONE Program.

It will be mandatory for the candidate to take admission to the seat allocated in a Spot round. Failure to accept the allocated seat in the Spot Admission round will forfeit the candidate's eligibility for admission to UoD and she will be out of CSAS.

There will be no option of 'Upgrade' and 'Withdraw' during the Spot Admission rounds. The seat allocated in a particular Spot Admission round will be final and will not be upgraded in any subsequent round of Spot Admission rounds.

Mandatory Requirement of Physical Verification of Original Documents

At the conclusion of CSAS-2022, all admitted candidates would have to report to the admitted College and complete all the admission formalities of the concerned College, including physical verification of the documents/certificates.

Admission of a candidate is purely provisional and is subject to verification of original documents by the respective College. The College will recheck all the documents/certificates. During physical verification, if

any document/certificate is found inadequate/ insufficient/ inappropriate, it will lead to cancellation of the admission, ipso facto. Further, such a candidate will forfeit the opportunity for admission to any UG Program of UoD for the Academic Session 2022-23.

Admission Grievance Redressal

Level 1 - College Grievance Redressal Committee

Every College will establish a Grievance Redressal Committee to redress grievances that may arise during admission. In addition, a Sub-Committee of Grievance Redressal for redressing the grievances of candidates belonging to SC/ST/OBC/EWS/Minority and PwBD categories will also be established. The details of the College Grievance Redressal Committee and the Sub-Committee will be displayed on the website of the College and on the admission website of UoD to facilitate and address the needs/queries of candidates within the stipulated time. Candidates having grievances about admission should first approach the Grievance Redressal Committee of the concerned College.

Level 2 - Central Grievance Redressal Committee

If grievance/s is/are not resolved within a reasonable time by the College, then candidates may approach the Central Grievance Redressal Committee of UoD. This Committee will resolve allocation and admission-related issues of candidates. The details of the Central Grievance Redressal Committee will be displayed on the admission website of UoD.

If a grievance is found relevant and genuine, and if seats in a specific Program + College combination have been filled, then such a candidate will be offered a supernumerary seat. The decision(s) by the concerned authorities with regard to grievances shall be final and binding.

Admission grievances related to NCWEB, ECA, Sports supernumerary quota, and CW will be redressed by the respective committees of UoD.

B.A. (Hons.) English

This course is designed to help students define/critique the category of Literature; and understand the emergence of literary studies, textuality, and the canon. This course aims to contest and demystify pre-conceived notions of literature as mimetic representations, underline literature as part of cultural production, firmly embedded in historical specificity, develop language skills in an integrated way through an intense engagement with the prescribed texts and give the learners hands-on practice in the use of these skills.

Eligibility for Admission in B.A. (Hons.) English

- Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:
- English from List A + Any two subjects from List B1 + Any one subject from either List B1 or List B2
- Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtained from the above-mentioned combination of subjects.

B.A. (Hons.) Hindi

This course familiarizes the students of Hindi with a wider understanding of the ability of the language, as well as develops the ability to connect them in the context of the challenges of society locally as well as globally. It is also developing a new understanding of Hindi literature and practicality of the language and professional competence.

Eligibility for Admission in B.A. (Hons.) Hindi

- Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:
- Hindi from List A+ Any two subjects from List B1+ Any one subject from either List B1 or List B2
- Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtained from the above-mentioned combination of subjects.

B.A. (Hons.) Sanskrit

This program aims at getting the students acquainted with the general outlines of Classical Sanskrit Literature (Poetry) through classical texts, develop a fair idea of the works of great Sanskrit poets, appreciate the styles and thoughts of individual poets focussing on the poetical, artistic, cultural and historical aspects of their works. This program will enhance competence in chaste classical Sanskrit and give them skills in translation and interpretation of poetic works.

Eligibility for Admission in B.A. (Hons.) Sanskrit

Candidates must appear in CUET in any of the following subject combinations:

Combination I : Any one Language from List A + Sanskrit from List B1 + Any two subjects out of which one should be from List B1

OR

Combination II: Any one Language from List A + Sanskrit from List A + Any two subjects out of which one should be from List B1

OR

Combination III: Sanskrit from List A + Any three subjects out of which at least two should be from List B1

OR

Combination IV: Any one Language from List A + Any two subjects from List B1 + Any one subject from either List B1 or List B2

Merit will be based on the best CUET score obtained from any of the above-mentioned combinations of subjects. Candidates who opted for Combination IV for admission will be considered only if seats remain vacant after considering all the candidates who opted for Combination I/II/III

B.A. (Hons.) Applied Psychology

The program is to make the students develop an awareness and understanding of the contemporary trends and growth in Applied Psychology. This will be substantiated by enabling students to learn relevant academic and professional skills through training and self-reflections in the discipline of psychology. This program has been framed to maintain the teaching standards, assessment of students and keep the interface of psychology individual/community for the human welfare at the forefront. The course has been developed keeping in mind the current realities of the discipline, including the socio-cultural context. The reach to different psychology fields has been made by incorporating different papers, viz. Social Psychology, Developmental Psychology, Systems in Psychology, Understanding Psychological Disorders, Counselling Psychology, Industrial/Organizational Behaviour, Health Psychology and others.

Eligibility for Admission in B.A. (Hons.) Applied Psychologyam Specific Eligibility

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

- Any one Language from List A + Any two subjects from List B1 + Any one subject from either List B1 or List B2.
- Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtained from the above-mentioned combination of subjects.

B.A. (Hons.) Economics

The B.A. (Hons.) Economics curriculum offers a rigorous basis for much of the advanced thinking in the Economics discipline. It provides the student with a logical paradigm for conceptualising and interpreting the behaviour and interactions of households, firms, and government institutions. The curriculum allows students to choose elective courses from a set of courses with contemporary relevance, thereby offering students the flexibility to prepare for careers in academia, law, management, journalism, government, and many other fields. The programme is consistent with global standards in the Economics discipline. It offers training comparable to that of an undergraduate student at the world's best universities.

Eligibility for Admission in B.A. (Hons.) Economics

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

- Any one Language from List A + Mathematics + Any two subjects out of which one should be from List B1
- Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtained from the above-mentioned combination of subjects.

B.A. (Hons.) History

The course offers to inculcate the graduate attributes such as well-being, emotional stability, critical thinking, social justice, and employability skills. B.A. History (Hons.) offers students access to recent historiography in the field organized in a pedagogical form that is accessible and interesting. It is structured for students in an interdisciplinary program, providing them with a concise and thorough introduction to the discipline of History and remaining sensitive to the cognate discipline that they are also studying. It seeks to provide multiple points of intersection with disciplines in the Humanities and the Social Sciences to open communication modes by which a historical sensibility can be an enriching experience.

Eligibility for Admission in B.A. (Hons.) History

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

- Any one Language from List A + Any two subjects from List B1 + Any one subject from either List B1 or List B2
- Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtained from the above-mentioned combination of subjects.

B.A. (Hons.) Philosophy

The BA (Hons.) Philosophy program is an attempt to introduce and provide an in-depth look into one of the most challenging subjects that one can study. It introduces the student to the great philosophers and their ideas and how one thinks about contemporary problems through the lens of their theories. It gives a comprehensive sweep of Indian and Western philosophy and makes students aware of the main currents of thought in Ethics. Students also explore Philosophy of Science, Logic, Feminism and Bio-ethics, amongst many other core and optional papers. The core idea is to make the students aware of the foundational issues related to the world around us, whether in our life, or regarding mind and matter, or existence, or belief, or religion or science.

Eligibility for Admission in B.A. (Hons.) Philosophy

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

- Any one Language from List A + Any two subjects from List B1 + Any one subject from either List B1 or List B2
- Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtained from the above-mentioned combination of subjects.

B.A. (Hons.) Political Science

This program aims to expose the students to the manner in which the questions of politics have been posed that have implications for more critical questions of thought and existence in society and is being solved. By introducing the philosophers from different traditions, students can answer a few fundamental political questions: Why do we live in political communities? What is the 'best' form of government? How human nature influences political decision making?

How and in what circumstances do we need to resist bad rulers? By the end of the course, students are able to understand the idea of modernity and establish a connection between societal changes posed through modernity and its prescribed political suggestions.

Eligibility for Admission in B.A. (Hons.) Political Science

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

- Any one Language from List A + Any two subjects from List B1 + Any one subject from either List B1 or List B2
- Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtained from the above-mentioned combination of subjects.

B.A. (Program)

B.A. (Program) offers a wide range of subject combinations to attract students to graduate in the subjects of his/her likeness. Colleges offer a range of combinations from which a student may choose the subjects in which he/she may like to pursue his/her further studies. The University of Delhi offers more than 180 BA (Program) Combinations, thereby offering an amalgamation of different subjects.

Eligibility for Admission in B.A. (Program)

Candidates must appear in CUET in any of the following subject combinations:

- **Combination I:** Any one Language from List A + Any two subjects from List B1 + Any one subject from either List B1 or List B2

OR

- **Combination II:** Any one language from List A + Any one subject from either List B1 or List B2 + SECTION III of CUET (General Test)
- Merit will be based on the best CUET score obtained from any of the above-mentioned combinations of subjects.

Note: As the weightage of the CUET Sections is not the same, appropriate proration will be done.

B.Sc. (Hons.) Botany

The B.Sc. (Hons.) Botany curriculum offers the essential knowledge and technical skills to study plants holistically. Students would be trained in all areas of plant biology using a unique combination of core and elective papers with significant interdisciplinary components. Students would be exposed to cutting-edge technologies currently used in the study of plant life forms, their evolution and interactions with other organisms within the ecosystem. Students would also become aware of the social and environmental significance of plants and their relevance to the national economy.

Eligibility for Admission in B.Sc. (Hons.) Botany

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

- Physics + Chemistry + Biology/Biological Studies/ Biotechnology/ Biochemistry
- Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtained from the above-mentioned combination of subjects.
- Candidates must have obtained a minimum of 30% score in any one language of List A in CUET.

B.Sc. (Hons.) Zoology

Through this course, the students will be more equipped to learn and know about different human systems, their coordination and control. The Zoology degree program provides a platform to comprehend classical genetics to understand the distribution of other traits among populations, their inheritance, ethnicity and correlate with contemporary and modern techniques like genomics, metagenomics, genome editing and molecular diagnostic tools. This course's practical and theoretical skills will help design different public health strategies for social welfare. The course has been designed to provide in-depth knowledge of applied subjects ensuring the inculcation of employment skills so that students can make a career and become entrepreneurs in diverse fields of aquatic biology, sericulture, apiculture etc. After completing this course, students can contribute as policymakers in wildlife conservation, animal preservation and environment protection.

Eligibility for Admission in B.Sc. (Hons.) Zoology

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

- Physics + Chemistry + Biology/Biological Studies/ Biotechnology/ Biochemistry
- Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtained from the above-mentioned combination of subjects.
- Candidates must have obtained a minimum of 30% score in any one language of List A in CUET.

B.Sc. (Hons.) Chemistry

The BSc (Hons.) Chemistry curriculum offers courses in inorganic, organic, physical, materials and analytical. The courses will train students with sound theoretical and experimental knowledge that suits the need of academics and industry. The courses also offer ample skills to pursue research as a career in chemistry and allied areas. This program is offered by one of the largest and oldest Departments in the country to produce the best minds to meet the demands of society. The University of Delhi hopes that the programme BSc (Hons.) Chemistry will help students make an informed decision regarding the goals they wish to pursue in further education and life.

Eligibility for Admission in B.Sc. (Hons.) Chemistry

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

- Physics + Chemistry + Mathematics
- Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtained from the above-mentioned combination of subjects.
- Candidates must have obtained a minimum of 30% score in any one language of List A in CUET.

B.Sc. (Hons.) Physics

Physics is an experimental and theoretical science that systematically studies the laws of nature operating at length scales from the sub-atomic domains to the entire universe. The core areas of study within the disciplinary/subject area of the B.Sc. (Hons.) Physics program are: Classical and Quantum Mechanics, Electricity and Magnetism, Thermal and Statistical Physics, Wave theory and Optics, Physics of the Materials, Digital Electronics, and specialized methods of Mathematical Physics and their applications in different branches of the subject. Along with the theoretical course work, students also learn physics

laboratory methods for different branches of physics, specialized measurement techniques, analysis of observational data, including error estimation, and scientific report writing. The latest addition to Physics pedagogy is computational physics, which involves adapting Physics problems for algorithmic solutions and modelling and simulation of physical phenomena.

Eligibility for Admission in B.Sc. (Hons.) Physics

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

- Physics + Chemistry + Mathematics
- Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtained from the above-mentioned combination of subjects.
- Candidates must have obtained a minimum of 30% score in any one language of List A in CUET.

B.Sc. (Hons.) Mathematics

The B.Sc. (Hons.) Mathematics program aims at developing the ability to think critically, logically, and analytically and hence use mathematical reasoning in everyday life. Pursuing a degree in mathematics will introduce the students to several interesting and valuable ideas in preparation for several mathematics careers in education, research, government sector, business sector and industry. The B.Sc. (Hons.) Mathematics program covers the full range of mathematics, from classical Calculus to Modern Cryptography, Information Theory, and Network Security. The course lays a structured foundation of Calculus, Real & Complex analysis, Abstract Algebra, Differential Equations (including Mathematical Modelling), Number Theory, Graph Theory, and C++ Programming exclusively for Mathematics.

Eligibility for Admission in B.Sc. (Hons.) Mathematics

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

- Any one language from List A + Mathematics + Any two subjects out of which one should be from List B1
- Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtained from the above-mentioned combination of subjects.

B.Sc. (Hons.) Microbiology

The B.Sc. (Honours) Microbiology program covers a wide range of basic and applied microbiology courses and courses of interdisciplinary nature. The core courses that are a part of the program are designed to build a strong microbiology knowledge base in the student and acquaints them with the applied aspects of this fascinating discipline. The student is thus equipped to pursue higher studies in an institution of her/his choice and apply the skills learned in the program to solve practical societal problems.

Eligibility for Admission in B.Sc. (Hons.) Microbiology

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

- Physics + Chemistry + Biology/ Biological Studies/ Biotechnology/ Biochemistry
- Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtained from the above-mentioned combination of subjects.
- Candidates must have obtained a minimum of 30% score in any one language of List A in CUET.

B.Sc. (Prog.) Physical Science with Chemistry

This course aims to make students aware of the SI Units, concentration terms, various analytical methods, types of errors in chemical analysis, statistical tests of data, and safe usage of chemicals and their waste.

Eligibility for Admission in B.Sc. (Prog.) Physical Science with Chemistry

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

- Physics + Mathematics + Chemistry
- Merit will be based on the CUET score obtained from the above-mentioned combination of subjects.
- Candidates must have obtained a minimum of 30% score in any one language of List A in CUET.

B.Sc. (Prog.) Life Science

This program will offer students to acquire comprehensive knowledge of disciplinary subjects along with allied subjects of biological sciences, which will help students to understand and appreciate the diversity of life processes existing in the world as well as their evolutionary aspects. In addition, the course will develop the skills to handle research equipment and computational tools like genomics, meta genetics and gain knowledge in designing holistic public health strategies for social welfare.

Eligibility for Admission in B.Sc. (Prog.) Life Science

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

- Chemistry + Physics + Biology / Biological Studies / Biotechnology
- Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtained from the above-mentioned combination of subjects.
- Candidates must have obtained a minimum of 30% score in any one language of List A in CUET.

B.Com. (Hons.)

B.Com. (Hons.) program of the University of Delhi is designed to enable and empower students to acquire knowledge, skills and abilities to analyse and synthesize the contemporary realities pertaining to the business. This course provides for maintaining and sustaining existing businesses in the face of the winds of change and competition and a desperately needed perspective of sustainable growth. This program aims to instil conceptual understanding to equip students to deal with today's business realities and prepare them to drive and face the challenge of tomorrow. It also exposes the students to the world of technology and digitization in the relevant field as envisaged by scholars and policymakers. As mandated by the Government of India, this course is designed to help cultivate an entrepreneurial mindset and skills.

Eligibility for Admission in B.Com. (Hons.)

Candidates must appear in CUET in any of the following subject combinations:

- **Combination I :** Any one Language from List A + Mathematics + Any two subjects out of which at least one should be from List B1

OR

- **Combination II:** Any one Language from List A + Accountancy + Any two subjects out of which at least one should be from List B1

- Merit will be based on the best CUET scores obtained from any of the above-mentioned combinations of subjects.

B.Com

Commerce is visualised as a link between society and business. The nature and purpose of interaction between both have undergone tremendous change with time. Information technology has re-modelled the shape and design of the business, engendering the metamorphosis of its very nature and the matrix of societal functioning. Recognising the implications of this change, the B.Com. Program aims at building in students an understanding of the functioning and premise of the business world. To achieve this, the program offers an opportunity for students to know different aspects of organizational functioning, financial systems, understanding of the economy, laws governing business, strategies adopted by businesses to reach society, etc. The program also provides the students an opportunity to explore, experiment and equip themselves to serve society not as employment seekers but as an entrepreneur and job creators.

Eligibility for Admission in B. Com

Candidates must appear in CUET in any of the following subject combinations:

- **Combination I:** Any one Language from List A + Any two subjects from List B1 + Any one subject from either List B1 or List B2

OR

- **Combination II:** Any one Language from List A + Any one subject from either List B1 or List B2 + SECTION III of CUET (General Test)
- Merit will be based on the best CUET scores obtained from any of the above-mentioned combinations of subjects.

Note: As the weightage of the CUET Sections is not the same, appropriate proration will be done.

Bachelor of Business Economics (BBE)

The B.A. (Hons.) Business Economics program is a perfect blend of practical, analytical and theoretical tools to imbibe proficient capabilities in students to analyse data and information for sound policy formulation and decision making. Business Economics is essentially an application-based interdisciplinary approach to tackling business problems. The academic orientation of the course has been designed to create a strong orientation toward the seamless applicability of economics and related tools in the various functions of a business enterprise. The course equips students with tools and principles relating to subjects such as Statistics, Finance, Marketing, Economics, Econometrics with relevant software to keep abreast with the changing economic scenario and globalisation of business.

Eligibility for Admission in BBE

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

- Any one Language from List A + Mathematics + SECTION III of CUET (General Test)
- Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtained from the above-mentioned combination of subjects.

Bachelor of Elementary Education B. El. Ed

It aims to produce graduates of high caliber in elementary teacher education. Furthermore, it has upgraded the professional status of the elementary school teacher by providing a university degree for elementary education. The program is intensive and focused on preparing teachers by providing a supportive and stimulating environment.

Eligibility for Admission in B. El. Ed

Candidate must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

- Any one Language from List A + Any two subjects from List B1 + Any one subject from either List B1 or List B2
- Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtained from the above-mentioned combinations of subjects.

List of Documents Required at the Time of Applying

The Candidates shall be required to upload copies of relevant certificates/documents at the time of applying (as applicable) and produce the same certificates/documents in original at the time of physical verification at the College.

1. Class X Certificate in the name of the candidate, indicating date of birth and Parents' names.
2. Class XII Marksheet in the name of the candidate. The name of the candidate must match with the CUET(UG)-2022 form.
3. SC/ST/OBC-NCL/EWS/Minority/CW/KM/PwBD Certificate (in the name of the Candidate) issued by the competent issuing authority. The name of candidate claiming reservation under SC/ST/OBCNCL/EWS/Minority/CW/KM/PwBD must match the name that appear on his/her corresponding School Board qualifying certificate and in CUET(UG) - 2022. Similarly, his/her parents' names must match in both sets of certificates.
4. OBC - Non-Creamy Layer Certificate (in the name of the Candidate) issued by the competent issuing authority, and wherein the caste is in the OBC Central List issued by <http://ncbc.nic.in>. The name of the candidate claiming reservation under OBC -Non-Creamy Layer must match with the name as it appears on her corresponding School Board qualifying certificate and in CUET(UG) - 2022; similarly, the parents' names must match in both sets of certificates. Income certificate must be issued after March 31, 2022. The prescribed format of the OBC-NCL certificate is given on the UoD admission website and Annexure IV.
5. EWS Certificate (in the name of the candidate) from the competent issuing authority certifying the candidate can claim reservation under this category. The name of the candidate claiming reservation under this category must match with the name that appears on her corresponding School Board qualifying certificate; similarly, her parents' names must match in both sets of certificates. Income certificate must be issued after March 31, 2022. Refer to Annexure IV for the prescribed format of the certificate.
6. Candidates claiming admission through ECA/Sports supernumerary quota must upload self-attested copies of the requisite certificates and produce the relevant required certificates when sought.
7. PwBD disability certificate should be in the name of the candidate issued by a recognized Government Hospital, bearing a photograph of the candidate (Refer to Annexure IV for the prescribed format of the certificate). Disability Certificates issued after 01.06.2021 must be as per the Gazette Notification no. 1736 (E) dated 05.05.2021 issued by the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities and applied through UDID portal. However, Disability Certificates issued before 01.06.2021, will be considered as per other existing applicable rules and notifications of the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities and the University of Delhi.
8. Candidates applying for the CW category must upload the Educational Concession Certificate (ECC), (in the name of the candidate) in the prescribed format wherein the Priority is clearly mentioned. Refer to Annexure IV for the prescribed format of the certificate.

9. Candidate applying for the Kashmiri Migrant category must upload the relevant certification in the correct format issued by Divisional Commissioner/Relief Commissioner.
10. Candidate who wish to seek admission under UoD Ward supernumerary quota must upload a valid employment certificate of his/her parent/s issued by the due officials. Only the employment certificate uploaded in CSAS Application form will be considered. I-cards, Aadhar Card and/or any other document will not be accepted.

Candidates shall be responsible for the quality and authenticity of the certificate they upload. Candidates must take utmost care to ensure the uploaded documents/certificates are authentic and accurate.

Candidates will be responsible to produce documents/certificates as sought. All certificates/documents will be returned to the candidate by the College/Department upon completion of any physical verification that may be required at a later stage.

If the original certificates are not in English/Hindi, the English/Hindi version/translation of such certificates, duly certified by the Principal/Director or other competent authority of the last Institute attended, will be required during the verification of documents.

CUET percentage score of all the Programs in which she has applied and 75% of the highest ECA score obtained from the ECA categories for which the candidate is being considered. - If selected, a medical certificate from a reputable hospital besides a medical check-up in the college would be mandatory. Any candidate failing the medical check-up would not be granted admission.
- It is mandatory to submit an undertaking on judicial stamp paper of Rs. 100/- by the selected sports person at the time of admission stating that they will play for the college and university during their undergraduate course of study.

Admission on other Supernumerary Quotas

Persons with Benchmark Disability (PwBD)

Five percent (5%) of the total sanctioned strength in each Program of all Colleges are reserved for PwBD candidates. The eligibility and details related to disabilities earmarked for PwBD category are stated in UG BOI 2022.

Separate Merit List/s will be declared for candidates seeking admission under PwBD quota. For the prescribed format of PwBD certificate, refer to CSAS 2022.

Children/Widows of Personnel of the Armed Forces (CW)

Five percent (5%) of seats are reserved for candidates for Children/Widows of Personnel of the Armed Forces (CW), Program-wise, in all colleges. Separate Merit List will be declared for candidates seeking admission under the CW quota.

CW candidates must also confirm their Priority and certificate. For details related to CW Priority, refer to UG-BOI 2022.

Kashmiri Migrants (KM)

Separate Merit List/s will be declared for candidates seeking admission under the Kashmiri Migrants quota.

Upto 5% of seats are reserved Program-wise in all Colleges for the Wards of Kashmiri Migrants.

All wards of Kashmiri Migrants will have to upload a Certificate of Registration as Kashmiri Migrants issued by Divisional Commissioner / Relief Commissioner.

Prime Minister's Special Scholarship Scheme for J&K Students (PMSSS)

Candidates selected under the Prime Minister's Special Scholarship Scheme for J&K students will be admitted as per AICTE and UoD rules.

Nomination of Seats for Sikkimese Students

For details related to the availability of seats for Nominated Seats for Sikkimese students, refer to UG BOI-2022.

UoD Ward Quota

Admission to the wards of the University and its College employees, both teaching and non-teaching, will be done as per Academic Council resolution 9a & b dated 27.11.2020 and subsequent amendments/notifications thereof.

Details of the Undergraduate Course Framework under New Education Policy, as applicable in University of Delhi

1. **Academic Credit** – An academic credit is a unit by which the course work is measured. It determines the number of hours of instructions required per week. One credit is equivalent to one hour of teaching (lecture or tutorial) or two hours of practical work/field work per week.
2. **Courses of study** – Courses of the study indicate pursuance of study in a particular discipline. Every discipline shall offer three categories of courses of study, viz. Discipline Specific Core courses (DSCs), Discipline Specific Electives (DSEs) and Generic Electives (GEs).
- a) **Discipline Specific Core (DSC):** Discipline Specific Core is a course of study, which should be pursued by a student as a mandatory requirement of her programme of study. DSCs shall be the core credit courses of that particular discipline which will be appropriately graded and arranged across the semesters of study, being undertaken by the student, with multiple exit options as per NEP 2020. The DSCs specified in the framework would be identified by the concerned Department as core courses to be taught in a Programme. For example, for award of single discipline specific Honours degree, such as B.A. (Honours) History, B.Com. (Honours), B.Sc. (Honours) Physics and similar such programmes, DSCs shall be the core courses of History, Commerce and Physics, respectively.

However, to pursue Honours degree programme in a 'Field of Multidisciplinary courses of Study' (rather than a single discipline) such as B.Sc. (Honours) Life Sciences, B.A. (Honours) Social Sciences/Humanities, the DSCs shall comprise of core credit courses of more than one discipline. For example, for B.Sc. (Honours) Life Sciences programme, a student shall study credit courses of three disciplines i.e., Botany, Zoology and Chemistry. DSC 1 may be of Discipline A1 (say, Botany), DSC 2 may be of Discipline B 1 (say, Zoology) and DSC 3 may be of Discipline C 1 (say, Chemistry). However, the fourth year of such honours degree programme shall be devoted to the study of only one discipline and hence the DSC courses in the VII and VIII semesters shall be of Discipline A/B/C and not a combination of these three disciplines. Please refer to the framework given as Illustration-I in Table-3.

- b) **Discipline Specific Elective (DSE):** The Discipline Specific Electives (DSEs) shall be a pool of credit courses of that particular discipline (single discipline programme of study) or those disciplines (multidisciplinary programme of study), as the case may be, which a student chooses to study from her particular discipline(s). There shall be a pool of DSEs from which a student may choose a course of study. The DSEs specified in the framework would be identified by the concerned Department as elective courses to be taught in a Programme. For example, to pursue B.Sc. (Honours) Physics, DSEs chosen should be from a pool of DSEs of Physics. Similarly, to pursue B.Sc. (Honours) Life Sciences programme, the DSEs chosen should be a pool of courses of DSEs of Botany, Zoology and Chemistry, the core subjects for this programme of study.

However, to pursue Honours degree programme in a 'Field of Multidisciplinary courses of Study' (rather than a single discipline) such as B.Sc. (Honours) Life Sciences, B.A. (Honours) Social Sciences/Humanities, in the fourth year of such honours degree programme in the VII and VIII semesters, the student shall be required to choose DSEs from any one of the Disciplines A/B/C and not a combination of these three disciplines. Please refer to the framework given as Illustration - I in Table - 3.

- c) **Generic Elective (GE):** Generic Electives shall be a pool of courses which is meant to provide multidisciplinary or interdisciplinary education to students. GEs shall consist of a pool of courses offered by various disciplines of study (excluding the GEs offered by the parent discipline), in groups of odd and even semesters, from which a student can choose. The GEs specified in the framework would be identified by the concerned Department as GEs to be taught in a Programme. In case a student opts for DSEs beyond her discipline specific course(s) of study, such DSEs shall be treated as GEs for that student.
- d) Ability Enhancement course (AEC), Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) & Value Addition Course (VAC): These three courses shall be a pool of courses offered by all the Departments in groups of odd and even semesters from which students can choose. A student who desires to make Academic Project/Entrepreneurship as Minor has to pick the appropriate combination of courses of GE, SEC, VAC, & Internship/Apprenticeship/Project/Community (IAPC) which shall be offered in the form of various modules as specified in the scheme of studies.
- (i) AEC courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to knowledge enhancement through various areas of study. They are Language and Literature and Environmental Science and Sustainable Development which will be mandatory for all disciplines.
- (ii) SEC are skill-based courses in all disciplines and are aimed at providing hands-on training, competencies, proficiency and skills to students. SEC courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide skill-based instruction. Every discipline may provide skill based courses, some of which may be offered to students of its discipline while the rest can be open to students of all other disciplines.
- (iii) VAC courses are common pool of courses offered by different disciplines and aimed towards personality building; embedding ethical, cultural and constitutional values; promote critical thinking, Indian Knowledge Systems, scientific temperament, communication skills, creative writing, presentation skills, sports & physical education and team work which will help in all round development of students.

3. Major discipline

- a) A student pursuing four-year undergraduate programme in a specific discipline (Core course) shall be awarded an appropriate Honours degree with Major in a Discipline on completion of VIII Semester, if she secures in that Discipline at least 50% of the total credits i.e., at least 88 credits in that Discipline out of the total of 176 credits. She shall study 20 DSCs and at least 2 DSEs in eight semesters.

For instance, a student who pursues B.Com. (Honours) shall earn the minimum 88 credits from 20 DSCs and at least two DSEs in order to get Major in Commerce.

- b) A student pursuing four-year undergraduate programme in more than one discipline as Core Course (for example B.A. Social Sciences/ Humanities, B.Sc. Life Sciences, B.Sc. Physical Sciences, B.Sc. Mathematical Sciences, B.Com. and such other programmes) shall be awarded appropriate Honours degree with Major in a Discipline on completion of VIII Semester, if she secures in that Discipline 80 credits out of a total of 176 credits. She shall study 6 DSCs and at least 3 DSEs in that discipline in the first six semesters and 2 DSCs, 6 DSEs and write dissertation in that discipline in the VII and VIII semesters. For instance, a student who pursues four-year B.A. (Honours) Social Sciences/Humanities shall be eligible for Major in History, on completion of VIII semester, if she

earns minimum 80 credits from 8 DSCs and at least 9 DSEs of History and writes dissertation on a topic related to History.

4. Minor discipline

- a) A student mentioned at 3 (a) above may be awarded Minor in a discipline, on completion of VIII Semester, if she earns minimum 28 credits from seven GE courses of that discipline. For example, if a student pursuing B.A. (Honours) History chooses seven GE courses of Political Science out of a total of ten GE courses and writes dissertation, she shall be awarded on successful completion of VIII Semester, Major in History and Minor in Political Science.
- b) A student mentioned at 3 (b) above may be awarded Minor in a discipline, on completion of VIII Semester, if she earns minimum 28 credits from six DSCs and one DSE of that discipline. For example, a student pursuing four-year B.A.(Honours) Social Sciences/Humanities with Major in History (after securing at least 80 credits in History), may be awarded Minor in Hindi if she earns 28 credits from six DSCs and one DSE of Hindi (up to VI semester), on successful completion of VIII Semester.

This definition of Minor is independent of GEs for which there is a requirement of 28 credits to be treated as Minor.

Further, in case a student opts for two disciplines such as Physics and Chemistry instead of three disciplines such as Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics, major and minor shall be determined as per credits earned in the respective courses of study. The concept of Minor is relevant only when there is a Major discipline.

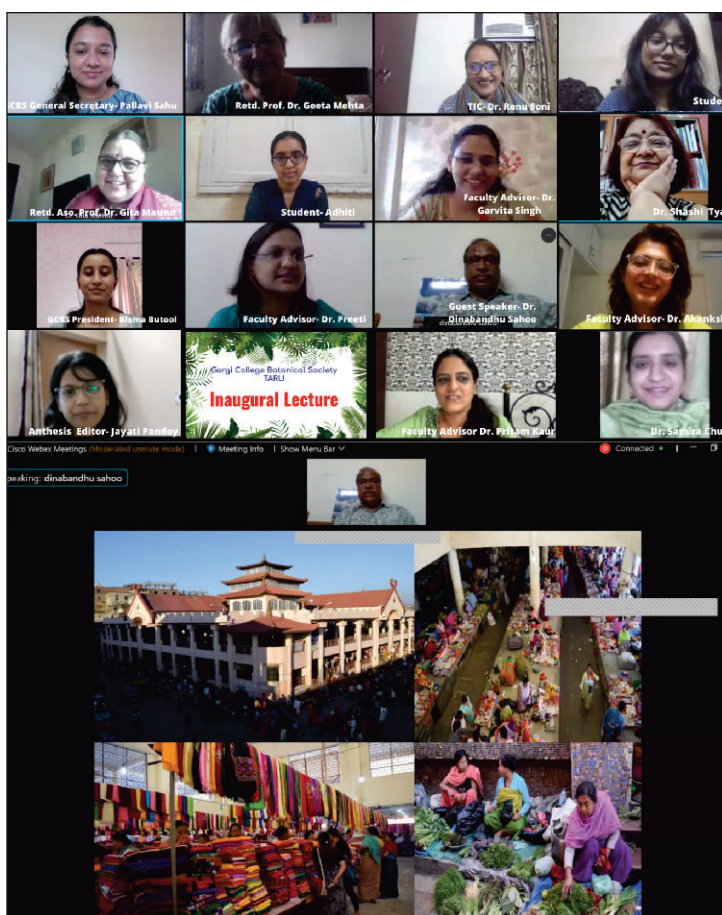
Botany

The Department of Botany at Gargi College was established in 1967 and is dedicated to teaching and research in all fields of plant biology. The Department of Botany at Gargi comprises of faculty with diverse specializations, well-equipped technical staff and enthusiastic students. The department is well-equipped with laboratories for carrying out practical classes and research work, a Museum, which hosts plant specimens, and a Botanical Garden. The course structure also allows students to choose from a wide array of specialized areas like Environmental Biotechnology, Biofertilizers, Intellectual Property Rights, Industrial Microbiology, Medicinal Botany, etc. The well-designed course facilitates students to pursue post graduate studies in Botany, Biosciences, Biomedical Sciences, Molecular Biology, Genetics, Biotechnology, Environmental Sciences, Bioinformatics, etc. Field trips and excursions are organized to enable students to have a first-

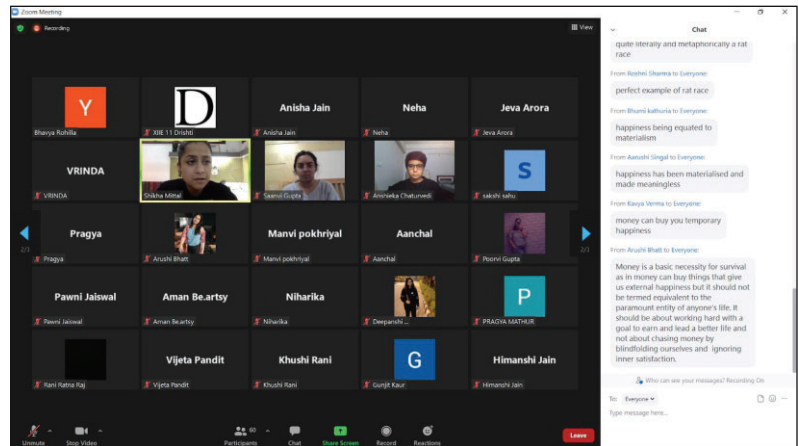
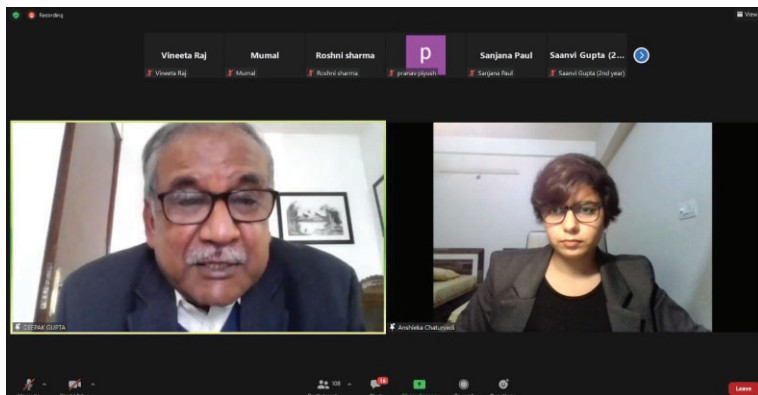
Business Economics

As a result, our graduates have either enrolled in Master's Programs at reputable colleges and business schools around the world or have been hired in reputable firms following graduation.

The B.A. (Honours) Business Economics programme combines practical, analytical, and theoretical methods to give students the skills they need to analyse data and information for smart policy development and decision making. The academic alignment of the course has been designed to create a strong orientation towards seamless applicability of Economics and related tools in the various functions of a business enterprise. This is an inter-disciplinary course with a curriculum that aims to provide students with expertise in a variety of subjects such as Economics, Commerce, Mathematics, and Research. The three-year programme makes it mandatory for students to gain practical exposure by interning in different sectors. Our graduates have interned and worked for firms such as PWC, KPMG, Deloitte, EY, Dell, NITI Aayog, NDTV, OLX and NTPC and others.

Students of Business Economics can pursue a Masters in Commerce, Economics, Business Economics, Business Administration, Finance, International Business, etc. They can also pursue professional courses like CA, CFA, CS, CMA, FRM, Actuarial Science, etc.

The academic year begins with a Departmental orientation to welcome new students and introduce them to the academic curriculum and other activities offered by the Department. Competitions are held for pupils to allow them to demonstrate their abilities. Alumni interactive sessions are held on a regular basis



to allow current students to interact with former alumni. The Department also conducts talks and seminars on various current topics on a regular basis. Advitya - our Annual Departmental Fest is organised by the Business Economics Association every year with unparalleled zeal, enthusiasm and dedication. The Department also organizes various workshops, career counselling sessions and guest lectures with eminent speakers on latest topics.

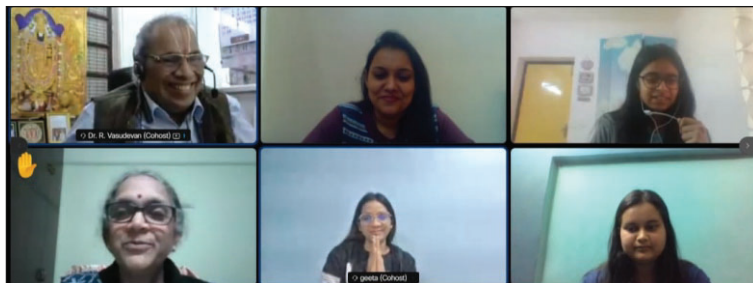
Chemistry

Chemistry is a central science as it interconnects many disciplines and finds applications in areas like pharmacology, environmental science, astronomy, materials science, molecular and cellular biology, geology, forensic science, analytical chemistry and polymer science to name a few. The knowledge of Chemistry enables

science students and opens up numerous career prospects for them. Students can continue in the field of Chemistry and pursue higher education from reputed institutes in India and abroad. Such students can make a mark in the research and development wing of various private and government firms and PSUs, the pharma sector, analytical laboratories, teaching sectors (schools and colleges) and many more. Those who diversify from the subject can also achieve great milestones in unconventional fields as corporate and legal professionals, in managerial and administrative positions, or consultancy, defence and media sectors.

Established in 1967, the Department of Chemistry is one of the oldest departments of the college. The department has highly qualified faculty members and a long list of notable alumnae who have achieved milestones in various fields. In compliance with the Undergraduate Curriculum Framework (UGCF) 2022 of the University of Delhi based on the National Education Policy, the four-year undergraduate programme to be rolled this academic session onwards will be choice-based, flexible, research-oriented and will aim at skill enrichment of the students. The department will offer Chemistry as both a Major as well a Minor subject to cater to the interests and aspirations of students from all disciplines and bring out the multidisciplinary approach of UGCF 2022. The students will have multiple exit options and will be awarded Undergraduate Certificate/Undergraduate Diploma/Appropriate Bachelor's Degree in the field of Study/Discipline depending upon when they choose to exit. Besides teaching the Honours program and Chemistry as an elective subject to students of other disciplines, the department will also be associated with the teaching of multidisciplinary courses like B.Sc. Physical Sciences and Life Sciences.

The course structure and syllabus (as per the University of Delhi guidelines) include Discipline Specific Core (DSC) courses in Inorganic Chemistry, Organic Chemistry and Physical Chemistry; Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) courses; Skill Enhancement Course (SEC); Generic Elective (GE) Papers; and Ability Enhancement Course (AEC), Value Addition Course (VAC) and Internship/Apprenticeship/Project/Community (IAPC) distributed over 4 years (or VIII semesters). The syllabus along with the

practical component is designed to provide in-depth knowledge of the fundamentals of chemistry to students and aims to increase their logical and skill-based aptitude. The liberty to choose papers across various other disciplines in the GE courses will help students read topics of their interest that may be of use in their career progression.

The department has two main chemistry laboratories, two instrumentation rooms, a well-stocked store for both apparatus and chemicals and a well-equipped departmental library. All the students of the department are a part of the Chemical Society called Rasgandhayan. Student representatives are elected for various posts. Under the guidance of teacher mentors, this society works all around the year to put forth some interesting activities to supplement regular classroom teaching. The Society releases an annual magazine Amalgam, which is a students' production and has creative and scientific articles contributed by the students.

Invited lectures by eminent speakers, academic and extra-curricular competitions, career-counseling sessions, alumnae interactions, fun/sports activities as well as educational visits are organized by the society. This year, we had the privilege of listening to two interesting lectures - the inaugural lecture, by the Director-General of the NMCG, Dr. Rajiv Ranjan Mishra and the annual Dr. C. K. Khurana memorial lecture by Dr. R. Vasudevan, Dean ECA and Professor at Thiagarajar College of Engineering, Madurai. A few key events of this academic year include the inter-college idea-proposal competition and paper presentation competition, slam poetry and rangoli making competition, picture description competition and a series of webinars on career prospects for science students. The year-long activities culminate with the degree distribution ceremony which is a part of the valedictory function.

Several seminars, add-on courses, conferences and workshops are organized by the department to add to the holistic development of students. Teacher mentors also guide students frequently for various projects and research work thus giving them exposure to the world of scientific research at a very early age.

The department recognizes the efforts of meritorious and outstanding students in the form of various academic awards and prizes given at the departmental as well as college-level, thus motivating them for good performance. Dr. C.K. Khurana memorial scholarship is proposed to be soon introduced to provide financial aid to deserving needy students. The department trains every student that enters its portals to emerge as an honest, responsible, sincere and hard-working citizen of the nation. 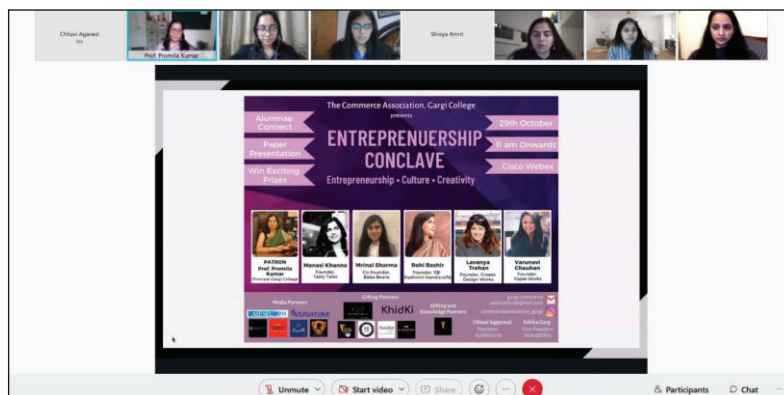
At present, the department offers two undergraduate degree courses- B.Com (Hons.) & B.Com (Prog.); teaches one paper of Entrepreneurship and Small Business to the students of B.A (P). Besides this, the department also runs two Add-On Certificate Courses namely Advertising and Marketing communication & Banking and Financial Services.

The primary focus of these courses is to enable the students to become competent leaders, managers, and professionals in a dynamic business world. It also paves the way for pursuing further education in academic and professional courses like MBA, CA, CMA, and CS, digital marketing, CFA, and many more. The commerce students have been placed in reputed organisations like Deloitte, Ernst and Young, KPMG, Wipro and many more through campus placements.

The department has an active Commerce Association, the members of which work diligently to provide its students the necessary exposure in the area of finance, entrepreneurship, and leadership throughout the year with the able guidance of faculty advisors. Various activities such as Cascade - the annual fest, lectures & workshops by eminent speakers, career counseling sessions and educational trips are organised by the department every year.

Even with the pandemic altering our lives and things slowly getting back to normal, the department made the best use of its time, regardless of the model, and continuously strived to offer one-of-a-kind activities. From seminars to Pan India Conclave, The Commerce Association ensured to make the academic year 2021-2022 a fruitful one by organizing many events.

These included, Entrepreneurship Conclave, with the theme "Entrepreneurship: Culture & Creativity," which highlighted the importance of small businesses in the Indian economy. The event included an Alumnae Connect, in which prominent Alumnae entrepreneurs shared their experiences in starting their businesses, as well as a Paper Presentation Competition, in which students from all over India submitted well-researched



papers. Following to that was Cascade- The annual flagship event of the commerce department. The event consisted of a panel discussion where eminent speakers from different walks of life discussed on the theme "Work From Home, The New Normal: A Boon or Bane for Women".

Along with this two inter college competitions were organised namely Bidding Arcadia and The Uncanny Quest that challenged the management skills of participants while preparing them for the real corporate world.

The department also releases its bi-annual magazine "Comascent" and Yearbook "Reflections" (which includes the fondest memories of outgoing students of Gargi College).

Elementary Education

Established in the year 1997, the Department of Elementary Education conducts a four year professional degree programme Bachelor of Elementary Education (B.El.Ed). B.El.Ed is an integrated course of study for training teachers particularly for the elementary school level. After four years of rigorous education in many aspects of teacher preparation the students become a professionally qualified teacher. The idea behind this programme is to integrate the study of subject knowledge, human development, teaching skills and communication skills. Hence, B.El.Ed offers both compulsory as well as optional theory courses. It has a strong focus on practicum courses. It also entails a comprehensive school internship programme in its fourth year. A special departmental library cum resource centre is available to the students. It is well stocked with various kinds of teaching-learning resources. The B.El.Ed is a bilingual programme. Classroom teaching-learning is in both English and Hindi medium. The course material is also available in both the languages. The two essential components of this programme are the theory and practicum courses. There are 19 theory courses which the student is expected to cover during the four year programme of study. This includes:



Foundation Courses: These courses are designed to enable students to make an in-depth study of child development concepts and perspectives in education, the context in which the education of the child is situated, processes and techniques of social organisation; various issues related to elementary education and to develop skills on communicating and relating.

Core Courses: Core courses offer the prospective teacher the opportunity to reconstruct concepts learnt in school and to integrate them within a multi-disciplinary perspective.

Pedagogy Courses: Courses in pedagogy are designed to help develop core teaching skills specific to the teaching of young children. This includes developing perspectives in pedagogy and techniques related to specific knowledge areas.

Liberal Courses: Liberal optional courses provide students with the opportunity to study a specific discipline with academic rigour. They are designed to enrich the knowledge base to allow further study in the discipline and in the pedagogies in which students specialise. The Liberal Courses offered by Gargi College are: English, Hindi, Political Science, Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics and Biology (subject to a minimum number of seven students opting for the course.)



Practicum Courses: The Practicum Courses are another very important component of this programme. These courses are designed to allow a variety of work experience with children in and outside elementary schools and opportunities for self-reflection and development. The practicum input includes: Performing and Fine Arts, Craft and Participatory Work, School-Contact Programme, Observing Children, Self-Development Workshops, Physical Education, School Internship, Projects, Tutorials and Colloquia.

Admission of students to the B.El.Ed. programme is through the centralized Entrance Examination CUET (UG) conducted for admission to Delhi University by NTA. Teacher education in India is regulated by National Council for Teacher Education, a statutory body of the Government of India. As per the B. El. Ed. Ordinance each candidate shall be required to attend not less than 3/4th of the lectures delivered and practicum held separately during each part of the programme.

Economics

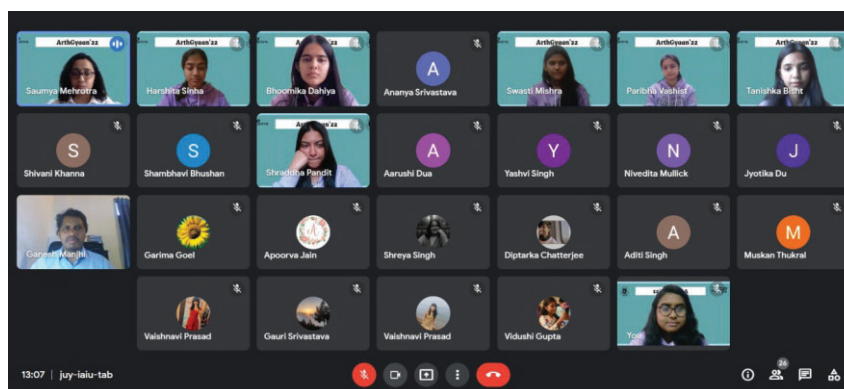
The department of Economics was founded in 1967. It envisioned excelling academic performance through quality education by offering a course in Economics under the guidance of faculty members like Ms. V Bala Subramaniam, Ms. Manjeet Kaur, Ms. Kiran Chopra, Ms. Indu Jairath, Ms. Swaran Bhalla, Ms. Asha Sachdev and Ms. Shobha Mathur. Under the erstwhile FYUP scheme, the department got an overwhelming response admitting 250 students. The students attained a resounding success of 100 per cent pass percentage. In the year 2017-18, the department introduced a full-fledged honours course in Economics with more than 60 students. At present, the department has eight dynamic and dedicated faculty members with diverse specialisations and vast experience in the field of teaching and research.



The Department has made revolutionary changes by hosting various activities including the Annual Economics Festival, seminars, and intra-department as well inter-college quiz competitions through "Ecomantra, the Economics Association" launched in the year 2011.

Despite the challenging times induced by the pandemic, it has earned the name by successfully organizing a host of events throughout the academic session. The academic year 2021-22 started with a career counselling session on 'Career Aspects in Economics' in association with Career Counselogy. The 10th Annual Economics Festival was held on the topic 'India's Growth Trajectory: Prism of Infinite Possibilities- Innovation, Covid and Policies'.

The department also publishes an annual magazine 'EcoBuzz' which provides an opportunity to the students to put on one's thinking cap and voice opinions on a myriad of economic, social and political issues.



The department revels in the glorious achievements of its alumni, who have gone on to join IIM Ahmedabad, Delhi School of Economics, Indian Statistical Institute, prestigious foreign universities, the CII, the big four consultancy, etc.

English

The Department of English is one of the founding departments of the College, beginning in 1967, and with B.A. English (Honours) introduced in 1978. The English curriculum is impactful and rigorous, taking students through the best in world literatures. The syllabus is well-structured and relevant in its coverage of important literary texts and landmarks, and thus stands students in good stead in all future professional as well as personal endeavours. Papers range from surveys of Indian and Western classical traditions to lively and immediate contemporary authors; students will read widely in different genres including poetry, plays, novels, besides acquiring critical thinking skills that will enable and empower them academically and as well as in everyday life. From academic year 2022-23, students can take up "major" as well as "minor" programmes of study through the department, and receive degrees at exit points in the first, second, third year if they choose to exit earlier, or fourth/final year with a dissertation on a subject of their choice. The English Department faculty is resourceful and well-networked, and includes widely-published scholars and writers. Our distinguished faculty has subject interests that span a variety of literary traditions and forms, from creative writing, early modern literatures from India and abroad, translation, gender and sexuality studies, folk and popular cultures. This is reflected in the department's interdisciplinary approach, which equips students with a wide variety of methodologies to help choose their future interests.

The Department teaches English to students of all courses, including those majoring in the Sciences, Commerce, Arts and Education streams; besides tutoring MA English students. Department resources include the 3,000+ volume Oswal-Sena Library (apart from the College Library), which offers students access to a world of books beyond the curriculum.

In addition to the compulsory core courses, where the focus is on building foundations to grasp literary styles, perspectives and canonical authors like Shakespeare or Jane Austen or classics like the *Silappatikaram* that have stood the tests of time, we offer a wide choice of Discipline Specific Electives in various arenas of literary study of interest to both major and minor level students. Areas range from understanding analytical and critical concepts like marginality or feminist theory, to papers that survey literatures thematically and historically, like Partition literature, European literatures, literatures from South Asia, Africa, to name a few. Similarly, a rich choice of AECs (Ability Enhancement Courses, in subject areas where the focus is training and skill-building, such as marketable soft learning leadership skills, working on areas like English Language Teaching, film studies, media analysis, translation practice, producing creative texts like film scripts, publishable blogs, etc) will be available, as well as counselling on internships and picking suitable choices.

For students who take up a "minor" in English, our Generic Elective Papers, offered to students who take admission in other Departments of the college will be eye-openers in the power and profound enjoyment that learning to read and understand texts well can bring. Our offerings include a mix of contemporary, popular and canonical subjects to ensure that all students get wide and balanced exposure in the subject, irrespective of level of study or point of exit.

Students after a four year graduation can go on to further studies (MA of one year, and PhD thereafter), and students who exit earlier have the option to come back to finish their studies later if they so desire. Our alumni have built careers in literature studies as researchers, and careers in teaching (at the school, college and university levels), in media and mass communication (journalism, film, advertising), publishing (writing, editing, translating), public relations management and also to lateral fields like social work, law,

management via masters' study in these fields. The sound thinking and writing skills students gain over 1/2/3/4 years of study is also a good foundation for competitive examinations including those for management studies and civil services.

The Department has an exciting co-curricular calendar of varied activities, including an annual national seminar and literary festival, frequent invited lectures and interactions with eminent academicians, creative writers and media personnel; besides these, there are multiple workshops and co-curricular skill-building sessions on different themes like creative writing, editing, translation, theatre and cinema. The Department's co-curricular activities are directed through several clubs, any or all of which students are encouraged to join, depending on their interests and goals. Some of these include The Book Club, The Creative Writing Club, The Quiz Club, The Performance Club and The Film Club; all of which are managed by students and mentored by the Department faculty. Our Department's literary magazine, Bitacora, provides an independent forum for both creative expression and training in skills such as copy and content editing. A portfolio of activities designed to encourage student creativity and understanding of their discipline, like quizzes and literary competitions keep the years the students spend with us stimulating and invigorating.

German

German is offered as a Discipline subject in the B.A Programme Course, which means a student, who opts for German, will study it for the next three years. No prior knowledge of German is required. Students will get to learn from the basics. They are initiated into the German language in the first year, but by the time they reach third year they are exposed to famous German short stories and folk tales. We also have a German Section in our annual college magazine, in which the students write poems, articles, essays, etc.

It is an asset to know a foreign language in today's world of globalization. If one wants to be a real player in the 21st century, learning German will give one the edge one needs. 100 million people worldwide communicate in German! German is spoken not only in Germany, but also in Austria, Hungary and Switzerland as the official language. After learning German for three years at the undergraduate level, a student can do post-graduation in the German language. One can go to Germany, Austria, Hungary or Switzerland for higher studies. There are a lot of scholarships too, that these countries offer. And there is no dearth of jobs in the job market with the knowledge of the German language. With the knowledge of German, one improves one's employment opportunities. Germany has the largest economy in the European Union and the third largest in the world. Knowledge of German, for sure, puts one in high demand. If one is looking for employment in the United States, knowing German can give you great advantages.

German companies account for 700,000 jobs in the United States and US Companies have created approximately the same number of jobs in Germany. Apart from this, learning German opens a lot of job avenues in the Tourism Industry, Hospitality Industry, German (Lufthansa), Austrian, Swiss and Hungarian Airlines and also in German, Swiss, Austrian and Hungarian Embassies, teaching jobs in schools, colleges and MBA Institutes like Amity and Symbiosis Universities, etc. There are also jobs for those with German Language Skills as Interpreters and Translators, in German Banks (like Deutsche Bank). There are a host of job opportunities in a lot of Indian and German Multinational Corporates such as Siemens, BMW, Audi, Volkswagen etc. All in all, it is a skill based course. It adds to one's CV and gives one an edge over others in the job market.

Hindi

Department of Hindi is known for its academic activities. It provides teaching to the undergraduate level students. The Hindi department was started in the year 1967 with the year of establishment of the college. From the contemporary point of view, Hindi (Hons) is an important option for undergraduate teaching in our college. If you are interested in Hindi Literature Honors then this undergraduate course can open many avenues and opportunities for you in future. On the lines of the concept of Global Village, the multidimensional dimensions of Hindi language are being brought to the world stage. Hindi literature develops creativity and literary sensitivity in the mind of the students. Honors course in Hindi not only introduces girl students to the great poets, writers, novelists, critics etc. from ancient times to the present, but also brings out their hidden talents. From the point of view of employment, if you want to increase your creativity in the field of journalism, research, anchoring, screenwriting, translation, editing, lyricism etc., then this course is the best option for you. Faculty members of Hindi department are experienced and qualified who play an important role in developing the potential of girl students as well as making them the best.



Apart from excellence in teaching, the Hindi Department has formed an active and literary body for girl students 'Hindi Sahitya Parishad'; which provides ample opportunities to the Hindi Department girl students to achieve all round development; provides a variety of skills, including debating, creative writing and engaging in dramatic activities. These activities provide an opportunity to every student to hone their inner talent. The department organizes debate competition, poetry-writing, story-writing, essay-competition etc. regularly in every session for the girl students to hone their literary talent and skills. The department believes in nurturing the ideas of the girl students by helping them strike a fine balance between tradition and modernity, past and present. Hindi Department has started a magazine 'Vicharaya'



to provide a platform to the girl students to express their views on various topics related to life, society and nation.

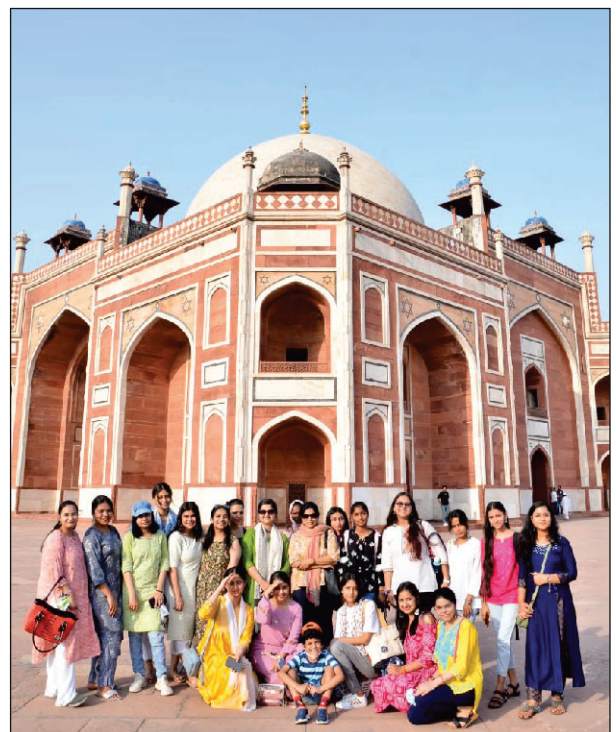

History

The History Department was set up as one of the core departments of Gargi College when it was established in 1967. Initially, History was offered at the BA Pass level (later called the BA Programme). History teaching at the Honours level commenced from 1972. Over time, History has evolved into a highly specialised discipline. Our faculty members have developed expertise in particular areas of Indian and World History.

Honours courses, including Indian and non - Indian histories are offered at the undergraduate level. The History Honours syllabus pertaining to the History of India covers a long span of time, namely Ancient, Medieval and Modern India. Similarly, the World History papers, including Social Formations and Cultural Patterns of the Ancient World in the first year.

The History Association was initiated by the department in the year 2006. It aims to broaden the horizons of the discipline of History and familiarise students with the emerging trends in the field of the subject. Routinely through the academic session, the Association organizes a series of lectures, book discussions, and film screenings on pertinent subjects. Eminent historians from various national and international universities, archaeologists from apex organizations such as The Archaeological Survey of India, independent scholars and heritage experts are invited to share their perspectives with the students of the Department. Students are also encouraged to visit museums, historical sites and exhibitions across the city. Besides these solitary events, the Association organizes an annual festival titled 'Antaraal' revolving around a specific theme that is considered worth some pensive research. The event involves an academic session, where students get to engage with experts from their fields. This is followed by cultural events, based on the theme of the festival, where students can participate and showcase their skills. The History Association makes the experience of students as participatory and all rounded as possible. Over the years, varied themes like the History of Delhi, Environment, Food, Religion, Art History, New Histories, and Historicizing Women's Roles and Agency etc. have been taken up.



In 2022, the theme of the annual festival was Parallel Narratives: Foregrounding Regional Histories and this was conducted online amidst a lot of enthusiasm and fervour. Besides this, the Department also organised other webinars around various historical themes of Regional, National and International History.

After these three years of studying History at undergraduate level, at the History department of Gargi College, the students can look forward to a more comprehensive knowledge of the historical past. This equips them to step into the professional world with a better understanding and a deeper insight.

Mathematics

The Department of Mathematics at Gargi College commenced B.Sc. (honours) Mathematics course in 2016 for which curriculum was designed by University of Delhi considering the needs of students and developing their ability to think critically, logically & analytically. The course develops students for career in different sectors like education, government, business and industry. A

summary of the program structure is available on Delhi University website. Faculty in the department are professionals with specialisation in diverse areas of pure, applied, financial mathematics and computer science. Faculty is involved in variety of research activities. The department also carries out inter-department teaching through humanities and other science courses. The college has state of the art computer lab with latest equipment and multiple mathematical software programmes viz. Wolfram Mathematica, R, Latex etc. that are required for the various papers with practical components.



It is believed that participating in extracurricular activities build team work, communication, relationships and sense of belonging, all of which help students to develop socially and be successful in all parts of life. Participation in extracurricular activities demonstrates the importance of community involvement. The department is active in planning and creating conducive environment for

multidisciplinary events with involvement of students along with academics. Every year, the Mathematics Society of College 'Mathema' organises beneficial activities and events such as webinars, article writing competitions, interactive session, quiz competition and career counseling session to nurture our students with the knowledge and skills for a successful realisation of their goals.

Microbiology

The Department of Microbiology was established in 1989 with a view to train students not only for research in Life Sciences and allied fields but also help them find a suitable vocation in quality control and R& D sectors of food, pharmaceutical and health industries. The core papers offered focus on structural and physiological aspects of diverse microbes, their roles in disease causation, agriculture and industry as well as studying concepts of molecular biology, recombinant DNA technology, Biosafety and Bioinformatics. The practical sessions are structured for imparting hands-on training in microscopy, biochemistry as well as diverse molecular biology techniques.



After graduation students can pursue a post-graduate programme in Microbiology/Biotechnology/Life Sciences/Genetics/Molecular Virology/Biotechnology/Water Management as well as related fields.

The department offers a good infrastructure for conducting theory and practical sessions. A host of wide-ranging extracurricular activities and scientific talks are arranged as an integral component of the academic curriculum under the aegis of the student's society GERMS.

Philosophy

Gargi College has been offering philosophy in B.A. Programme courses from long ago to offer honours course. The Department of Philosophy GC was established in 1995. The department comprises vibrant faculty members having expertise in various areas of philosophy. Currently, the Teacher In-charge (TIC) is Dr Deepika Chatterjee and Association In-charge is M Inamul Haq.

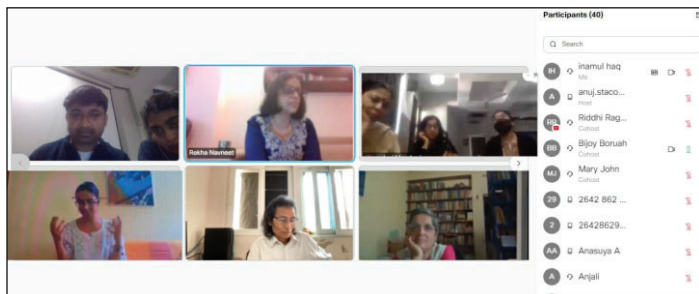
Philosophy is the study of general and fundamental problems and inquires - Where does the world come from? How was the earth formed? Does God exist? Did God create the world or has the world been in existence eternally? How it is that man thinks, what is the relation between the brain, mind and thought? What is the relation between will and ability? It puts into perspective life issues in the context of Gender, Environment, Medical Ethics, matters of law, Media, Arts, Films, etc. In its broader aspects Philosophy examines the various kinds of existence and their interrelationships, in Metaphysics; the nature and validity of knowledge, in Epistemology and logic; and the nature of value, in Ethics and Aesthetics. So, the objective of this subject is to make one read, think, research and critically analyse the world around us. It helps one to obtain a self-consistent understanding of things observed. Philosophy helps students prepare for careers in education, research, mass communication, journalism, social work, law, film appreciation, civil services, management studies and gender studies.

Mimamsa - Philosophy Society : It is a platform exclusively for philosophical discussions and debates open to participants from all disciplines including students and teachers.

Gnosis-Philosophy Newsletter : It is published annually for the students and by the students.

Students propose a central theme every year. This year's theme was "Melange: Variegation of Culture, Linguistics and Philosophy".

Dialectica - Annual Philosophy Festival: The department holds an annual academic meeting on a topical issue and a panel of eminent speakers is invited. The speakers are requested to contextualise their presentation in relation to Philosophical Discourse. The latter half of the day is dedicated to



competitive inter-college students' events like debate and creative events focused around the theme. The theme in the academic session 2021-22 was: "Disciplining Agency through Marriage" where students had an interactive session with eminent Speakers.

The Department organises webinars/seminars along with an interactive session on different discourses in academic philosophy. The last session's focus was on Greek Philosophy. In the upcoming session, the department is aiming to organise lectures on philosophical counselling and other newly emerging discourses in philosophy.

Department started a series of webinars aimed at inviting philosophy professionals to provide insights on career options and applications of philosophical discourses. The last session was dedicated to "Writing Research paper and scholarships for higher studies"

Students' Union: The Students' union takes new initiatives through the department's social media handles. Recent initiatives are 'Humans of Philosophy'; through this initiative the students of our department are encouraged to share their stories of any sort of self-progress which is released on the department pages along with their photographs and AIM (All Ideas Matter) -an initiative that is meant for students' suggestions, feedback and any other pressing concern. There are a series of talks and lectures focused on the curriculum and inter-disciplinarian Philosophy. Some movies are screened too to add up to perspective.

Physics

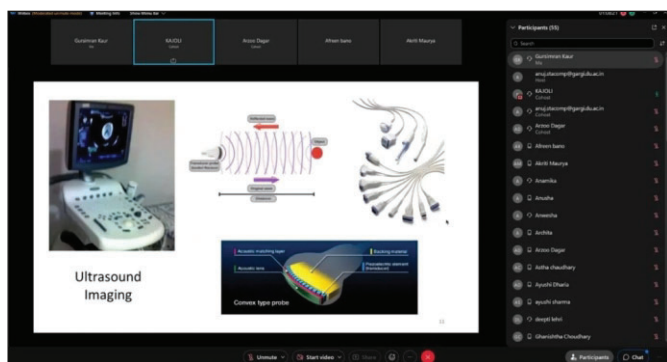
The Physics Department was founded in Gargi in the year 1967.

About the course/overview : The Physics Department offers various papers to B. Sc. Physics (Hons.) and B. Sc. Physical Sciences students. The Department also offers Generic Elective papers to students of various departments.

Job opportunities: After completing graduation in Physics, there are numerous career options available to students. To name a few: becoming a scientist, teaching Physics, management, administration, a career in law, etc. Physics graduates are also welcomed into the research and development wing of diverse industries like Material Sciences, Environment and Energy sector, Nanotechnology, Geophysics, Information and Technology, Defence Research and the communication industry.

About the department/society and activities: Over and above the regular academic curriculum, the students pursue research and do projects under the guidance of the faculty of the Department. Two of the faculty members are also supervising Ph. D. scholars. The Department has a Delhi University recognised research lab in which students diligently pursue research. The Physics Department also organises a summer school every year during the vacations to introduce the students to various fields of Physics.

The Physics Department Society, Quasar, is always abuzz with activities throughout the year. The Department, under the aegis of this society, organises lectures by eminent scientists from various institutes. To give an opportunity to the students for showcasing their talents, various events and competitions are held throughout the academic year. The students are also encouraged to participate in intra/inter college events. They are regularly taken to well-known institutes to expose them to all the research done in these institutes and to the latest state-of-the-art technology available there. The students as well as the faculty members of the Department attend/organize seminars and conferences to keep abreast with current research and latest developments in Physics and other fields. This year the first-ever "virtual" inaugural lecture on "Nanotechnology for semiconductors: Opportunities and Challenges" was organised on Oct. 28, 2021 which was delivered by Dr. Ashutosh Kumar working as a



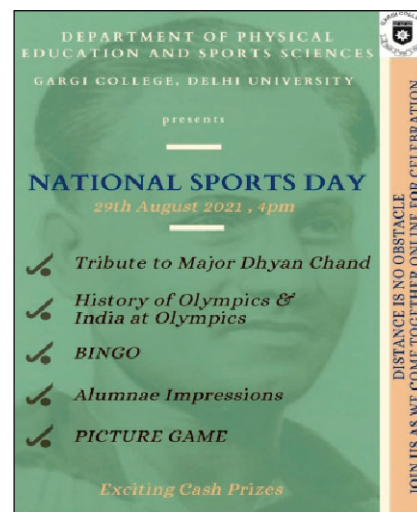

- Aerobics Training has been taught as Generic Elective to Honours courses in Semester-III with both theory and practical for 100 marks.

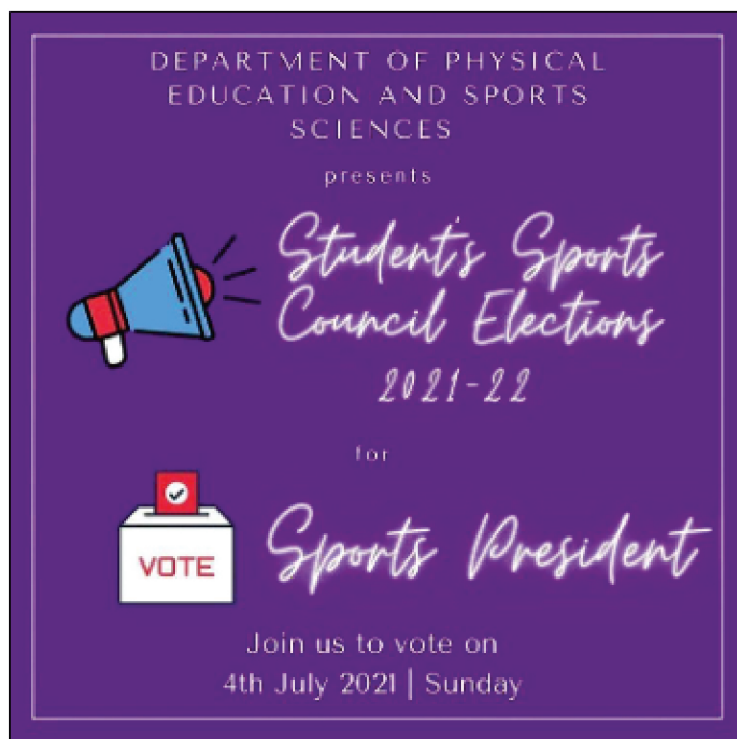
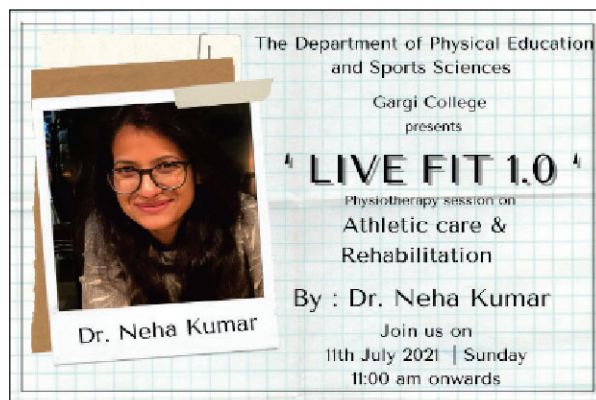


- Fitness and Exercise Management has been taught as a Generic Elective to Honours courses in Semester-IV with both theory and practical for 100 marks.

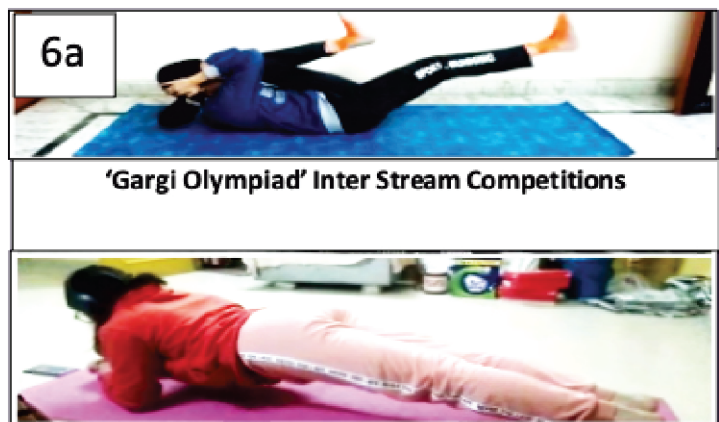

Political Science

Political Science has been one of the most sought-after courses in Gargi College. The popularity of this course lies in its ability to bridge the gap between theory and practice. The students are not only taught about the various issues related to the state in theory but also about the applicability of those issues in the real times. Such issues include power, politics, democracy, constitution, administration, civil society and international relations to name a few. The primary aim of the faculty of Political



Science in the College is to equip the students with rationality and analytical skills to enable them to comprehend the decision-making processes and their impact on individual, society, state and the world. Also, the students are given a holistic understanding of relevant international issues such as development, climate change, security and human well-being which so far have been western-dominated.

The Political Science Department was established in 1967. Since its inception, the Political Science Department takes pride in the diverse expertise and rich experience of its faculty members in the varied sub-disciplines of political science. The Department is equally proud of the achievements of its students in curricular as well as extra-curricular activities. Both the faculty members and students of the Department work diligently to realize its revered vision of academic excellence.

The Department offers three courses: B.A Honours, B.A Programme and M.A in Political Science. As part of B.A Honours and B.A Programme courses, the Department offers wide range of papers such as Political Theory, Indian Government and Politics, Indian Political Thought, Political Philosophy, Public Policy and



Administration, India's Foreign Policy, Feminism, Development Process and Social Movements in Contemporary India, Comparative Government and Politics, and International Relations. The Department also offers Generic Elective papers such as Politics of Globalisation, Nationalism in India, United Nations and Global Conflicts, and Understanding Ambedkar to help the students answer pertinent questions regarding human well-being and individual growth.

The Department has a dynamic academic calendar marked by the varied activities which keeps the students engaged throughout the year. Seminars, lectures, talks, documentary screening, webinars and workshops on significant contemporary themes are organised on a regular basis. These events provide an opportunity for the students to interact with the learned individuals from diverse fields such as Academicians, Researchers, Diplomats, Bureaucrats and Social Activists. Such events not only enhance the intellectual skills and creativity of the students but also allow them to participate vigorously in the planning and organisation of the same. The Department has an active student body - Political Science Association which streamlines the hard work and efforts of the students for the various departmental endeavours. The student body is elected annually by the students of the Department.

The most important and the much-awaited event of the Department is its Annual Festival 'POL POURRI' which is a one-day theme-based affair. On this occasion, several inter-college activities and competitions such as panel discussion, debate, slang poetry writing, policy analysis and quiz are held and which also witness enthusiastic participation of the students. In addition, the annual magazine of the Department 'DEMOS' affords an opportunity to the students to express their views and opinions on the concerned themes. The educational trips for students are also organised annually by the Department during mid-semester break.

The Department is dedicated to ensuring a comprehensive growth of its students during their three years of under-graduation programme. The Department takes immense joy in putting on record that the talent and hard work of its students have translated into scaling of new heights of achievement. Many students of the Department are Delhi University rank holders. Apart from this, the students have also worked as interns in different governmental institutions and international organisations. Several students have completed higher studies from renowned foreign universities and are now pursuing lucrative careers as bureaucrats, media personnel, researchers, lawyers and activists to name a few.

Psychology

The department of Psychology at Gargi College was established in the year 1972 where Psychology course was offered to the students of BA (Programme). Applied Psychology (Honours) as a course was started in 1987. The department of Psychology, Gargi College started the first ever Honours degree course in University of Delhi in Applied Psychology and till date has spearheaded all the revisions of the syllabus to keep the course in sync with changing times. The incoming academic session will have the restructured course introduced in



semester one which is based on N.E.P. The course provides fundamental knowledge of basic psychology and applications of it under various life settings. The present structure aims to impart basic knowledge in Applied Psychology via the core papers, specialized areas are introduced in the discipline centred courses

and the students are exposed to the application possibilities via the skill based courses. The focus is on foundations of psychology, cognitive, social, counselling, organizational, clinical, media, youth and health psychology. The students are trained to carry out academic inquiry into psychology and its major sub-fields with emphasis on application. They are taught effective communication skills, counselling abilities and understanding of scientific writing with a focus on its ethical use. Further they are trained in critically thinking about the linking of personal experiences with concepts studied and using curricula for personal-development as well as for emotional and self-regulation skills. The students are encouraged to evolve as individuals' with positive attributes of non-judgement, empathy, kindness, gender and multicultural sensitivity and responsibility towards self and community.

Over the years, the department has consistently had university toppers from our college and the student feedback about the course and teaching processes is available on the college website.

The Psychology Association conducts a myriad of sessions in the academic year to bring to its students wider perspectives of the discipline. Ranging from sessions on Yoga and Vipassana Meditation to lectures on Data Privacy, Sexuality, and more, experts from the field helped further enrich students and faculty alike.

The Wellness Series was an initiative by the Department to combat mental distress instigated by the pandemic. Distinguished speakers such as Professor M. Manjula, Dr. Sharad Philip, Manasi Saxena, Sanjay Mahalingam, Dr. Nandita Chaudhary, and Dr. Avantika Bhatia delivered talks on managing stress and anxiety, dealing with grief and loss, having grace under pressure, managing uncertainty, building intergenerational relations, and mental health concerns of young adults in the pandemic, respectively.

To facilitate an exchange with professionals in various subfields of psychology, Ms. Kritivi Kedia was invited to deliver a talk on Industrial/Organizational Psychology along with Ms. Swatee Jha and Mr. Neeraj Mathur to demonstrate the power embedded in Yoga and Vipassana for stress management. The Department also invited Ms. Syeda Lameeya Parween to deliver a lecture on the issues faced by LGBTQIA+ youth. Venturing into the new age world, an informative session on Data Privacy was delivered by Dr. Debarati Halder.

The Mental Health Initiative of the Department, Izhaar, continues to create awareness on mental health issues by organizing a plethora of interactive events through the social media platform and more recently in the offline mode.

To honour Suicide Prevention Week, the team participated in the QPR Gate-keeping Training for Suicide Prevention conducted by Ms. Devika Khanna. More recently, Eating Disorders Awareness Week and International Day of Happiness were also commemorated by Izhaar.

The Annual Department Fest - Psyfiesta was organized on the theme of Cyberpsychology. Sessions on themes like academic writing, minorities in the virtual world, online expressive arts therapy were conducted by experts from the field. These interactive workshops offered a great learning experience for the students with an opportunity to learn beyond the textbook.

Sanskrit

The Sanskrit Department of Gargi College is one of the best Departments of Delhi University. The relevance of studying Sanskrit has increased in recent times and can offer students many avenues of intellectual and professional growth. A knowledge of Sanskrit is useful in many professional areas like the Media (Sanskrit news reading and other programme based on ancient culture), Management (knowledge of Indian system of management of life), Ayurveda, Yoga, Poetics, Music, Theatre, History, Philosophy of Languages, Linguistics, Computer Linguistics, Animation Industry and Translation, etc. The Department offers an Honours course in Sanskrit.

The Department also organises inter-college and inter-class competitions every year to boost the confidence of students and give them sufficient exposure to develop their overall personality.

Regular Departmental Activities include Workshop on various issues, Educational trips, Add on courses on different aspects of ancient knowledge such as Vaastu Shastra, Jyotish, Ayurveda and Yoga, Sanskrit speaking classes and Seminars, talks and lectures by eminent speakers.

The Sanskrit Department Association also organises Essay writing, Sanskrit paper-reading and Rangoli competitions and Sanskrit Natyavhiviyakti and Sanskrit Shloka-vritti competitions during the Annual College festival, REVERIE.

Zoology

The department of Zoology started in the year 1967. The salient feature of the department includes qualified faculty members, four well-equipped laboratories, Zoological Museum and research lab. The B.Sc., (Honours) Zoology curriculum will empower the learners on various fields of basic biology and advanced fields.

Based on UGC guidelines and templates, the department offers an honours course in zoology, core papers in life sciences, and generic elective papers in zoology for students from other disciplines. In addition, the department extends a thorough foundation in invertebrate and vertebrate biology by offering classical papers like non-chordates and chordates. Besides these classical papers, the department provides an array of core papers, namely physiology, biochemistry, ecology, comparative anatomy of vertebrates,



developmental biology, genetics, and evolutionary biology. Moreover, the department offers several disciplines specific papers, viz. neurosciences, biotechnology, molecular biology, immunology, animal behavior and chronobiology. The department also facilitates a basic and all-inclusive approach to developing skills in sericulture, medical diagnostics, food, nutrition; health, and research methodology. In a nutshell, the courses offered by the department of zoology provide a whole spectrum of zoology, from animal behaviour and evolution to anatomy and physiology and help the students to develop essential lab skills in molecular biology, physiology, immunology, and cell biology that are sought after by various research organizations.

Graduates from the department of zoology will gain the proficiency and skills to be professional zoologists and work across a diverse range of professions like researchers in various universities, institutes, and bioscience companies. In addition, other career prospects span a wide range of opportunities in zoos and museums. Alternatively, graduates from the department of zoology continue their studies to the postgraduate level and pursue scientific research and development in various areas.

The holistic development of students is ensured by engaging them in various curricular and extracurricular activities planned and conducted throughout the year by Albatross, the Zoological Society of the college. Albatross is actively involved in organizing multiple events throughout the year and offers the students a chance for self-expression, creativity and sociability. Furthermore, the students are responsible for planning and executing the activities of the society that inculcate a sense of responsibility and leadership qualities in students.

Albatross also releases its annual magazine 'Flight' which channelizes the talented budding writers and enables students to unfold their creative expressions.

Albatross - The Zoological Society endeavours to create an environment to instill creativity, teamwork, responsibility, and other values in the students apart from academics. Despite the pandemic that has robbed us of the opportunity to meet offline, Albatross has not stood still and remained active all year



round with different activities to keep up the spirit of students and to instill participation and the importance of extracurricular activities. Webinars, competitions, quizzes, and social media activities have been organized to nurture the students and keep their scientific temperaments alive.

On October 6, 2021, a virtual webinar was organized on "Chronobiology: An Introduction" by Prof. AK Pati, Professor Emeritus of Biosciences, PRSU, Raipur and Former Vice-Chancellor, GMU, Sambalpur. On October 31, 2021, an "AlumConnect"; with our notable alumnus, Ms Ishita Talwar, was organized to discuss queries related to careers in Zoology. On January 15, 2022, a webinar 'Journey to Destination' for UPSC aspirants was conducted, and two meritorious officers of the country, Mr Raviteja Munikoti (IRS (IT)-2016 Batch) and Ms Tejaswini Pusuluri (IFS-2018 Batch) graced the occasion. On January 13, 2022, a Virtual tour visit to Dudhwa Tiger Reserve was organized to experience the thrill of tracking the tiger from the comfort of one's couch. February 4 2022 - on World Cancer Day, a documentary, "The C Word", was screened to create awareness about the disease's aspects. To encourage the creative expression of Gargians, "Picturesque"- The Illustration Competition was organized on February 12 2022. On February 28, 2022, a poster making contest, & Postermania, was arranged. Additionally, on February 24, 2022, students visited a Mega Exposition showcasing the achievements in science and technology and a National Science Book Fair during the National Science Day celebration week 'Vigyan Sarvatra Pujyate'; organized by the Ministry of Culture, GoI in association with the Vigyan Prasar at JLN Stadium, New Delhi. Additionally, Albatross organized "Biosnap" - a photography competition and an article writing competition and came up with an opportunity for students to demonstrate their photography and writing skills on the theme 'Biodiversity'. The students responded with enthusiasm and diversity in their knowledge-bearing entries. The selected entries were featured in the department's Annual Magazine 'Flight'.

B.A. Programme

B. A. Programme with its interdisciplinary structure and opportunities is one of the most sought- after courses for students who wish to explore different academic subjects while learning about their mutual connections. This course is definitely meant for students who wish to chart their own unique paths. The



B.A. Programme course which is being offered by the University of Delhi is extremely flexible as students are introduced to diverse subjects that are interdisciplinary in nature. Subjects in B.A. Programme are relevant to the immediate context of academic opportunities and offer intellectual skills expected of a programme pertaining to higher education. Students can choose from an array of subjects, explore new and interesting courses and, at the same time, can plan to do a Master's programme in any of the discipline subjects offered. This course provides the

students enough knowledge about a discipline to pursue postgraduate studies. It is perceived both as a terminal degree with substantial intellectual stimulation and as an enabling degree for further studies. It is a course that opens up various avenues and a promising range of opportunities after graduation.

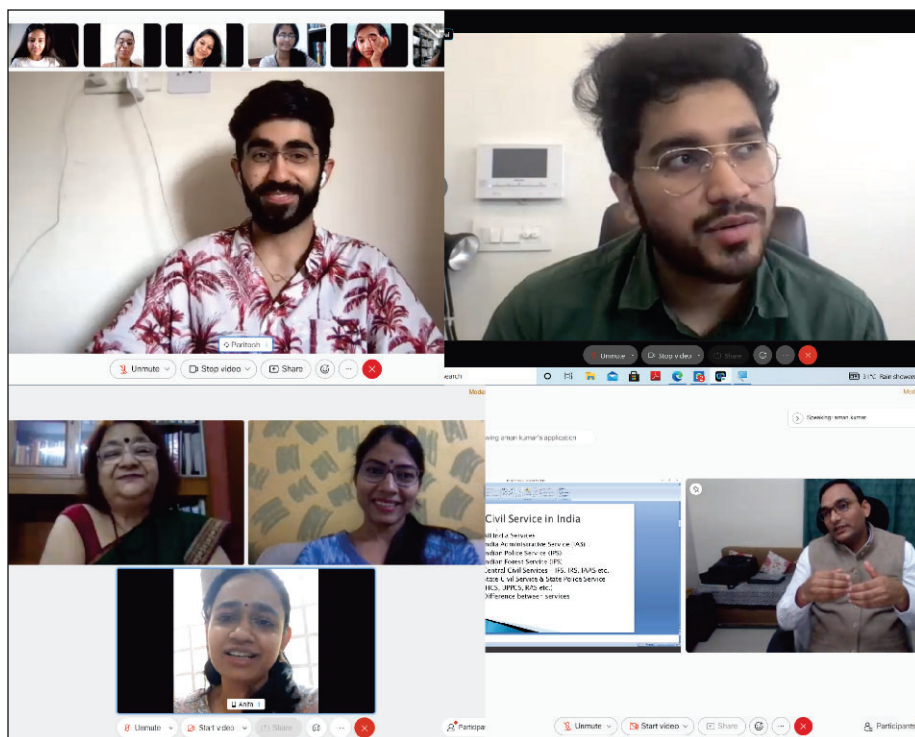
Besides having a rigorous academic structure, the B.A. Programme Association, Navadrishti, organises a plethora of activities throughout the year. The annual festival, Epiphany, is an exciting combination of panel discussions, paper presentations and various competitions. Apart from this, many academic lectures, workshops, events and film screenings are also organized for the students. The Department of B.A. Programme also publishes an annual bilingual student's magazine, VIBGYOR, by inviting contributions from students in the form of creative writing, poems, fiction, non-fiction, etc.

B.Sc. Programme

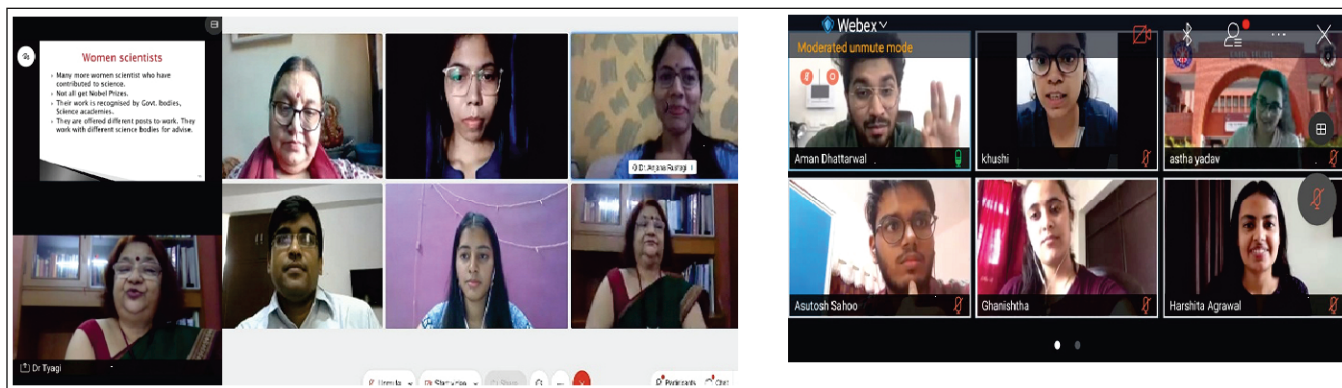
The B.Sc. programme includes B.Sc. Life Sciences and B.Sc. Physical Sciences. The first batch of B.Sc. Physical Science group A was introduced as pre-medical course in 1967 and later on B.Sc. group B (non-medical) was incorporated in 1968 in Gargi College. The curriculum offers multidisciplinary knowledge of science subjects. The interdisciplinary nature of these courses gives students an edge over other courses as students are not just limited to one subject.

They get to learn related subjects and have a wider range of opportunities for higher studies and employment.

B.Sc. Life Sciences is a combination of Botany, Chemistry and Zoology while B.Sc. Physical Sciences includes Chemistry, Physics and Mathematics. Both the courses have been designed to provide a comprehensive account of both conventional and advanced topics from these fields of science. The courses are a great combination of both practical and theoretical knowledge. A degree in B.Sc. Programme provides students a number of options to choose from and to specialise in a subject of their choice at the Master's level.



The B.Sc. Programme students of Gargi College have an association named ZENITH which organises a series of academic and extra-curricular activities throughout the year for the overall development of the students. ZENITH has also started its annual magazine INFINITUS in the session 2018-19. The magazine is the amalgamation of like yet unique minds promoting, sharing and expanding knowledge through team work, peer learning and peer evaluation. Research opportunities are also provided to interested students.



In the annual year 2021-22 several activities were organized by the Department. The session started off with Teacher's Day celebration followed by logo and poster making competition "lite race" in September 2021. Thereafter, we had the Inaugural lecture by Dr. Shashi Tyagi on "women scientists who changed the world". An overwhelming interactive session "Vichar Vimarsh" with renowned YouTuber, Mr. Aman Dhattarwal was organized.

Following this, our alumni Ms. Ishita Sharan Shrivastava interacted with students for a 'Heart to Heart talk' about different post graduate entrance examinations. A three day event Eloquence Arena was organized in October, 2021 which was concluded with thought provoking interaction with Mr. Paritosh Anand, a renowned filmmaker. A fond welcome and virtual orientation was also organized for the aspiring freshers. Later, on in November, Mr. Aman Kumar, Civil service officer, Haryana was invited to share tips with the students pertaining to Public Service Commission and competitive exams.

The year 2022 began with an "illustration making" and "paragraph writing" competition on the occasion of Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose Jayanti. An enriching webinar on "E-waste awareness" was organized in collaboration with E-Junkie and Hulladek Recycling Private limited, on January 29th, 2022.

The Union also designed and distributed t-shirts and sweatshirts with college logo. Both courses have a multitude of research and employment opportunities. Biomedical and genetic engineering, immunology, pathology, biochemistry, nanotechnology can be pursued after L.Sc, while one can pursue astronomy, aviation, information technology and Indian Civil Services after P. Sc. Both the courses provide valuable placements in both public and private sector and are preferred by recruiters.

Certificate Courses

Career-oriented Courses

The College has been conducting a few career intensive Add-on-courses for more than a decade. These are 80-100 hours courses and we invite Guest Faculty from the Industry and Academic Institutions of repute, for these courses.

Biotechcellence : Insights and Innovations

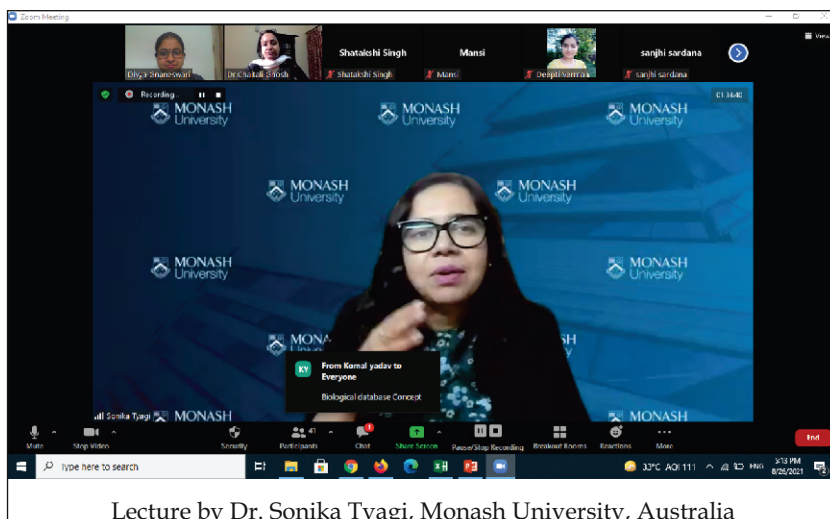

This course was introduced in the year 2017-18 with the aim of providing the undergraduate students an edge by learning basic biotechnological laboratory & bioinformatics procedures beyond the curriculum. The combination of Biotechnology & Bioinformatics has a wide range of industrial applications especially in the crucial field of drug development, targeting and drug-molecule interactions. The course offers high-end bioinformatics tools and applications that have direct applications in the field of day-to-day research. This course, therefore, through rigorous training, prepares the students who are seeking higher academic degrees, research and industrial opportunities. At the end of the course, the students should be able to not only comprehend the basic as well as advanced laboratory research tools and techniques, but also perform them.

Bioinformatics - Tools and Applications

Coordinators: Dr. Chaitali Ghosh & Dr. M. Divya Gnaneswari

The objective of this course was to introduce our biology students to basic computational tools necessary for the genomics research. We selected and included topics from basic and structural bioinformatics to facilitate the students to gain knowledge on the basic principles of bioinformatics. We started with this course through online mode and saw enthusiastic registration from the students. 52 students participated from B.Sc (P) Life sciences and B.Sc (H) Zoology. Speakers from eminent institutes in India and also of different countries were invited to interact with the students. Dr. Hemant Kushwaha (JNU), Dr. Sonika Tyagi (Monash University, Australia), Dr. Girinath Pillai (Chief Scientific Officer, Zastra Innovations), Dr. Mano K. Sharma (JNU), Dr. Jitendra Singh Rathore (GBU), Dr. Shakti Sahi (GBU), Dr. Amit Mitra (Auburn University, USA) and Dr. Vivek Dhar Diwedi (Scientist, Center for Bioinformatics, Computational & Systems Biology, Pathfinder Research and Training Foundation) delivered their talk.



Practical sessions were also conducted simultaneously to inculcate the hands on experience on various tools of bioinformatics, to the students. After every practical session, students were assigned with small exercises which they completed and submitted in Google classroom. We also circulated feedback form after every session to assess the quality and arrangement and the response from students were very much encouraging. This course was able to enhance the knowledge of students in the field of computational biology, and thus will help the students in their future scientific endeavours.

Eco Friendly Agriculture

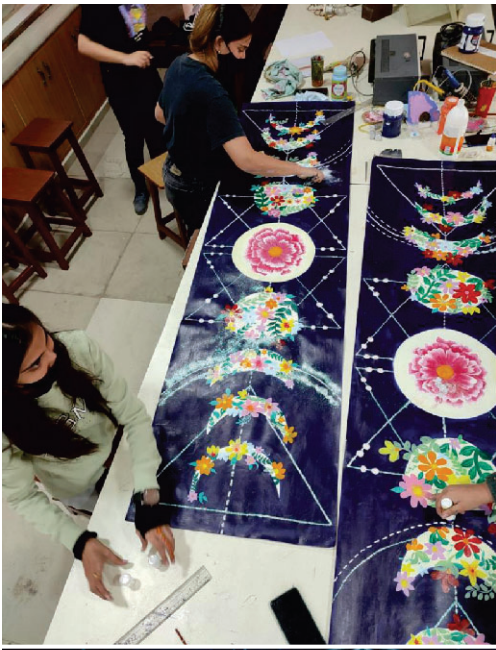

Eco Friendly Agriculture was introduced as Add on Course in the last year (2021). The aim of introducing this course was to impart basic knowledge about agricultural practice in India. Simultaneously, the course made students aware of sustainable agriculture practiced in many parts of the world. Eco friendly agricultural practices are not new to India but we are returning back to our roots and this course is a step in this direction.

Multidisciplinary nature of this course allowed students from other streams like Commerce, Humanities apart from Science participated. Online mode of lectures and practicals were adopted during COVID times. With resumption of normal conditions, offline practical sessions as hands-on workshops on “My waste my responsibility” was conducted. Field visit to Krishi Mela, IARI, PUSA was organized. Students learnt each and every aspect of this course with great zeal and interest. Speakers ranged from IAS officers, Professors to NGO personnel. The speakers were from National as well as International Arena.

Students were assessed on the basis of research projects done on topics related to eco friendly agricultural practices. Reviews as well as research work and were presented. The feedback collected for this course emphasized on its need and importance in the present scenario. The curriculum and mode of delivery of course topics was also appreciated by students. The course generates interest and provided practical knowledge to students in a very lucid manner.





Co-curricular Activities

Teacher Convenor : Ms. Prachi Kalra, Department of Elementary Education

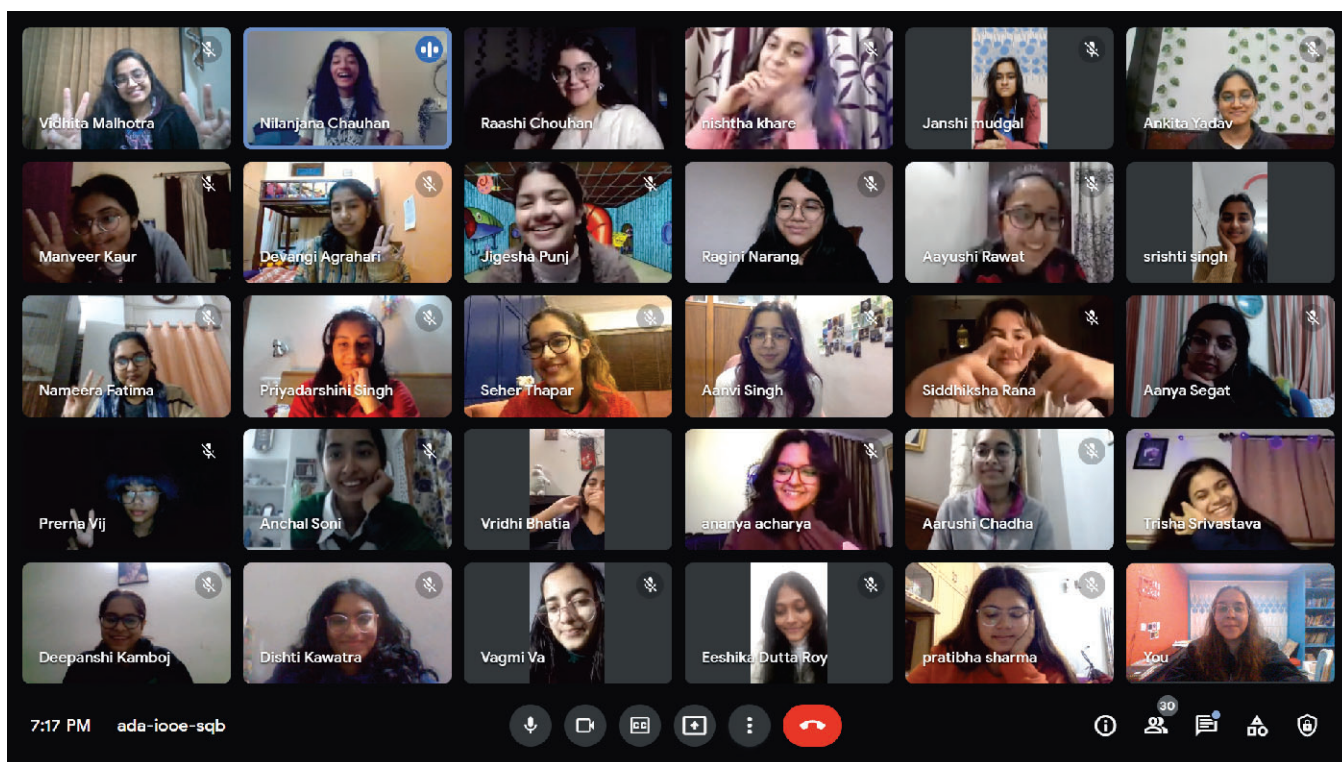

Teacher Convenor : Dr. Alka Garg, Department of Physics

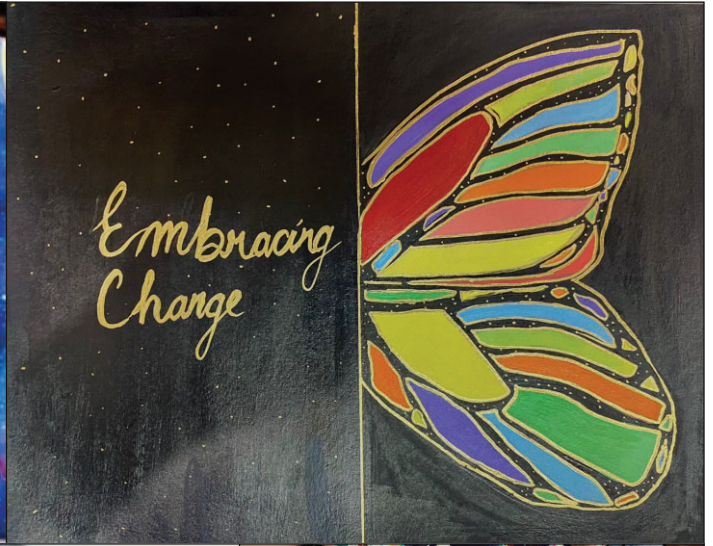

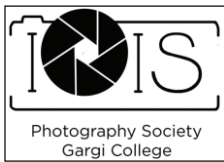

Teacher Convenor : Ms. Prachi Kalra, Department of Elementary Education



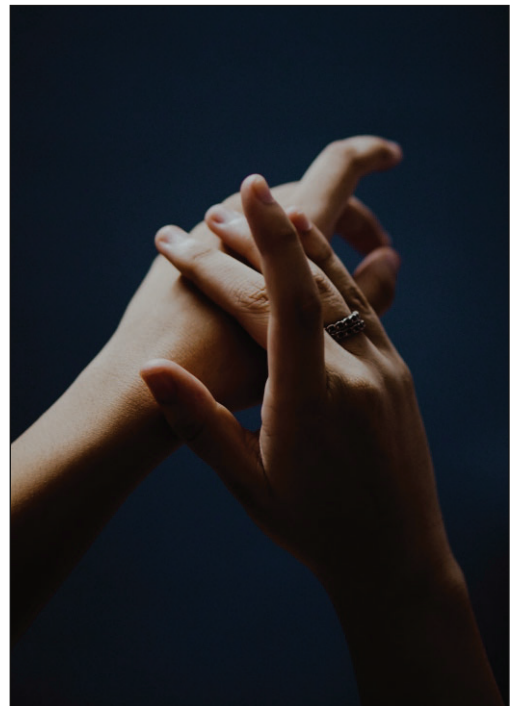

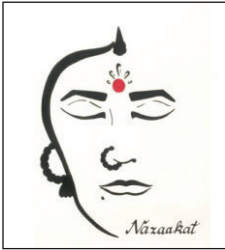

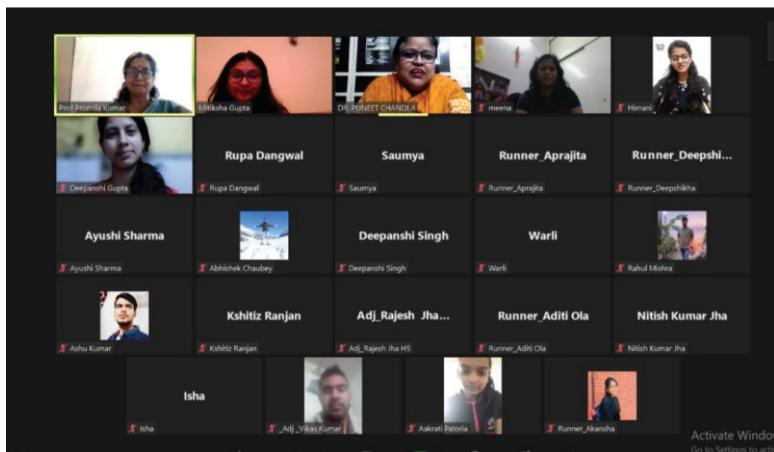

The members actively participate in the various debating competitions and have brought back laurels: bagged runner up position in freshers' PD, broken into multiple



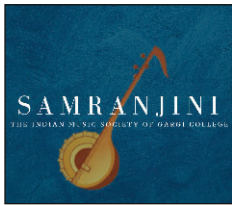
quarter-finals, broken as an adjudicator and won multiple turncoat, extempore, and conventional debating competitions.

However, due to the challenges posed by COVID-19, the society could not function in its traditional manner and thus we had to come up with alternatives.

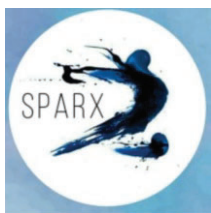

Teacher Convenor: Ms. Rajkumari Smejita Devi, Department of English



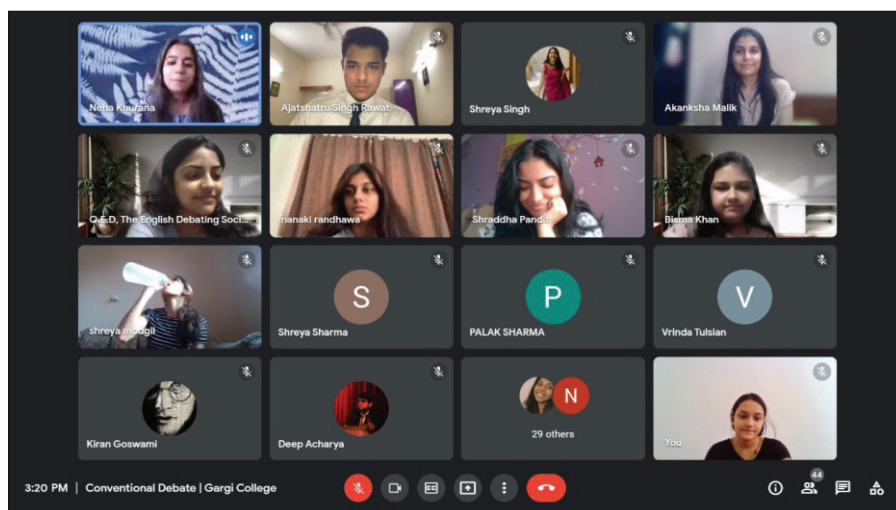

Teacher Convenor: Ms. Aparna Joshi, Department of Elementary Education

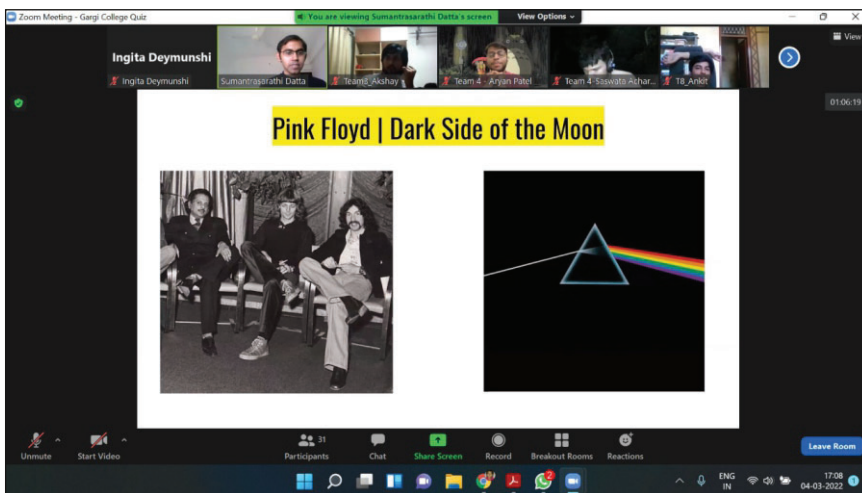

the conduction of quizzes, framing questions, and various techniques of brainstorming.



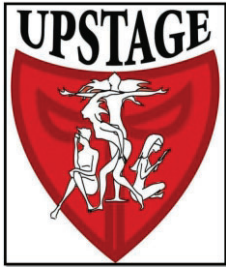

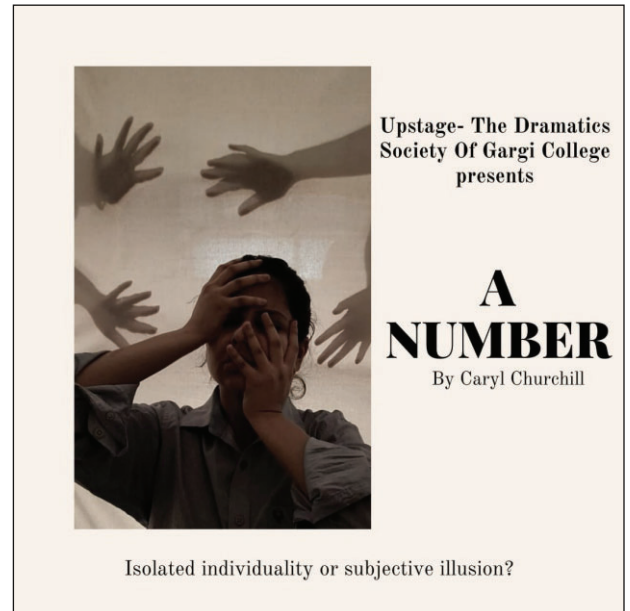
This year, like every other, has been a roller coaster ride for us here, at upstage. Our annual production for the year 2021 was The Fisherman, The

To observe the "Elephant Appreciation Day", members shared their artwork, short stories, posters, slogans and poems through an event entitled as "El'e Expression!" In addition, the "Green Consumer Journal" on the theme "Tackling Plastic Pollution" was initiated. Avni also organized Green Diwali Week from 31.10.2021 to 6.11.2021 on "Green Diwali: Celebrating Diwali in Harmony with the environment" under which various inter-college activities were organised such as poster-making, rangoli-making, speech competitions, and a green Diwali gallery was organised.



This year, intending to sensitize students about the safe disposal of electronic waste (e-waste), Avni has set up an e-waste drop box on the campus on 28.11.2021 as a major initiative. The next major event of Avni organised an online talk by Ms. Jyoti Sharma, President, Forum for Organized Resource Conservation & Enhancement (FORCE) on the topic "Each one a Jal Rakshak with the 5Rs of Water Conservation" on 16.11.2021. Ms. Sharma introduced the 5 R's or Mantras such as Reduce wastage, Reuse water at-least once, Recharge groundwater, Recycle wastewater and Respect water. Citing practical examples from her presentation, she explained each R of the mantra in detail, in the course of her talk. The event got zealous reception from students and teachers and marked the participation of over 100 participants. The session was enlightening and enriching.

Furthermore, we organized a "Plantation drive" in which members actively participated in the plantation campaign. Likewise, members participated in a "Bird-feeding activity" on National Bird Day. To



acknowledge the significance of composting, "Compost o'Clock", 40-day manure creating challenge was conducted.

"Green Footprints", a unique initiative was adopted with the aim to reduce carbon footprint which encouraged simply delete junk emails. We were able to junkyard a total of 28,430+ emails, demonstrating how even the tiniest of efforts can make a difference.

Alongside these initiatives, Avni constantly used its social media handles to promote public awareness such as the "Consumer Awareness Campaign" which included regularly posting and informing people about sustainable alternatives to daily use commodities.

All our initiatives were made successful by the members of the club and enthusiastic participation from all motivated everyone to take individual steps to inspire a collective change.

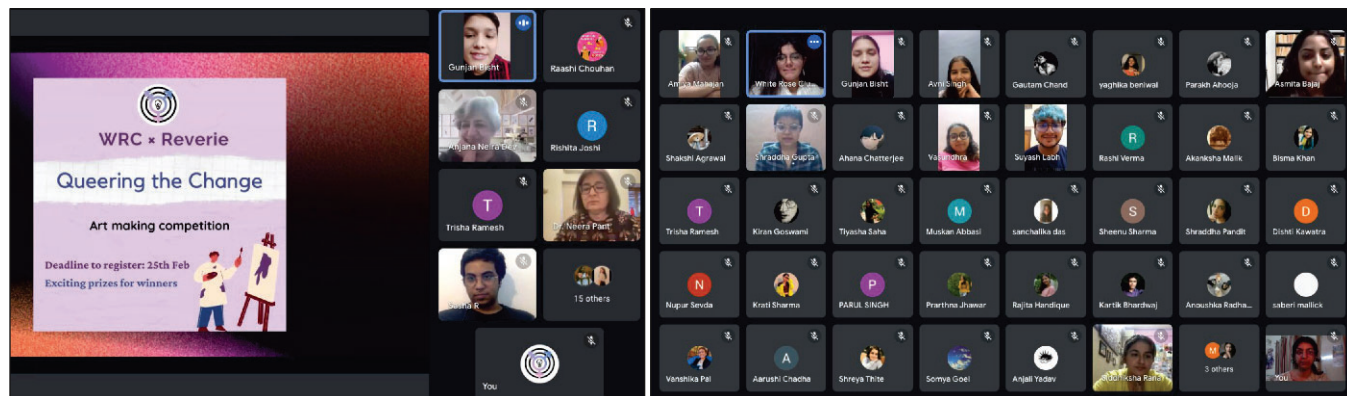

White Rose Club

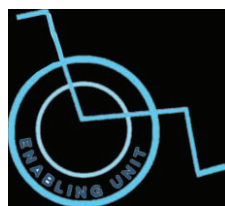
The White Rose Club is a queer-straight alliance which functions under the Centre for Diversity and Inclusion with Dr Neera Pant of the Applied Psychology Department as the teacher-in-charge. WRC has been actively working since 2017 but got a formal recognition in June 2020. The Club aims to educate, raise awareness and sensitize people regarding LGBT*QIA+ issues, to make Gargi College a safe and inclusive space for Queer students. The club has organized multiple events over the years namely Anokhi Charcha,

Pride Parades, Documentary Screenings and academic discussions. Panel discussions by professionals and academics revolving around topics like compulsory heterosexuality, challenges faced by transmen and so on have been held via online platforms. In addition to this, Anokhi charchas which are informal, democratic discussions have been organized from time to time and are aimed towards understanding the concerns of the community. To commemorate the pride month last year, the club hosted a Zine Making Workshop with Illustrator Sukh Mehak Kaur on the topic of "Our Days during Pride and Pandemic Times". In collaboration with multiple Queer Collectives across DU, the club also hosted a two day event: Queernama- A Virtual Pride Gathering. For Reverie, the annual college fest, WRC conducted an art making competition called 'Queering the Change'. The club also invited a queer-affirmative psychologist Srishti Banerjee to hold a discussion on 'Embracing Changes and Overcoming Adversities.' WRC also organised a movie screening of 'Five Films For Freedom' which was held in collaboration with the Queer Muslim Project, British council and other DU queer collectives at the British Council Auditorium on 26th March, 2022. The club's motto is 'Unlearning Phobia Through Awareness' because we believe learning cannot happen without constantly unlearning our deep rooted and internalized phobias and biases.



Enabling Unit

The Enabling Unit of Gargi College works towards providing an inclusive, equitable and just environment for persons with disability in college. It is also the mandate of the unit to organise lectures/ seminars/ panel discussions to sensitize the wider college population to the philosophy of inclusiveness, the issues that persons with disability face in terms of inequitable environment and ways of

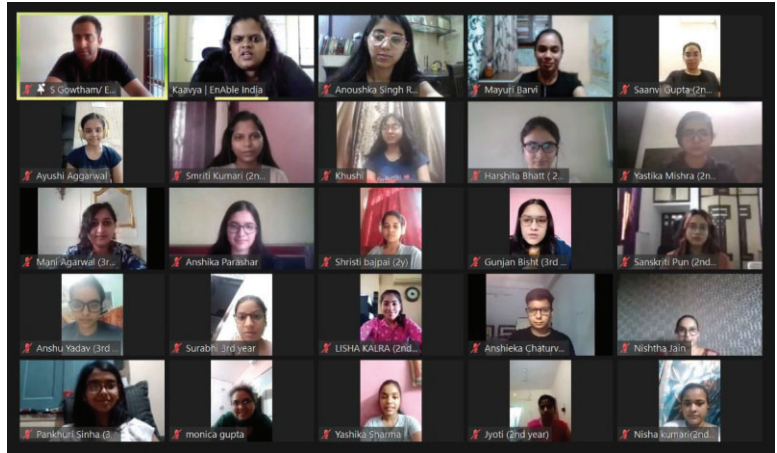
facilitating change in attitudes towards persons with disability. Over the years, we have organised programmes specifically for the persons with disability like one-to-one mentoring of students with disabilities through buddy program, arranging scribes for them, coordinating special



schemes, special meetings with the college principal where they share their own special issues/ problems that they face in day-to-day functioning, etc.

A Lec-dem workshop on assistive devices for the differently abled persons and the provisions of the RPWD Act has also been organized. We have organised enabling unit fests that in the very structuring of the student activities have challenged the philosophy of ableism and meritocracy that creates structural competition in society.

The student activities like poemages, reflective writings, weaving tales, painting, cartoons have been organised in a collaborative format that affirms the creativity and vision of each students rather than privileging some over the others. We have found that this reflective sharing is very successful even without external motivation of big prize money and encouraged intrinsic motivation. We have organised film screenings, panel discussions, lectures on issues related to disability, like sexuality, gender, art-for disability and challenging ableism which have helped students discuss and celebrate diversity in atmosphere of openness and mutual listening.



Equal Opportunity Cell

The equal opportunity cell of the college, set up in 2010, is a multidisciplinary group which undertakes many activities with the objective of sensitizing the students regarding the challenges faced by the disadvantaged groups of the society. - The fest comprises of inter-college competitions like poster making, singing, dance, creative writing and rangoli making.
- The physically challenged students of the college participate actively in the cultural and sports events organised by the University.
- Mentoring the students admitted under PH category.

Activities during 2021 - 2022

EOC organised a talk on 'Equal Opportunity Vs Equal Outcome: The Theory and Practice of Affirmative Action', by an eminent Political Scientist, Prof Ashok Acharya, Deptt of Political Science, University of Delhi, on 28th March, 2022.

The talk was very enriching and informative. It was followed by question and answer session. The talk was attended by more than 150 people.

The Cell also organised an Intra College Poster Making Competition on the theme "Unequals cannot be treated as Equals: Affirmative Action in India" on 4th April, 2022. The event saw enthusiastic participation from the students.

It became one of the Top 8 teams to receive Walmart's mentorship. It won the Best Collaborative Entry Award for Project Vikas, obtaining an initial seed-funding of INR 5,000 under the Ideas for Impact Contest. For the first time, Enactus Gargi bagged the KPMG Business Ethics Grant 2020 of INR 50,000 to provide infrastructural and visual media aid



(installation of LED TV for sign language training and skill development) to specially-abled beneficiaries of Project Rachna.

The society commenced the session 2021-22 on a high note with recognition from the Hindustan Times, as the leading daily published an article lauding its' efforts in managing post-consumer textile waste whilst generating employment for women with hearing impairment. As a part of its Virtual mental therapy initiative, it also conducted a workshop on 'How to deal with stress and anxiety during exams' with Psychotherapist Ms. Shreya Jain to aid aspirants grappling with uncertainty.

Gandhi Study Circle

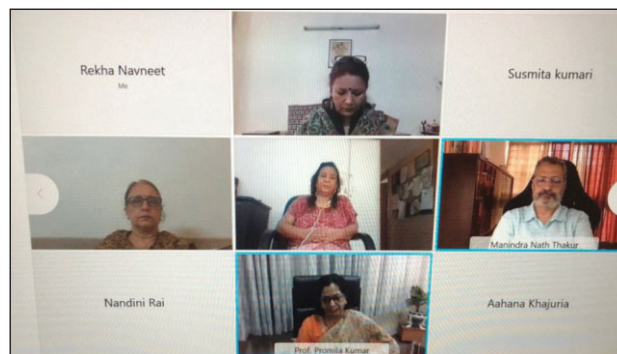
Teacher Convenor: Dr. Sweta Mishra, Department of Political Science

Purpose of GSC

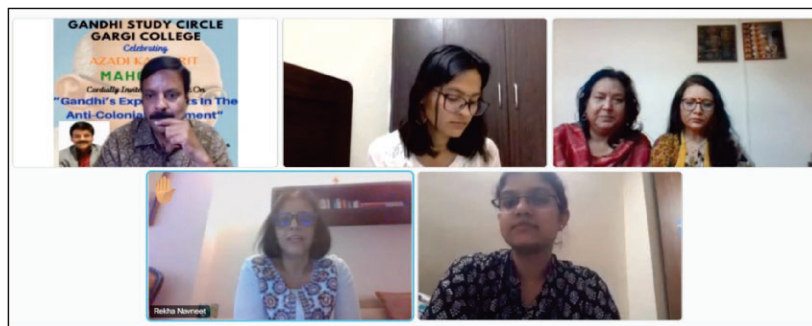
- To inculcate Gandhian values and ideals among them

Every year, the team hosts two events Alohomora and Ebullience, with a predefined theme, and for this year our theme was "the marketing trinity: creativity, competition and consumers".

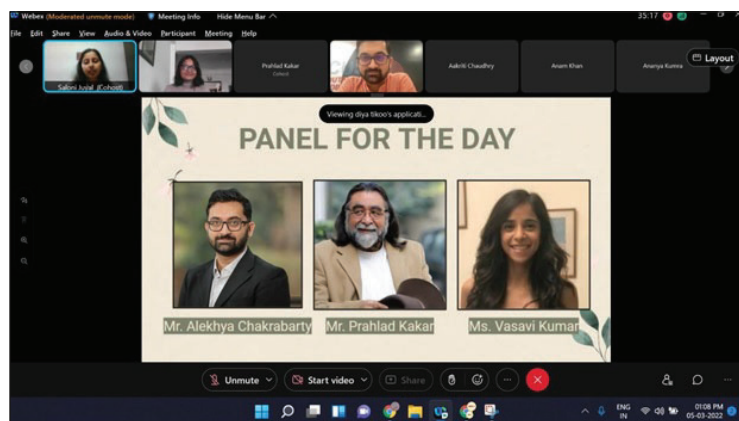

More than 180+ activities were conducted including various donation drives, group discussions, movie screenings, various competitions, pledges, commemoration of NSS Day, the Annual Fest Zistatva, NGO Mela, Constitution Day, Republic Day, Independence Day, International Day of Yoga, Voters Day, plantation and cleanliness drives and Pride Month.

Flagship NSS Events like Inaayat- Sadbhavna Diwas and Offline Blood Donation camp - "SAMARPAN" were held. NSS Day 2021 - "Umang" was also successfully conducted with an enlightening panel discussion and project presentation competition- Udaan. NSS Gargi also collaborated with the Delhi Government to connect its volunteers to the "Desh Ke Mentors Program". An offline Thalassaemia screening camp was also conducted in the college premises. Various online campaigns were planned to sensitise the masses on various social issues through unique initiatives by the NSS volunteers.

The Annual Cultural Fest of NSS Gargi - "Zistatva" was successfully conducted virtually where an E-NGO Mela took place; where 14 social entrepreneurial entities were helped to digitally market their products through NSS Gargi's website. The cultural programmes by the student volunteers induced an essence of the rich glory and vivid traditional heritage of the country with various competitions like Talent hunt, Quizzes, Motivational talks, Comedy night, Open Mic, Workshops etc.

NSS Gargi organised sustainability leadership in collaboration with UPGSL to further understanding on SDGs. A 2 day environment campaign was run from 5-6th June to usher environmental awareness. Interviews were conducted through volunteers on World Day against Child Labour. NSS Gargi also joined hands with the Rakshin Project to bring an awareness webinar on Child Abuse. Activities during Pride Month were organized which culminated into a progressive session "Hues of Pride".

Many activities were also conducted keeping fitness and environment; a week-long campaign on environment awareness titled "KUDRAT" propagated green sensitisation through various activities. UNMUKTI - The Women's Development Centre

Gargi is a college named after an extremely courageous and accomplished woman, unafraid to ask troubling questions. Unmukti, the Women's Development Centre (WDC), is a space that strives to give contemporary young women a chance to honour their potential to grow up free, fearless and dignified. Our college's WDC is a vibrant forum for the undergraduate student to think about, talk about and act upon gender and sexuality based inequality and violence, which remain a stubborn and disturbing fact of our everyday lives. The services provided by the WDC are available to all members of the Gargi student community, but students are also welcome to take up

membership in the core team and participate in 60 hours of activities, spanning workshops, seminars, talks, debates and discussions, and field trips. All our activities engage with the gendered nature of a range of issues, be they legal, economic, social or cultural.

Our focus is to provide academic opportunities and skills-development along a variety of planes. We empower students to learn how to tackle everyday physical harassment, for example, through the Self-Defence training we provide in collaboration with other organisations including the Delhi Police. We conduct intensive skill-building workshops on subjects like child abuse, surviving gender-based violence and abuse, police procedure, legal redress so that students become more resourceful when faced with these challenges.

Our Outstation Students Cell offers support to students who come from outside Delhi - a major chunk of the corporate body of the college - including guidebooks on the city of Delhi, resources on paying guest accommodation/hostels, healthcare facilities and the like. In addition, we also run a sanitary napkin vending service on a cost-to-cost basis, as well as a day-care facility for the children of any member of the college needing such services.

The Centre organises, besides its annual festival, add-on/certificate courses and workshops/trainings and internships which provide academic opportunities beyond coursework. Our action-based research projects, such as our Safety Audit of the immediate zones of/around college, lead to publishable writing for student participants besides helping to change things in the worlds they move through for the better. We also encourage students to take up summer and winter internships in collaboration with NGOs to enable students to gain co-curricular skills that stand them in good stead in future personal and

professional ventures including higher education in gender-core programmes. Unmukti invites students to join to make the most of their opportunity to make change, be it ever so small, in an unequally gendered world.

All our student work is conducted through a diverse and heterogeneous team of "Gender Champions," elected office bearers from each department, who organise and conceptualise specific activities for sensitisation and mainstreaming of gender-based equality under the supervision and mentorship of the teachers' committee. This is a prestigious and important position available to students and we hope many of you prospective students will consider taking it up. We look forward to another lively and inspiring year of Unmukti!

Teacher Convenor: Prof. Jyoti Raina Anand, Department of Elementary Education

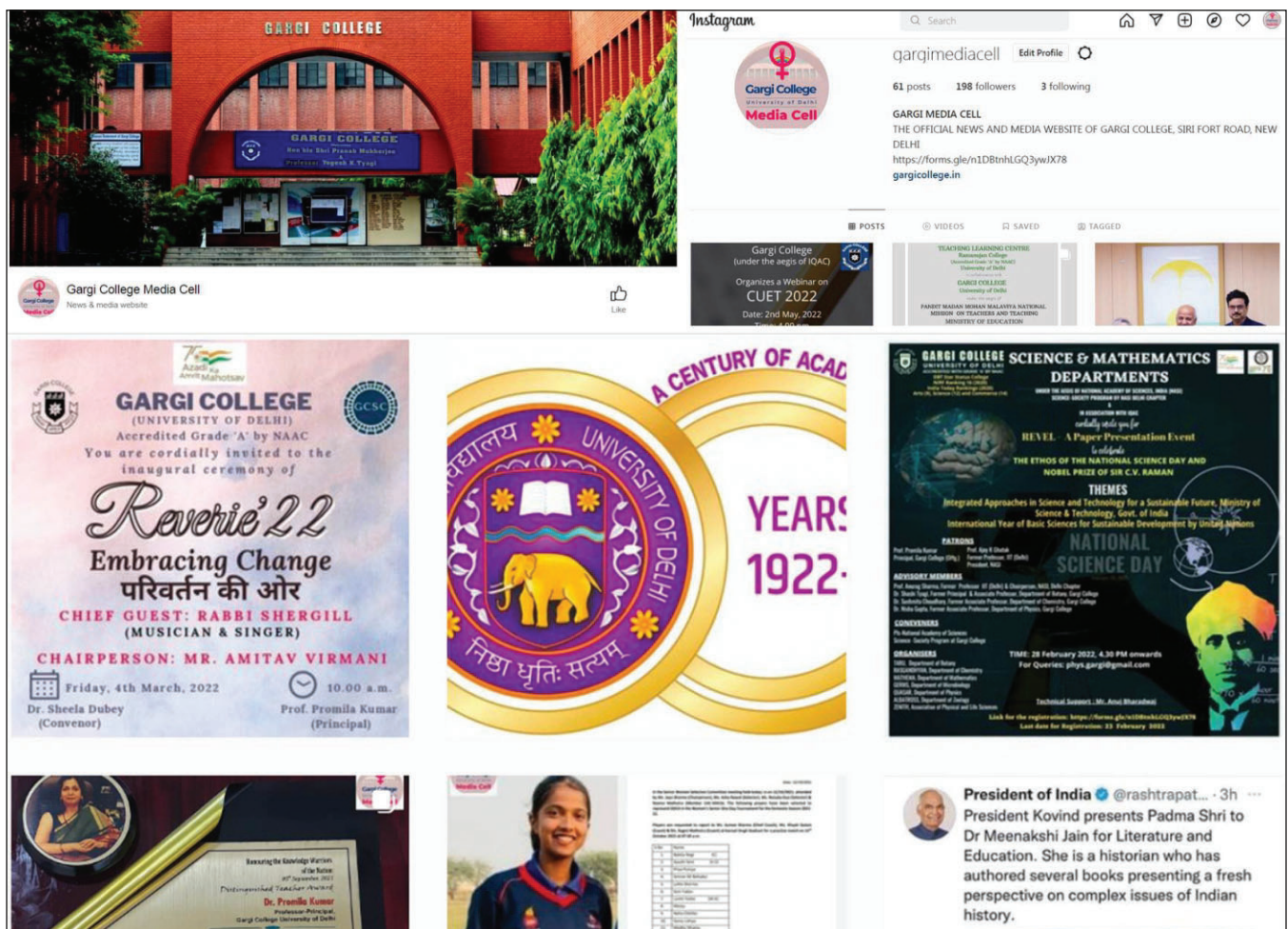

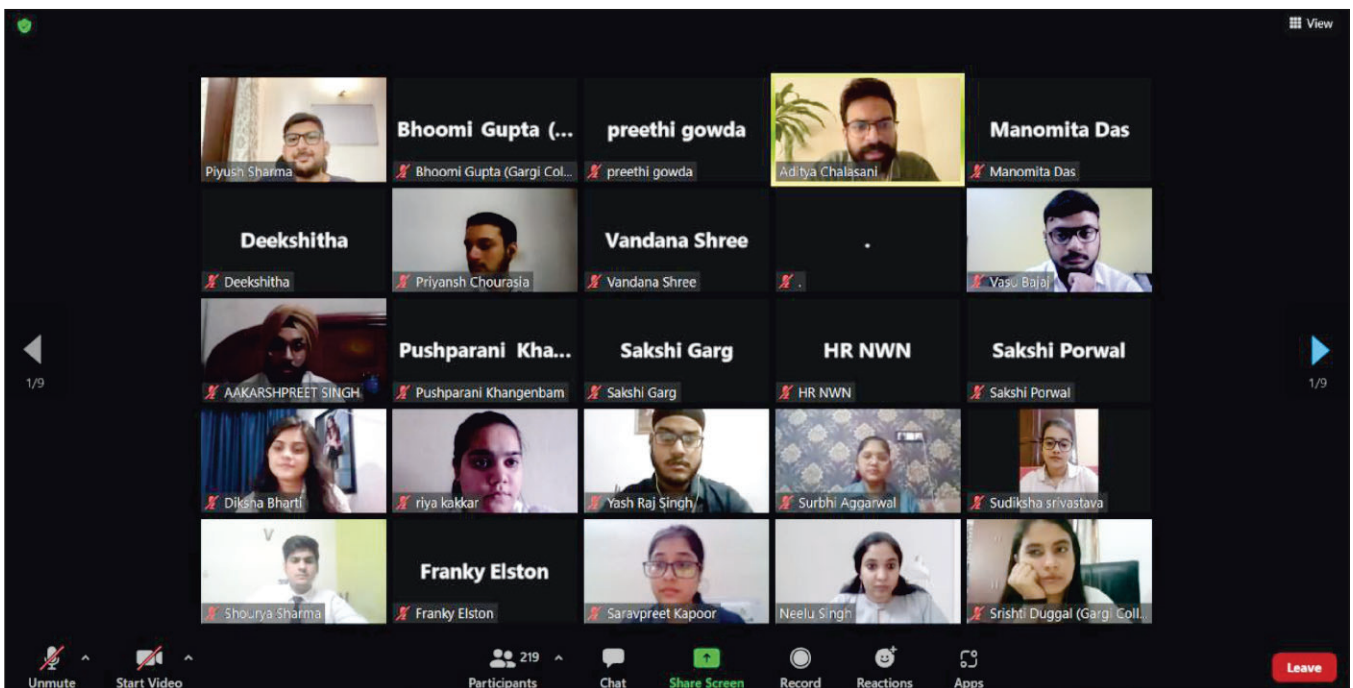
Placement Cell

The Placement Cell of Gargi College aims at making the students industry-ready with practical applications along with academic knowledge. It attempts to do this through providing opportunities for internship to gain hands-on knowledge and through getting exposed to patterns of work in industry; to gain an insight into the expectations of industry. A total of 157 companies such as Deloitte USI, KPMG, EY GDS, D.E. Shaw, Accenture, Price Waterhouse Coopers UK, BD India, Protiviti India hired in 2020-21. The highest package has been 21.25 LPA offered by D.E Shaw Group, a global investment and technology development firm followed by Nation with Namu and BD India. 361 organisations provided internship opportunities to the students.



Some of them were Zomato Feeding India, Lido Learning, Hindustan Times, Bajaj Capital, Nation with Namu, and eigo Paathshala. Articleship opportunities were also offered to the final year and alumni batches from companies like SP Chopra & Co., Mahesh Bansal & Co. From providing opportunities to



pursuing courses through Coursera, attending workshops to organising the First Internship Fair virtually, learning hasn't stopped for the students of Gargi College in this pandemic.

Workshops on Civil Services by Mr. V Nanda Kumar (IRS Officer), 3 in 1 MS Office by Mukesh Poddar (Microsoft Office Specialist) and Webinars on Career in Finance, Case solving, guesstimates and frameworks are conducted round the year to upskill the students. Our students have continuously striven to bring laurels to the college by being one of the top 5 teams in the Graduate School Maverick Program by Deloitte, making it to the top 20 in EY GDS's Young Tax Professional of the Year. We groom the students by providing them training to crack personal interviews, group discussions and enhance their knowledge with the help of various initiatives. Race to Ace, our first initiative, was aimed at guiding the students to make the best use of their college years productively. Mind Scribble 2.0, the second version of our WhatsApp initiative was planned to enhance the knowledge set of students.

We provide a platform for our team members to work in a group by developing Standard Operating Procedures, setting targets and analysing them. A member of placement cell not only gains exposure and insights into the working of corporate world but also learns how to do quality research, sequence out logical thought processes and give out quality deliverables. Infrastructure and Facilities



Auditorium

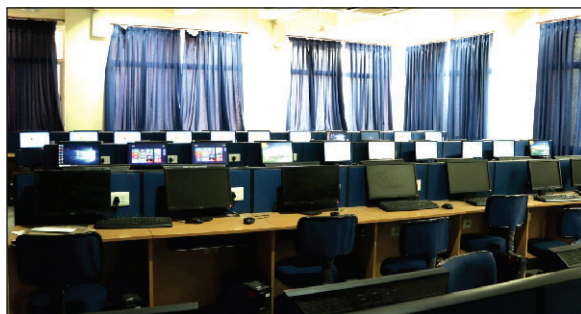
The college boasts of having its own state-of-the-art auditorium: the meridian of architectural finesse, with a seating capacity of 750 spread over the main floor and the mezzanine. The airy, spacious portico endowed with natural daylight and furnished with tables and chairs serves as a quiet place for conducting tutorial classes. The auditorium block is fully air-conditioned and equipped with solar lighting installations.

Bioinformatics Infrastructure Facility

Gargi College is one of the two colleges and the only Women's college in University of Delhi to have BIF (funded by DBT with a yearly grant for maintenance and allied expenses). Undergraduate students from any discipline of Science can implement bioinformatics projects with guidance from faculty.

Bookshop

A well-stocked bookshop offering attractive discounts is stocked with the curriculum books for various courses as well as with stationery products. It is located on the passageway to the library.



Computer Laboratories

Computers have become an indispensably essential part of the undergraduate college curricula with the introduction of a variety of revised and restructured courses. The three computer laboratories in the college consisting of 110 computers with Wi-Fi connectivity provide students with an opportunity for hands-on training and enhancing their computing skills. The laboratories are also available for

career-intensive education after regular class hours.

Food Court

The Food Court, the students' favourite hangout, is where the action is. With lots of yummy food offered at reasonable prices, this is a place where students from all streams meet, interact and confabulate over steaming cups of tea/coffee. Cold drinks, fruit juice, spicy chaat, crispy spring-rolls, delicious idli, vada, dosa, mouth-watering pastries, cakes, burgers, patties, samosas and bread pakoras are among the



various food items on offer. A water harvesting system has been installed in the canteen area. The canteen has been renovated and extended with the construction of an additional food outlet: Happiness Corner!!! A Nescafé kiosk is also posited in the precincts of the cafeteria.

Laboratories - Science/Elementary Education/Psychology

The Botany, Chemistry, Elementary Education, Microbiology, Physics, Psychology and Zoology laboratories are not only spacious and well-ventilated but also very well-equipped with the latest equipment and other academic resources. Working in any of these laboratories is a pleasurable experience. There are separate research laboratories for Botany and Physics Departments where research is being conducted by the faculty members.

Learning Resource Centre

WEBOPAC and facility of UGC INFLIBNET and access to DU Library Catalogue continued during the year. Gargi College Library website <http://www.gargicolglibrary.webs.com> and online use of e-resources increased during the year for easy understanding and online access to Library resources and facilities. 617 books were added till March, 2018 making total of 74027 accessioned



books in all. At present the library has an asset of 217 CDs and subscribes to 51 periodicals and 10 newspapers. Electronic Resource Management package for e-resources: User control provided by NLIST. The library subscribes to a large number of Electronics Resources through UGC-Infosnet which includes e-resources (6,000+ e Journals and 31, 35,000+ e-books) and University of Delhi connectivity which includes Delhi University Library System. It includes the Reference Sources, Bibliographic Sources, Statistical Sources, and Full Text Sources. A brief description of these under given resources including the Subject Coverage, Search Features, Database Services, Document Category, etc. are available through more information for the help of users. Medical Room

The Medical facility is available to students during college hours. There is a medical room with a trained nurse for providing basic first aid to the students. Besides, students can also get their health check-up done. Regular medical and dental check-ups are conducted in the college by qualified medical professionals.



Open Air Theatre

A new open-air stage has been recently constructed behind the office block with sufficient seating provision for the audience in the form of adjoining steps and a lush green lawn at its centre. This would serve as an open-air platform for students for various events and especially for Street Plays and other such open air events.

Seminar Hall

Adjoining the auditorium is a splendiferous seminar hall with a seating capacity of 125. It is equipped with latest audio-visual equipment and is utilised for hosting various academic events.



Students' Common Room: 'Retreat'

Located near the cafeteria, the students' common room, 'Retreat' is a place where students can unwind, chitchat with friends and interact with seniors. It helps them learn about the college life and get familiar with their campus, which is their second home for three years. Students' very own space in college. Retreat always has its doors open for all students.



Students' Union Room

The Students' Council of Gargi College is a step towards instilling the values of democracy among students. The General Body elects a new council each year which is of the students, for the students, by the students. The Students' Union Room is the 'Head Quarters' from where the decisions made by the collective students' body are executed - from weekly cultural events to departmental festivals and the gala college festival: Reverie. The Students' Union Room is not just a space for a selected few; rather it is an open platform for all students to express their views and ideas.



Research Projects for Students

The Gargi Pathfinder Award

The Gargi Pathfinder Award, in the streams: Science, Commerce and Humanities, has been instituted, to encourage research and innovation among our students. Contestants have to submit an original project guided and certified by a faculty supervisor and supplemented with an audio - visual presentation to a panel of external judges, followed by a viva-voce. This Award is to promote originality and encourage the innovative spirit amongst undergraduate students. The students of the three streams put forward their ideas and after stringent selection are encouraged to research on their topics. The award comes with a cash-cum-certificate award, one each in Humanities, Commerce and Sciences. As individuals or in teams, contestants can present original research on significant issue, innovative business proposals or new scientific experiments. Details are continuously updated on the college website.

Bioinformatics Infrastructure Facility (BIF)

Gargi College is one of the two colleges and the only Women's college in the University of Delhi to have BIF. It is funded by Department of Biotechnology, Govt. of India since 2008, with an annual grant for maintenance, manpower, training and other allied expenses. This facility enables undergraduate students from all science courses to do bioinformatics projects beyond their curriculum. These projects often lead to presentation of research work in national and international conferences which is rewarding and very motivating for the students. Implementation of interdisciplinary as well as multidisciplinary projects is especially encouraged. Under the BIF programme, workshops are conducted for students as well as faculty members to keep them updated about the advances made in this field. Besides undergraduate students, the facility also has post graduate students, trainees and Research Associates who contribute towards research publications. Gargi College BIF was adjudged amongst the top five BIFs of undergraduate colleges, based on research publications.

Awards of Excellence

Gargi College provides innumerable opportunities to students to excel both in academic as well as co-curricular activities. It is our constant endeavour to help students acquire various skills, confidence, and the experience that will be beneficial as they embark upon their varied careers after graduating from this college. On Annual Day each year, we acknowledge the achievements of students through prizes and scholarships.

The following are the prestigious awards and scholarships that students compete and aspire for:

The Best All Rounder Awards

The most prestigious awards, the Best All Rounder Awards, are conferred in each of the three streams namely, Dr. Chhaya Biswas Best All Rounder Award for Science; Dr. Meera Ramachandran Best All Rounder Award for Humanities; and Smt. Lajwanti Malik Memorial Best All Rounder Award for Commerce. These are highly coveted awards for the students that display academic excellence, aptitude for research, active participation in sports/extra-curricular activities, contribute significantly to college life as a whole. All final year students of the college are eligible to apply for this award through their respective departments. There is screening at various levels to select the most deserving candidates. The final decision is taken by a duly constituted committee for the same.

The Long Strider Award

Dr. Hema V. Raghavan Long Strider Award is given to illustrious alumnae of this college who have displayed commendable excellence in their respective fields within ten years following their graduation from Gargi College. The award recognizes the meaningful social commitment and potential for invigorating research that the candidate has achieved in this period, along with academic/research excellence.

The Gargi Pathfinder Award

The Gargi Pathfinder Award, instituted by the college, incentivizes original research carried out by students under the mentorship of faculty members of the college. As individuals or in teams, contestants present original research projects that then go through an intensive screening process with the involvement of external judges. The students carry out research on significant social issues, innovative business proposals, or new scientific experiments. These are supplemented with presentations in other media, such as Power Point, film, or artistic production before a panel of judges. This is followed by viva voce and the declaration of results. This award is given in each of the three streams namely, Humanities, Commerce and Science. This award is open to all under-graduate students of the college.

Awards for Academics

Students who secure the highest aggregate in each class are given certificates and prizes for their academic excellence. There are several disciplines where academic cash awards and scholarships for meritorious students have been instituted by illustrious donors. In other cases, they receive Gargi College Award for Excellence and a cash award.

Awards for Excellence in Sports, NSS and NCC
